Gatchel Resigns Circuit Clerk Job; Mrs. Walker Be Reinstated As County Tax Assessor

While Seminole County awaited word on the possibility that Gov. LeRoy Collins might reinstate Mrs. Mary Earle Walker as tax assessor to fill that vacancy, David Gatchel resigned as Clerk of the Circuit Court.

Gatchel sent a letter to Collins resigning effective May 15 and asking that Arthur Beckwith Jr., winner of the clerk's job in the primary election, be appointed

Five minutes after Gatchel Informed the County Commission he was resigning, the board authorized attorney Mack Cleveland Jr. to call on the governor's

Until he does, an aide said, McCanna is the tax assessor and must continue to serve. McCanna, who left the keys to the office at the
