# Bank Robber Hijacks Jet, 15 Aboard

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI) - A suspected Georgia bank robber today forced his way through a security checkpoint at a Nebraska airport and hijacked a Frontier Airlines jetliner in what officials said was a plot to free another accused

bank robber. The jetliner, with 35 persons on board. was taken over at 6:30 a.m. at Grand Island, Neb., flown to Kansas City, Mo., for refueling and then took off for Atlanta

at 9:30 a.m. The jetliner with 11 passengers remaining on board landed at 12:05 p.m. today at Hartsfield International in

"Man in the cockpit," the pilot of the Frontier Airlines 737 radioed to the tower at Grand Island. "Going to Kansas City International for fuel." Grand Island police and federal authorities identified the hijacker as Thomas Michael Hannan, 29, of Grand

Island. They said he demanded the release of George David Stewart, 29. Hannan and Stewart were arrested for the Sept. 2 holdup of the Northside Parkway branch of Fulton National Bank in the Atlanta area. Stewart was being held as a federal prisoner in the Fulton County Jail,

while Hannon was free on bond. The FBI said Hannon, in addition to Stewart's release, also demanded \$ million, two parachutes, two machine guns and two .45 caliber pistols.

The Federal Aviation Administration said 19 of the 30 passengers, including one heart patient, were allowed to leave the plane at Kansas City, leaving 11 passengers and a crew of four aboard the jetliner for the 800 mile, two hour and 50 minute flight to Atlanta.

Authorities in Atlanta were ready for the jet, but there was no indication whether any of the demands would be met when the

Fulton County (Atlanta) Sheriff Leroy Stynchcombe said Stewart had been moved to an "undisclosed location." The sheriff said it would be up to federal authorities whether to release Stewart to meet Hannan's demand.

Authorities origionally thought two persons were involved in the hijacking. because of the apparent coincidence of the

presence of a former high school friend of Hannan's, Lyle Wurtz, aboard the plane. Bill William, FBI special agent in Kansas City, said Wurtz helped with the negotiations with Hannan.

### School Board Passes 'Test'

The Seminole County school board Wednesday had an op-portunity to learn first-hand about the tests being given Florida

high school students throughout the state.

In a presentation made by J. Ivan Bowers, program director, pupil personnel, the board received three separate tests, containing a total of 56 questions. The questions were not taken from either the Functional Literacy Test or the statewide assessment test, Bowers said, but they were representative of the kind of question which might be asked on either examination.

The board also heard a report from school district employes or

the county's testing program.

The tests given to the board were divided into three sections: minimum skills test for grade 11; basic skills survey in reading. for grades eight and 'll; and basic skills survey in writing.

The tests were administered during a work session prior to the regularly scheduled Wednesday school board meeting, and all five board members greeted Bowers with laughter as he passes the test to them, then settled quietly down to work.

As each finished one section of the test, Bowers handed another

one over. The entire testing process took about 30 minutes.

At the end of the testing period Dan Dagg, assistant superintendent of instruction, read the test answers aloud and board members checked their own tests. All five passed. Dagg explained that, on the assessment and Functional

Literacy tests, a score of 70 per cent on each skill section of the test is required for students to pass. Some of the questions answered by the board included Determine the number of square meters in a plot of land six numeters by 13 jekameters. (A). .78 square meters; (B) 7.8

are meters; (C) 780 square meters; (D) 7,000 square meters Which is the better buy? (A) seven ounces for 28 cents; (B)

#### Testimony Links Korea

#### To Influence-Buying

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The first formal estimony and evidence presented to the House ethics committee links Korea's diplomats, its CIA agents and its president, Park Chung Hee, to influence-buying efforts on Capitol Hill. But the naming of erring congressmen may be months away.

Kim Sang Keun, a former Korean CIA agent, testified Wednesday that his boss in oul sent him letters in 1974 with word that "the chief priest" - the South Korean president - knew of the clandestine activities and "expressed his satisfaction." Kim was called back today for more testimony.

But special counsel Leon Jaworski said it was too soon to name any congressmen who may have taken the favors in violation of the Constitution, federal law or ethical standards. He said that will come in the second stage of the probe.

#### GM Recalls 133,000 Cadillacs

DETROIT (UPI) — General Motors is recalling 133,000 Cadillacs built since 1975 to correct fuel hose leaks which have caused at least 100 engine fires in which seven persons have been slightly injured. But Cadillac insists the "danger is minimal."

Included in the recall, announced Wed-

nesday, was every Cadillac Seville ever sold -a total of 111,000 - and 22,000 Coupe DeVille and Eldorado models with electronic fuel injection systems.

The fuel leak is caused by a deterioration in the fuel hose connections between the gas tank and engine fuel rail, and Cadillac blamed the problem on "an unusual chemical reaction which apparently occurs in selected geographical areas," primarily Miami, New Orleans and Tacoma, Wash.

#### College Worth The Cost

NEW YORK (AP) — The fringe benefits of a college education range from athletic competition to a happier, more creative family life, says a new study, undertaken in part to mericans are overeducated. The study was lirected by economist Howard Bowen and nanced by the Sloan Foundation and the Carnegie Council on Policy Studies in higher education. The study contends that the \$85 billion a year spent on higher education returns about three times that amount in intellectually and socially broadened

#### But, Can It Take Off Quietly?

NEW YORK (UPI) — Now that the Concorde SST has finally got a chance to land — relatively quietly — at New York's Kennedy Airport, can it take off just as quietly?

The faster-than-sound jetliner — without passengers — touched down at the airport shortly after 11 a.m. EDT Wednesday, its noise level no higher than 101 perceived noise decibels, comfortably within the airport's poise limit of 112 p.p.d.

### The Fight Is Only Beginning' Aided

MULHOUSE, France (UPI) — A gang of kidnapers says it executed West German industrialist Hanns-Martin Schleyer - with one bullet to the head - to avenge the "massacre" of six leftist terrorists in Stuttgart and Somalia.

A police officer who saw the body said it had traces of blood around the neck and there were welts on the neck and ears, apparently caused by a tight gag.

"After 43 days, we have put an end to the miserable and corrupt existence of Hanns-Martin Schleyer," said the communique from the "Siegfriend Haussner Commando" of the anarchist Red Army, which abducted Schleyer Sept. 5 in Cologne in an ambush that killed his four bodyguards.

"His death is without any comparison with our sorrow and our anger after the massacre of Mogadishu and Stammheim." it said. referring to the terrorists who died in the Somali capital and Stuttgart's Stammheim

"We shall never forget the blood spilled," it said. "The fight is only beginning." Schleyer, a member of Hitler's feared S.S. unit during World War II, later won a reputation as a tough bargainer with unions







### Carter's Woes With Congress

Jimmy Carter is the first president since Dwight Eisenhower to arrive in the White House without experience in Congress - a personal base in the House or Senate. The success of the anti-Washington theme in the Carter campaign suggests that the times and the national mood demanded another departure from presidential apprenticeship on Capitol Hill.

But the licking which President Carter's energy program is taking in the Senate must surely have the White House worried. If the result is a scatter-shot program not measuring up to the problem, the rest of the country should worry, too.

Energy is not the only sector on the congressional front where the Carter forces are in trouble. If the Senate were to vote today on ratification of the Panama Canal treaties, the President probably would lose. And the latest turns in his Middle East policy have him in hot water with members of Congress sensitive to the pro-Israel lobby.

Earlier this year congressional opposition forced Mr. Carter to back off from the \$50 tax rebate that was to have been the cornerstone of his economic program. His stand against financing doubtful water projects petered out in compromise. He lost the common situs picketing bill which would have enhanced his stature with labor, and the laborsupported cargo preference bill also is in trouble. The Senate has rejected his proposal to extend public financing of campaigns to include elections

Mr. Carter does have a skilled congressional trouble-shooter at his side in Vice President Walter Mondale, a former senator. But Mr. Mondale's stock may have taken a nosedive since he resorted to what some senators regard as parliamentary "dirty tricks" to break the filibuster on natural gas

Presumably the President can deal with a contrary Senate by going over its head — to the people. A show of popular support for his programs pollsters is bad for Mr. Carter, too. Louis Harris, NBC and others have reported a decline in the President's "approval" rating from a high of 75 per cent last spring to 50 per cent or less in September.

Mr. Carter is popular out on the hustings and in front of television cameras. But leadership for a president in office also means finding common ground with the Congress for support of legislative programs that put substance into image and

# McClanahan: I 'Restrict Dreaming To The Nighttime'

Does Sanford City Commissioner A.A. McClanahan's recent Does Sanford City Commissioner A.A. McClanahan's recent opposition to projects, ranging from city financing of the Monroe lakefront lighting and the use of city money to aid in downtown development, reflect negative thinking or independent thought?

"I restrict my dreaming to the nighttime," said McClanahan, denying that he is negative. "When I wake up during the day I am living in a factual, practical world. Dreamers are fine, but they can't run a business with nothing but dreams."

McClanahan admitted he has voted against: — The lakefront lighting if it were to be continued with the city paying the bill while the lights are not within city bounds.

Of his opposition to the city floating industrial bonds for Keller Industries, McClanahan said that a lending institution "requires you to have some of your own hard-earned money invested in what you are buying to give the motivation to pay for the item

"Anytime an industry wants to establish an additional location or a plant, it should have some of its own money invested," he said, adding in the instance of Keller Industries, the city will be issuing \$750,000 in tax-free municipal bonds entailing that the city purchase and own that property (the site of the proposed Keller plant) in a tax-free status for a period of 15 years at which time title will pass to Keller Industries for probably the amount of \$1." he said. He said the industry will pay a "lease-hold" tax which is much less than property taxes.

"The only way the city can benefit is through the jobs and payroll at the plant, yet the city is setting a precedent for others to follow and other industries locating here have paid their own

the Sanford Airport Authority are already equipped to handle such bonding, while the city has not been involved in a similar undertaking before.

The commissioner, completing his sixth year in office said he does not have a closed mind on issues. Rather, "I don't wait for the night of the meeting to do my homework. I do my homework before the issue comes up and by the time the matter is before the ommission, I have sifted through the variables.

"I will change my mind if new facts are presented," he said.

McClanahan is a retired Navy lieutenant commander, having
served as an enlisted man for 16 years and as a commissioned officer for 10 years. He is a native of Minneola, Fla. He has worked on the underprivileged children's committee for the Kiwanis Club for the past five years and is vice chairman of the ounty's mental health board.
