

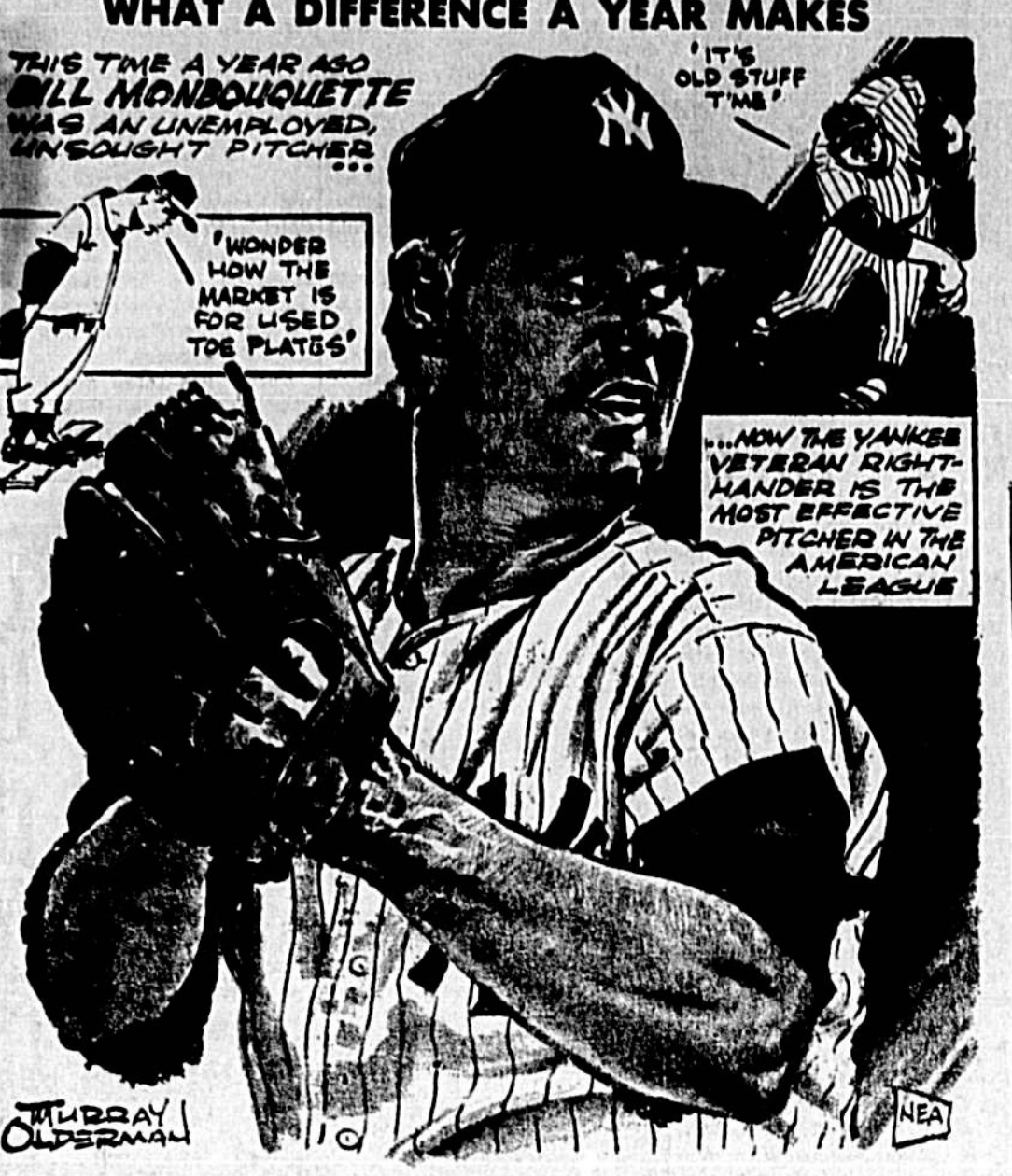

# Giants Slam Atlanta 5-4, Take Top Spot

There's nothing like a nice lit-  
tle winning string to give a  
baseball team a lift in the stand-  
ings. Except, perhaps, a nice lit-

tle losing streak by the guys di-  
rectly in front of you.  
San Francisco's ambitious  
Giants have won eight of their  
last 11 games and St. Louis'  
cooperative Cardinals have

dropped eight of their last 11.  
Result: A five-game pickup for  
the Giants and a change at the  
top of the National League race.  
San Francisco captured first  
place Thursday with a 5-4 vic-  
tory over Atlanta while St. Louis  
was losing 3-2 in 11 innings to  
Los Angeles in the only NL  
game played. New York at  
Philadelphia and Pittsburgh at  
Chicago were rained out.

### Injuries Don't Hinder Frisco

ATLANTA (AP)—Surging San  
Francisco seems to thrive on  
adversity.  
The Giants, with their injury  
list climbing about as fast as  
their standing in the National  
League, booted into first place  
this week despite wounds to a  
pair of key players.  
San Francisco slipped ahead  
of St. Louis Thursday night with  
a 5-4 victory over Atlanta, which  
gave the Giants a 31 edge in  
their series with the Braves de-  
spite the absence of slugger  
Willie McCovey.  
He was spliced last week and  
did not come to Atlanta, and  
third baseman Frank Johnson  
won't accompany the Giants to  
Chicago today.  
Johnson suffered a fractured  
nose when he was hit by an in-  
field bouncer which took a wild  
hop, and team officials said he  
probably would be out three or  
four weeks.

## Need For Nurses Reflected In Aid

Our society's need for nurses is apparent in the educational stimulus provided by federal funds in this field. Federal loans up to \$1,000 a year are available for students enrolled full-time in accredited schools of nursing in public or non-profit colleges, universities, junior colleges and hospitals. Loans are repayable to the school over a 10-year period which begins one year after study is completed. Students must need the money to continue their studies and be qualified by academic standing. As much as 50 per cent of the loan plus interest may be canceled for five years of full-time service as a professional nurse in a public or non-profit organization. Nursing schools may not award National Defense Student Loans to students who are eligible for Nursing Student Loans. In addition, under the Nurse Training Act, schools may award tuition fees, monthly stipends, allowance for dependents and a travel allowance to prepare graduate nurses for nursing specialists and teachers in hospitals, public health agencies and schools of nursing. Traineeships may be used for long-term academic study in universities, or for shorter programs provided by universities, health agencies, or other non-profit sponsors. A traineeship for long-term study may not be awarded to any nurse for more than two years. Loan recipients must be employed as a full-time student in a participating school, be a U. S. citizen or intend to reside permanently in the U. S., be pursuing a course of study leading to a baccalaureate or associate degree in nursing, a diploma in nursing or a graduate degree in nursing, be in need of assistance and be able to maintain academic good standing. Traineeships and student loan funds are administered by nursing schools. No loans or traineeships are made directly to students by the federal government. Students desiring loans or traineeships must apply directly to participating nursing schools. Students already enrolled in a participating school should consult the official in charge of student financial aid. For information write the Division of Nursing, Public Health Service, Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Arlington, Va. 22203. There are also Nursing Student Opportunity Grants of up to \$800 a year awarded to undergraduates on the basis of need. After the first year, an additional \$200 a year is available for those who rank in the upper half of their nursing class. For information write Division of Nursing, Public Health Service, Arlington, Va. 22203. Other areas of concern in our country are reflected in the fellowships in air pollution, community health, injury control, nursing services, water supply and accident prevention offered by the Public Health Service. The aim is to raise the level of competence and increase the number of men and women qualified to undertake research in these fields. Fellowships are also awarded to increase the number of skilled research workers in the health information specialties. Predoctoral, postdoctoral special, research career and international postdoctoral fellowships are awarded. 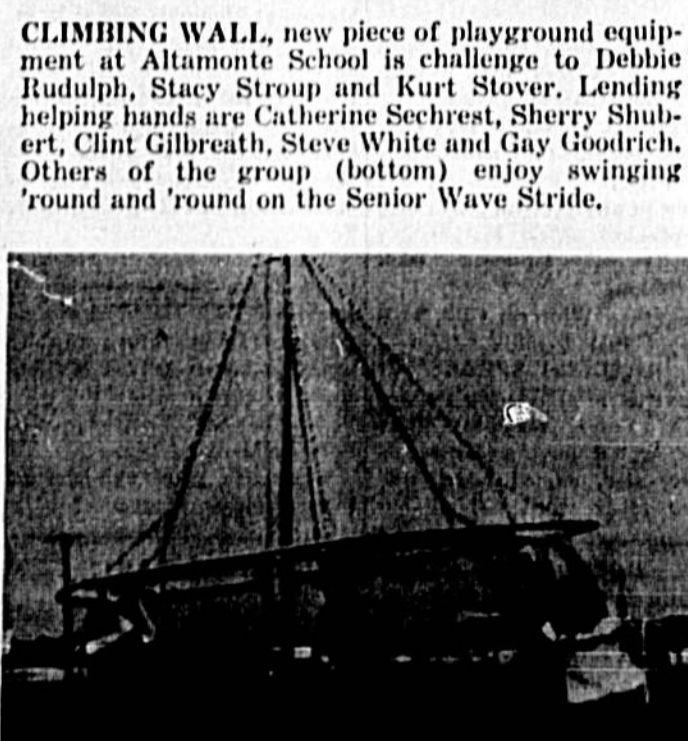
