

Your yard is first defense for environment

It may surprise you to know that your yard is the first line of defense for Florida's fragile environment. The health of Florida's estuaries, rivers, lakes and aquifers depends in part on how you landscape and maintain your yard. And you don't even have to live on the water to make a difference because stormwater runoff is the main source of pollution of wa-

Stormwater runoff: Rain falls on yards, roads and parking lots, then washes into streams and bays, carrying pollutants like fertilizers, pes-ticides, soil and petroleum products. Scientists have discovered that fertilizers and pesticides from residential areas can be serious threats to the health of Florida's waters. When runoff contains nitrogen from fertilizers, algae can become so abundant that aquatic plants are smothered, oxygen is depleted and fish kills may result. In some freshwater environments phosphorus is often the nutrient responsible for algae blooms. Toxic substances such as common land-scape and household pesticides can damage reproduction

in marine life.

The Florida Yards & Neighborhood Program: This program is a partnership of concerned citizens, members of

the landscape industry, the University of Florida's Coop-erative Extension Service, the University of Florida's Cooperative Extension Service, the National Estuary Programs, Florida Sea Grant College Program and numerous environmental agencies. The program was developed to address serious problems of pollution and disappearing habitats by enlisting homeowners in the battle to now our waterways. The program provides special educational and outreach activities in the possessing to help residents reduce pollution and enhance their environment by improving home and landscape management.

Plant selection: Plant selection is undoubtedly the fun part of landscaping. Florida's climate supports countless varieties of plants, and many are grown by local plant numeries. The plants you select determine the wildlife value of your yard, the level of maintenance that will be required, how

much money you'll be spending on water or electricity to run a pump, and how much fertilizer or pesticide may be required. Plant selection will determine how long your landscape will last. For example, fast-growing plants often have a shorter lifespan than alower-growing spe-

Native plants: Some Florida native plants may be tough to find at your local garden center, but there are nurseries that grow native plants. Visit parks and preserves to view native plants in their natural setting. See what grows well in your area. Read books on Florida native plants. Contact the Florida Native Plants Society or other horticultural organization to get information on native plants. Once native on native plants. Once native plants are established in the right location, most require little, if any, supplemental water, fertilizers or pesticides. Many native plants have a value for wildlife. Native flowering and fruiting plants can bring birds and butterflies into your yard and water view.

and your view.

Maintaining your yard: A good landscape design incorporating the right plants in the right places reduces maintenance requirements and costs. Pollution-free maintenance is easiest when plants are se-lected with that goal in mind. If your landscape requires too

much work or practices that pollute, you should consider making some changes in your landscape. Modification of your fertilization, watering, mowing, pruning, raking, mulching, and pest management practices will be necessary to achieve the environmentally friendly yard that we expect to have in Florida.

Turf Turf areas tend to have higher nutritional and pesti-cide needs than other plants in the landscape. In Florida we have four common types of lawn grasses, Bahia, St. Augustine, Bermuda, and Centipede. Bahia requires the least amount of maintenance, but it is prone to damage by mole crickets. St. Augustine requires more fertilizer and water and more fertilizer and water, and it also can be prone to pests such as chinch bugs. Bermuda, which is used on golf course which is used on golf course greens, requires the most fer-tilizer, pesticides and water, Because it requires intensive maintenance, it is not recom-mended for home landscapes. Centipede varieties create low maintenance lawns best suited to North Florida locations.

SANFORD - The City of San-ford Community Redevelop-ment Agency (CRA) and Water-front Master Plan Steering Committee have planned a

joint meeting Wednesday. Most of the items have been regularly scheduled for discus-

sion during previous Master Plan committee meetings, including reports on the pro-posed move to downtown Sanford, improvements to the Sanford seawall, a report on the proposed hotel/conference center project at Fort Mellon park, and the midge program.

At the July CRA meeting, John Y. Mercer was elected_ chairman, succeeding Bob Parsell, Larry Strickler was elected to continue his previous post as vice-chairman.

Also during the July meeting. Sanford's Director of Planning Jay Marder said he anticipates receiving \$565,000 from the MetroPian Orlando Transportation Improvement Program, which includes \$99,000 for

riverwalk enhancements, an additional \$99,000 for side-walks from Mellonville Avenue to 13th Street, and the remaining \$367,000 to be used for sidewalks along U.S. Highway 17-92 south of 25th Street.

The meeting will be held in the city manager's conference room, second floor, beginning at 4 p.m.
















When to see a specialist

DEAR DR. GOTT: Your questionand answer column provides a service by dispelling some myths and correct-ing information. I have been disturbed, however, by your tendency to advise referral to a subspecialist,

turbed, however, by your tendency to advise referral to a subspecialist, rather than to recommend family physicians. These doctors are trained to assess and treat most diseases. I am a family physician and refer only unusual problems to a specialist.

DEAR DOCTOR: Family physicians, primary-care doctors and general internists are, indeed, usually quite capable of diagnosing and treating many aliments. In my column, I often recommend specialists because my readers ordinarily have exhausted (in more ways than one) their local medical resources. I believe that specialists are a more useful option than a continuing string of general doctors.

I don't agree with your statement that primary-care physicians are knowledgeable about the intricacies of most diseases. Such a goal is commendable but, in my opinion, it is unrealistic; the grail is unobtainable. The treatment of many disease is so complex that no single practitioner can master all the aspects of diagnosis and therepy. The good doctor knews what he doesn't knew. The value of a good family physician is, it seems to me, that he as she has a bread rebreal base and cin send difficult cases to specialists when needed. I believe that need is becoming more and more ovident.

Please don't mininterpret my comments as a critician of more relicians of more relicia

Please don't mininterpret my com-ments as a criticism of general dec-tors. I am one of you, yet I am pro-feedly strare of our limitations. In the final analysis, many patients are best served by prompt and cheerful referral. That is an approach I shall continue to use in this column.

If the test is abnormal, you can receive treatment that might save your life. If the angiogram is normal, you can be virtually certain that noth-

ing is seriously wrong. Then your doc-tor can examine other, less dangerous causes for your symptom, such as chest wall syndrome or anxiety disor-

While no one welcomes unneces-sary testing. I believe that your doctor has an obligation to cover all the




Cherryville (36-14) then earned the trip to the World Series in Las Vegas by whipping Charleston (27-6), 10-3, to win the Region S




