Summertime Cockroach

Summer heat and humidity increase all bug activity, cockroach are the subject of this bulletin. The bulletin focuses on cockroach and problems and their control.

Cockroach are most active during the summer months, foraging for food and water. They are also looking for new areas to nest.

The first step in controlling cockroach is to find their nest, the nest could be anywhere in or outside your home. Areas to check would include: base of trees, dead areas of trees, fence lines, piles of lumber, piles of rubbish and entry points going into your home. Phone and electric lines can give them access into your attic area.

Since cockroach are thrive on high moisture; your plumbing, any wood rot, roof leaks and high moisture areas around windows and doors are possible nesting areas.

Once the nest is found you can treat the problem with either liquid or dust insecticide. If you can not find the nest all the above areas should be treated.

SANFORD - The City of Sanford Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) and Waterfront Master Plan Steering Committee have planned a joint meeting Wednesday.

Most of the items have been regularly scheduled for discussion during previous Master Plan committee meetings, including reports on the proposed move to downtown Sanford, improvements to the Sanford seawall, a report on the proposed hotel/conference center project at Fort Mellon park, and the midge program.

At the July CRA meeting, John Y. Mercer was elected

chairman, succeeding Bob Parsell. Larry Strickler was elected to continue his previous post as vice-chairman.

Also during the July meeting, Sanford's Director of Planning Jay Marder said he anticipates receiving \$565,000 from the MetroPlan Orlando Transportation Improvement Program, which includes \$99,000 for

riverwalk enhancements, an additional \$99,000 for sidewalks from Mellonville Avenue to 13th Street, and the remaining \$367,000 to be used for sidewalks along U.S. Highway 17-92 south of 25th Street.

The meeting will be held in the city manager's conference room, second floor, beginning at 4 p.m.

Veigle said that his contributions to United Methodist Church and to John Book were made "in good faith and accepted that way." He has thank you notes from two of the pastors at United Methodist.

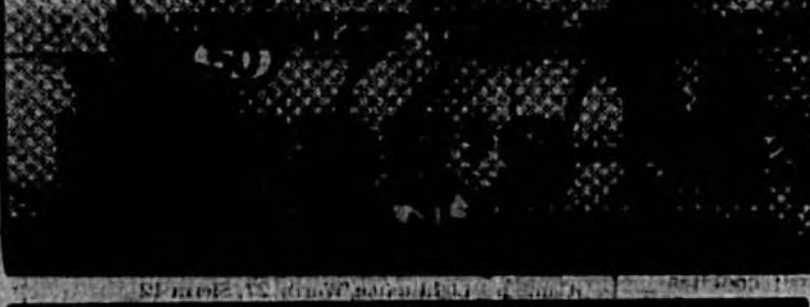
Maloy said that the gifts and donations - and now the attempts to fool everyone were "obvious

Post 53 finishes third in Southeast

GALLATIN, TN. - Sanford Post 53's amazing run in tournament play over the last two years came to an end Sunday night as the locals fell, 13-7, to Cherryville Post 100 from North Carolina in the semifinals of the Southeast Regional Tournament on Tim Garrett Park at Volunteer State Community College.

The victory propelled Cherryville into Monday morning's championship game opposite Charleston Recreation from South Carolina, which ousted Hartsville Post 52 from Alabama (45-9), 11-10 in 10-innings, in the other semifinal.

Cherryville (38-14) then earned the trip to the World Series in Las Vegas by whipping Charleston (37-9), 10-3, to win the Region 3 title.

Sanford (38-13), the defending World Series Champions which finished the season by winning 23 of 25 games, including 23 of 23 through last Friday, had wound up second in its group in Round Robin play after dropping a 15-6 decision to Hartsville on Saturday.

Post 53, which never led in the game, gave some of its regulars the game off knowing it would be in the semifinals on Sunday.

Tim Hule led the Sanford offense, going 2-for-4 with a double, scoring one run and driving in one.

Also contributing for Post 53 were Matt Alegria (double, two runs), Paulo Silva (single, run, RBI), Chas Lytle (single, run), Jorge Hernandez (single, RBI), Richard Rodriguez (single), Scott Ferrell (run) and Jeremy Frost (RBI).

In Sunday's semifinal, Sanford took a 1-0 lead in the bottom of the first inning, but Cherryville took the lead for good by scoring three runs in the top of the third inning.

Post 53 then saw its hopes slip away as the North Carolina squad scored five runs in the third inning and four runs in the sixth inning. **Please see Post 53, Page 8A.**

Lighthouse shines

Georgia team outscores foes 140-67

SANFORD - Lighthouse/Worth may not have had a great regular season, but it sure is playing well in the World Series Grand Slam.

The Stone Mountain, Georgia-based squad completed a 5-0 stampe over the 10-team field in the City of Sanford and the Seminole County Convention and Visitor's Bureau sponsored ASA National Men's Super Slow Pitch Softball Tournament with a 37-10 thrashing of Sunbelt/Easton Sunday afternoon on Pinner-Stetson Field at Historic Sanford Memorial Stadium.

Lighthouse/Worth finished the regular season 40-15, but won the ISA World Series in Gastonia, North Carolina last weekend. Couple that with winning the season-ending USBA title last fall and the Stone Mountain crew has won three straight Grand Slam crowns.

Sunbelt/Easton mounted a minor rally, scoring eight runs in the bottom of the first inning.

That was as close as it would get, however, as Lighthouse/Worth pitcher Ricky Huggins, who was named the tournament Most Valuable Player, held Sunbelt/Easton to two runs on six hits over the final four innings.

The champions, who have now won the last three legs of the Grand Slam, including last fall's USBA title at Daytona Beach, hit 17 home runs in the championship game, cut to five innings by the Run Rule, including four each by Huggins and DeWayne Fritzell.

Huggins just missed the triple crown, needing to go 5-for-5 with five home runs to add the batting title and home run crown to his tournament leading 26 RBI.

But a line drive to the wall in the third inning ended the threat, as Huggins ended the game 4-for-5 with four home runs and eight RBI.

Huggins' teammate, Carl Rose, hit his third home run of the game in the 8th inning to edge Huggins, Fritzell and Sunbelt/Easton's Ted

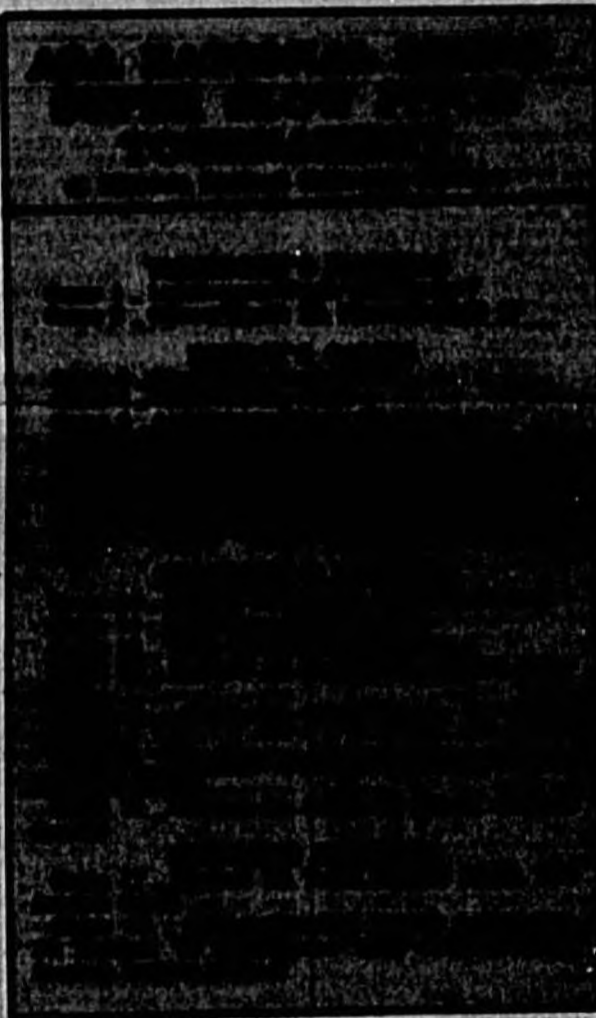

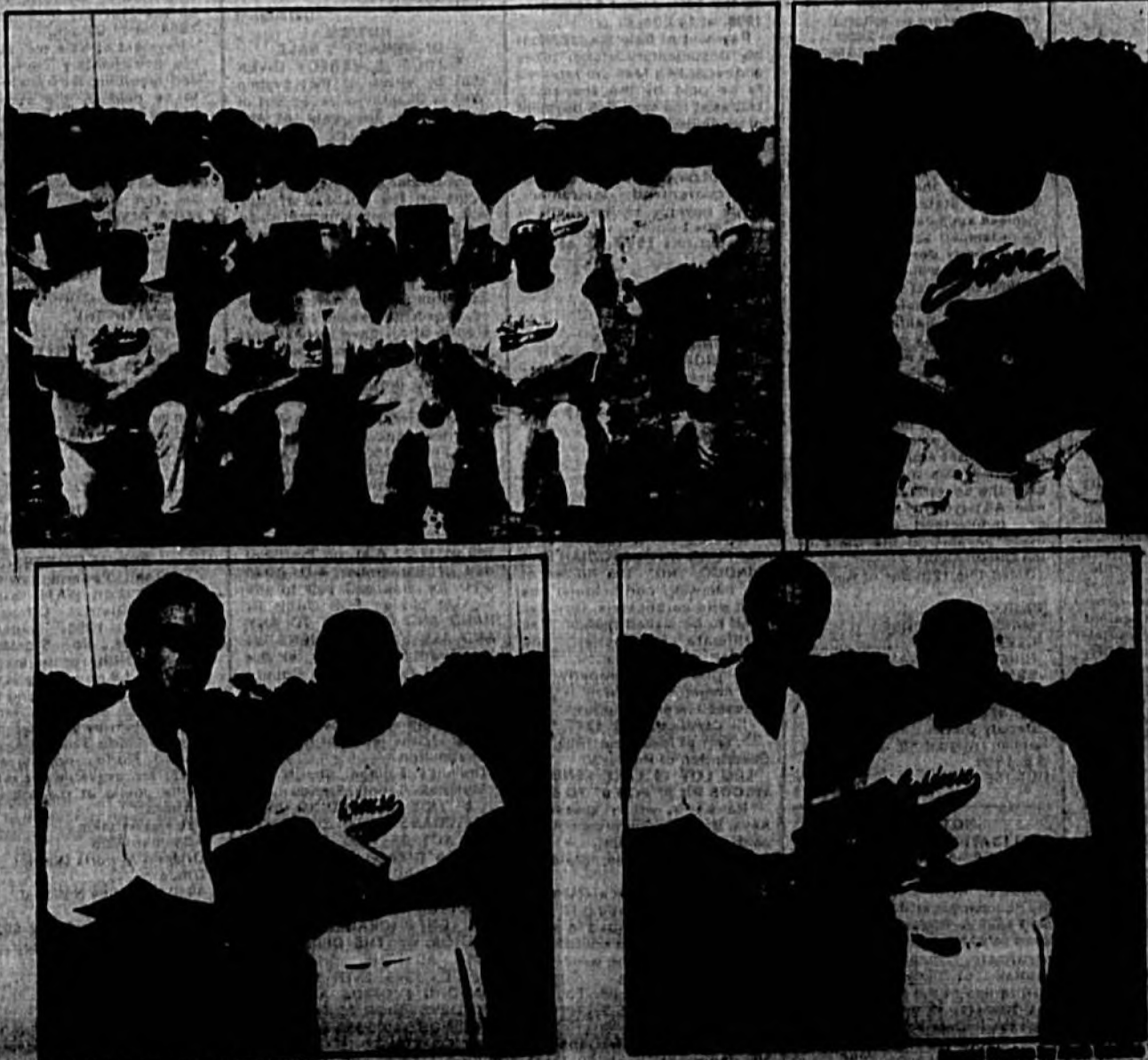
