

Bell move could bring 2,300 jobs

Seminole County is vying for an expansion facility of Cincinnati Bell Inc., which could bring about 2.300 new jobs into the county.
The Seminole County Commis-

ston on Tuesday voted to approve economic incentives from the county and state level totaling 81 125 million. The county's portion, 8425,000, will be used to levcrage additional money from the

state, according to Bob Tork, economic development manger for Sentinole County.

Seminole County Joins Volusta County, which offered a 834 mil fton incentive package, and Osceola County, which has offered 85 million, as the lowest hidder for a new telecommunications facility

Bald eagles could gain lake habitat

Airport may be off the hook

Audubon officials appeared receptive to a proposal by Sanford Mayor Larry Dale Tuesday for a bald engle's habitat on the shores of Lake

The proposal was made as mitigation for an engles' habitat, which was cut down at the Or-

lando Sanford Airport recently. The Florida Audubon had filed a complaint saying the airport did not have permits to cut down the

Charles Lee, senior vice president of the Audubon, said a settlement could be reached with the city and the airport if there is compensation for the loss of the eagles' nest, and if the airport admits it needed a permit to cut down the tree and agrees not to cut any more trees without the proper permits.

Lee said Dale's proposal looked interesting enough to be considered. By the end of the meeting, he said it looked like the matter may be resolved.

Dale proposed an 1,800 acre site east on the

Lake Jesup waterfront off State Road 46, which currently houses four engles' nests. The sile is owned by the city and serves as a spray irrigation area. It serves as part of an enterprise zone and is used by the city's department of public works for waste water.

Dale said staff will look into the legal aspects of setting the land aside as a conservation area and habitat protection zone. The St. Johns River Management District will provide the Audubon Society with Infra red aerial photographs for further site study.

"We want to cooperate fully with the Audubon." Dale said. "I think they came away from the meeting with the feeling that we want to be good neighbors with more sensitivity to the environment."







Core values: Apples got 'em!

As I searched my bookshelves re-cently, I noticed that I don't have ONE book devoted solely to apples. I have cookbooks devoted to pears, mushrooms, vinegar, oils, tea, coffee, potatoes, onions, rice, corn, tomatoes — even a whole cookbook devoted to goat cheese. But of the hundreds of cookooks on my shelves, I don't have one dedicated to the apple.

This strikes me as a grave oversight, as apples seem almost like the national fruit ("as American as apple pie," and all that), have their own proverb ("an apple a day ..."), and, if nothing else, were probably the first fruit to have a spokesman (Johnny Ap-pleseed). A whole book, in fact, could pleased). A whole book, in fact, could probably be devoted to "apple-isms" (to wit, "comparing apples and oranges," "rotten apple," "don't upset the apple-cart," "to put in apple ple order," "the Big Apple," etc.).

Since there doesn't seem to be a

okbook out there for us apple-lovers, it behooves me to share some recipes.

The first is the classic Tarte Tatin (named, I'm told, after the two French sisters who invented it), a luscious upside-down apple pie that looks as spectacularly good as it tastes.

The recipe here is from Chef Michel LeBorgne of the New England Culi-nary Institute in Montpelier, Vt., and I have to say I was flabbergasted when the one I made, following his recipe, turned out just as perfectly as his. The secret (Chef Michel ALWAYS shares his wonderful secrets) is to let the tart rest for a few hours - or overnight before serving it.

If, like I do, you like to make desserts ahead of time to save yourself lastminute madness, this one is perfect. And while it may look elaborate, it is easier to make than your average

The second recipe is one that I've printed in this space before; it is my mother's recipe for apple crisp and is a sure-fire winner. The third is an updated recipe for that old standby. baked apples

On second thought: Who needs an apple cookbook? We're doing fine on our own.






WINTER PARK _ For one night. Beau Hickman was the world's greatest running back.

DEAR DR. GOTT: The TV ada tell me that I cannot exceed the dose of nonprescription pain pills such as Aleve, Advil and others. This doesn't make sense to me. If, on average, over-the-counter remedies are half the strength of their prescription counterparts, why not subscribe to the latter, rather than to the former,

DEAR READER: This is an excellent question that has puzzled me as well. To give you a "sale" answer, I encourage people not to exceed the manufacturer's directions on any medication.

However, I believe there is some room for flexibility here. Take, for example, the product you mention: Aleve, a drug for minor aches and pains. The active ingredient in Aleve is naproxen sodium, 220 milligrams per pill. The recommended dose is one tablet every eight to 12 hours, or a maximum of 860 milligrams per 24

As you point out, naproxen is also available by prescription (Naproxyn, Anaprox and others) in 275-milligram tablets to be taken every eight to 12 hours, not to exceed 1275 milligrams of naproxen per 24 hours.

Thus, the total daily dose of prescription naproxen is double that of the recommended limit for the nonprescription variety. What gives here?

Those companies that market competing products state in their television ads that consumers are stuck taking 220 milligrams of naprozen every eight hours — and woe betide the patient who experiences pain, because he can't take more of that medicine. Given that the maximum 24-hour dose is 1375 milligrams, why not double the dose of Aleve or take it every six hours? I don't see any rea-son not to do so, and I don't know why Aleve's manufacturer (Procter and Gamble) hasn't pointed this out. In this instance, the nonprescription maximum dose could safely be increased — even doubled — if a patient needed more pain relief. Of course, increasing the dosage of naprozen can lead to potential side effects such as stomach irritation and intestinal bleeding, but this is true of the prescription varieties anyway.

Consequently, I allow my patients to bend the rules. In a similar vein, the maximum allowable dose of ibuprofen Advil, Motrin and others) is 2400 milligrams per 24 hours, so a patient could consume up to 12 standard, non-prescription tablets if necessary for take three 600 milligram Motrin tablets a day, by prescription). Moreover, nonprescription Zantac 75 - a drug to reduce gastric scidity --is half the prescription dose of 180 milligrame; so why not take two twice a day if needed?

All this seems to be rank common sense. Yet, I welcome the letters from irate readers who may choose to disagree and write me their opinions. The bottom line? Take any medicine cautiously, check with your physician, and don't be suckered in by TV com-

mercials.
DEAR DR. GOTT: What is the recipe for Certo and grape juice used for treating arthritis? I've read two variations and am unsure which is

DEAR READER: While I do not necessarily endorse this home remedy for treating the pain of arthritis, many readers have attested to its effectiveness. In its favor, it's eale and

inexpensive. The usual dose is 1 to 3 teaspoons of Certo dissolved in a 3-ounce glass of unswestened grape juice 3 times a day. Use the variable approach, based on the extent of the arthritis, the amount of pain, and a person's personal choices.


