It has not been feasible, Roosevelt added, to undertake work on sections of the waterway not now in existence. IMPORTANT NOTICE TO HOME CANNERS

The Glass Top Seal Fruit Jar Cap for Home Canning was developed as a wartime product to conserve metal. It consists of a Metal Band, Glass Lid and Rubber Ring.

Because of the difference in the nature of these three materials this Cap must be used differently from any other fruit jar cap. If used properly it will give excellent results. If not used properly, results will be bad, including failure to seal and breakage of jars. Following are simple instructions for use of the Glass Top Seal Cap and must be followed carefully.

1. Do NOT use in Oven Canning.
2. If processing, (cooking in jar), leave 1 inch space in top of jar. If using open kettle, leave 1/2 inch space in top of jar.
3. Fit rubber around projection on bottom side of lid.
4. Place lid so rubber lies between lid and top edge of jar.
5. Turn bands tight, then loosen slightly (about 1/4 turn). Bands must fit loosely during processing (cooking). This is important and must be done to insure best results. If using Open Kettle, screw bands tight as soon as jar is filled.
6. After processing, screw bands tight to complete seal. Remove bands 12 hours after canning.

SUFFERN, N.Y., July 7.—Ten acres of ripe string beans on the farm of Andrew Zachmann near here were saved last week end by a cut-rate "pick-and-carry" system of marketing which brought a stampede of bargain-conscious housewives to pick his bean patch clean and fill their pantry shelves for the winter.

The beans, 500 bushels of them, ripened suddenly last week as a result of hot weather, and Mr. Zachmann's ten hired men could not have gathered a tenth of the crop before it spoiled.

One may not have given it thought before but today the corner puts up a proposition to the officials of the Florida State League. This idea may be worth its weight in gold but there again it may not be worth the salt that goes in our...

When this war comes to an end there will be the problem of finding jobs for the hundreds and thousands of service men who will be released from active duty. Finding jobs for them will be the matter of great importance for they will all be willing and wanting to go to work immediately.

There will be unlimited. We've been in the service over 31 months and believe us when we tell you that we've seen faster baseball here in the service than the Florida State League could ever hope to offer. However, former State Leaguers have been fast for Class "D" baseball. Why couldn't the State League begin operating immediately after the war, without any delay, and put some 150 young men back on a salary basis. This goes not only for the State League but for dozens of other Class "D" and "C" leagues before the war.

The average salary of a Class "D" baseballer is approximately \$70 to \$80 per month. Putting about 150 young men back to work on such a salary isn't going to hurt anybody. We realize that State League officials have much more important business on their minds today but even so, they were entrusted with the leadership of the league. When the war ends, plans should have been drawn immediately for operations again as soon as the world conflict comes to an end.

60 Vegetable And Fruit Growers To Push Organization

ORLANDO, July 7. (FNS)—Sixty of Florida's largest vegetable growers and grower-shippers assembled in Orlando last week to form a statewide organization. The meeting, sponsored by the Florida Farm Bureau, brought representatives from the following counties: Alachua, Seminole, Hillsborough, Pinellas, Glades, Broward, Dade, Manatee, Highlands, Sarasota, Orange, Putnam, Lee and St. Johns, who control approximately 100,000 acres producing vegetables.

John W. Clark of Waverly and John Ford, president and secretary respectively of the Florida Farm Bureau, served as temporary secretary and chairman of the meeting at which a statewide Florida Vegetable Committee was set up. The following program was adopted without a dissenting vote: "Duty of the committee will be to officially and impartially represent the Florida vegetable industry in its negotiations with public and private agencies with respect to labor, packages, fertilizer, spray material, machinery and supplies, freight rates, transportation, price ceilings and floors, fuel, tires, agricultural selective service deferments, tariffs and any other industry problems which develop. The committee will not have the authority to regulate grade or pack, extend funds for commodity advertising, exercise any control over production quotas or allotments or in any way interfere with free enterprise and trade of the Florida vegetable industry."

The following directors and alternates were named: Celery: Raoul Loring, Sarasota and H. R. Cobb, Seminole; Beans: R. L. Chaatain, Palm Beach and W. H. Blount, Broward; Potatoes: H. H. Bailey, St. Johns and J. A. Cox, Dade; Cabbage: A. Duda, Seminole and A. Wells, Palm Beach; Tomatoes: Luther Chandler, Dade and Paul Dickman, Hillsborough; Root vegetables: E. W. Luns, Martin and John Tiedke, Glades; Peppers, eggplant and squash: H. L. Lyons, Broward and Bryant Pierce, Lee.

Leaf vegetables: M. D. McLean, Manatee and Mrs. Ruth Wedgeworth, Palm Beach; Carrots: Allen Markham, Oklawaha and J. D. Apte, Hillsborough; Melons, cukes and cantaloupes: Douglas Iron and G. G. Olliban, Lake and Commissioner of Agriculture Nathan Mayo who can choose his own alternate. Directors were charged with immediately drawing up charter and by-laws and will meet again shortly to elect a chairman and present charter and by-laws for approval. State headquarters for the committee will be Orlando.

Navy Reports Over 600 Men Rescued When Cruiser Helena Was Torpedoed

Blotched by land and sea, the Japanese garrison at Munda surrendered or died today as American troops cut through the jungles to a point only three miles from the key enemy air base on New Georgia island. The enemy was firmly entrenched, however, and is expected to make a bloody defense.

From Allied Headquarters in Australia it was reported that more than 600 men aboard the U.S. Cruiser Helena were saved when the cruiser was sunk in the battle of Kula Gulf in the Central Solomon War zone.

In Washington the Navy announced that U.S. submarines are knocking off Jap ships at the rate of one a day, taking a terrific toll of what Japan needs most—ships to link the far-flung outposts of her stolen empire. The latest Navy communiqué listed 10 more Jap transport and supply vessels torpedoed to the bottom, bringing to 283 the total number reported sunk or damaged by subs since Pearl Harbor.
