# UN Bans Further Military Action By Israel, Syria

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. Council early today banned any Israel or Syrian forces and supposed to become effective at 12:30 p.m. EDT Saturday. The 15-nation council acted unanimously at an overnight emergency meeting on Syrian charges that an Israeli armored column had advanced inside

Syria in a drive to capture the Israel, Egypt, Jordan and Syria It called for full cooperation with Norwegian Lt. Gen. Odd Bull, head of the U.N. Truce Supervision Organization for Palestine, in implementing the cease-fire, "including freedom of movement and adequate communications facilities." That provision was taken to mean Israel should give Bull back his headquarters south of

At least 119 North Vietnamese regulars were reported killed in scattered fights involving U.S. Marines, Korean marines and U.S. Army paratroops and infantrymen. U.S. losses were three dead and 65 wounded.

The Communists today showered some 400 mortar and artillery shells and rockets on Marine and Army artillery positions just below the demilitarized zone. The Marines reported 47 wounded in the attacks.
