## 'Quake Was Terrifying

For 39 devastating seconds it crashed and thundered through he Central American country, an earthquake which registered

7.5 on the Richter scale. A second tremor followed an hour later, and the third major shock came at noon Feb. 6. When a small group of local news reporters flew into Guatemala City Friday, the country was still shuddering with occasional "aftershocks" — a terrifying feeling as the earth shifts beneath one's feet and buildings tremble.

The plane which flew the news team was an old DC-6 cargo carrier chartered by Green Thumb Corp in Apopka to carry relief food, clothing and blankets to workers on Green Thumb's nurseries near Guatemala City, and medical supplies to Roosevelt Learning about Green Thumb's proposed relief effort earlier in

#### Hearst Jurors To See Where Patty Held

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) - Patricia Hearst and the jurors who will decide her fate plan to see today the two apartment closets where she says she was held in dark captivity for weeks after her kidnaping.

Miss Hearst testified the Symbionese Liberation Army kept her blindfolded and tied, coerced her into taping a plea to her parents to cooperate with her captors and physically abused her. She began telling the jurors on Friday her story of why she took part in an SLA bank robbery for which she is on trial.

Details of today's excursion were kept confidential "for security reasons," said her chief defense attorney, F. Lee Bailey. Federal marshals were to take the jurors to suburban Daly City and escort them into the apartment where Miss Hearst was taken the night she was dragged screaming from her Berkeley apartment.

#### Antibusing Riot In Boston

BOSTON (AP) - Antibusing demonstrators and police traded charges of brutality after a riot near South Boston High School that left dozens of persons injured and 13 ar-

At the height of Sunday's melee, police said a crowd of about 400 antibusing marchers wielded bottles, bricks, clubs and tire irons in an attack on police which was coordinated by citizen band radios. The protestors countered that police tried to break up their march for no reason and charged into them on horseback and mo-

Police Commissioner Robert J. diGrazia called for a grand jury investigation. He charged that the confrontation, in which at least three police officers were hurt, was a conspiracy by hoodlums to injure police.

Florida Officials Fear Oyster Industry Hurting

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Florida officials, fearing drains on major rivers will hurt the state's oyster industry, are trying to form a tristate agency to coordinate water use in Florida, Georgia and Alabama. "One of the major problems is there is no mechanism to coordinate management of the system," said Rich Mc-Williams, a planner for the Northwest Florida Water Management District. "Florida will get hurt more than anyone else without coordination."

### Pat Moynihan Mold Effective

There's some political spice in the speculation over Daniel Patrick Moynihan's retreat back to Harvard - whether protecting his tenure on the faculty is the only reason for his exit from the United Nations, and whether he will remain for long on the sidelines of politics and government

The strain that surfaced late last year between Mr. Moynihan and Secretary of State Henry Kissinger provides fuel for that speculation However, the public expressions of support Mr. Moynihan received from President Ford and Mr. Kissinger suggest his quarrel was more with the nameless, faceless bureaucracy of the State Department. He had complained that he was pulling in one direction in the U.N. while the State

Department was pulling in another.

The cablegram Mr. Moynihan addressed recently to Mr. Kissinger and all U.S. embassies abroad suggested that State Department regulars believe he had been "needlessly provocative" in his attacks on the United States in the U.N. The flamboyant style of Mr. Moynihan, and his determination to call a spade a spade in debates with "nonaligned" nations, do not fit the State Department mold. As Mr. Moynihan pointed out, our diplomats generally bow to attacks on the United States on the theory that to resist them would seem unfriendly and lead to even greater

He cited specific instances where his tougher response appears to have produced favorable among them the failure of the Organization of African Unity to agree on recognizing the Soviet-backed faction in Angola, and the withdrawal of a U.N. resolution that would have condemned South Africa for intervening in Angola without mentioning the much greater Soviet and Cuban intervention. Even the vote for the anti-Israel resolution on Zionism would have been greater, Mr. Moynihan believes, if our new policy in the U.N. had not led some nations to think twice about following the Arab leadership on that

President Ford is not likely to find another Pat Movnihan to send to the United Nations, but there is no reason why our next ambassador should not take his cue from the brief but lively record Mr. Moynihan left behind. It was not just his personality that shook up the U.N., but the message that came across with his biting logic and attacks on hypocrisy - the message that the United States is willing to stand up and fight for what it believes

Mr. Moynihan rattled the teacups of many a diplomat, but his battles produced a wave of satisfaction among Americans who were tired of seeing Uncle Sam only turn the other cheek to vilification in the U.N. Some broken china is a meager price to pay for the refreshing effect of Mr. Moynihan's straight talk. It may prove as beneficial to the U.N. as to American pride. President Ford - and especially Mr. Kissinger and his State Department - should keep that in mind when they pick his successor.

### **Action Necessary**

A case study in the need for judicial action has just been provided by the Alabama Legislature. The state has one of the lowest tax rates in the nation but has failed to provide facilities to house its prisoners in humane

When a foreign power mistreats American prisoners of war, the Geneva Convention provides a procedure for protest. When a state violates the constitutional rights of an American citizen, the federal courts must enforce those rights. U.S. District Judge Frank Johnson Jr., heard evidence in Montgomery that homosexual rapes and other assaults were

common in Alabama's fearfully overcrowded prisons. He ordered the number of guards to be doubled and set down minimum standards for virtually every area of prison

No judge would have had to "legislate" in this manner if the Alabama Legislature had met its responsibilities to humanity

and decency and simple justice. But when only a judge can give meaning to our contitutional rights, he must do so.

## Congress Caught In Cookie Jar

WASHINGTON - The Supreme Court caught Congress with its hand in the cookie jar.

n attempting to make themselves creators, judges and enforcers of the election commission's requirements they included in the election campaign act of 1974, Senators and Representatives were attempting a power grab, or so decreed the Supreme Court. They were the President and their "just-let-my-head-in-thetent" practice, if allowed to continue, would weaken the constitutional system of checks and balances between the president and the courts.

It is clear that Congress, action here would not have materially weakened the power and influence of President Ford of his successors. But in the past year, taking advantage of Watergate and the forced resignation of President Nixon, activists in the Senate and House have been jabbing and slashing in repeated attacks aimed at gaining broad powers for Congress and cutting deeply into the powers of the presidency.

Their touted thesis over the years, and culminating with Mr. Nixon, was that the influence of Congress has gradually eroded and, that the presidency has strengthened to a dangerous degree.

Congressional committees have taken on themselves a new day-to-day authority in foreign and domestic affairs, not only peeking over the shoulders of department and agency officials, as they correctly should, but in some outrageous instance, attempting to direct operations.

Now there is no doubt Congress has, and Congress or the president is right or wrong in any particular instance is not the issue.

- And while not exactly in the area of crime prevention or detection, Ohio State Highway Patrol helicopters spotted 35,000 traffic violations in 1974 and were cracking down on speeders at the rate of 2,500 a month in 1975. One of the greatest benefits of the helicopter is its speedy response time, which is critical not only in apprehending fawbreakers but evacuating the injured from the scene of highway accidents, heart attack victims and in other situations where minutes count.
