### Editorials

### Another Long Holiday Ahead; Caution Urged

Another long, and dangerous, holiday weekend is ahead for Seminole County and the nation.

Again, the police department, sheriff's office and Highway Patrol have joined in a "be careful" appeal to motorista; the fire department has urged residents to exercise care with fire and the National Safety Council has "auggested"

that hundreds in the nation will lose their lives in accidents. The Safety Council has been the target of public "putshots" in the past for its estimates of the number of fatalities which will occur on holidays.

Criticism directed at the Council has been, to a great extent, that the Council is guilty of "negative thinking" and that it should predict that nobody will be killed.

This type of argument is foolish. Records prove that the Council has been very accurate with its estimates. Its forecasts have nothing to do with the number who die.

Just because the Council predicts that 500 will die, the motoring public doesn't have to make the forecast come true. Careless drivers cause accidents; only the driver can prevent them.

The long weekend is measured from 6 p. m. Wednesday until midnight Sunday. As in the case of the Christmas holiday, law enforcement authorities in Sanford and Seminole County will be busy. By circulating around, they will try to add a measure of caution.

The Safety Council has suggested that motorists "give up" their speed, pointing out that law officers give up their holidays in an effort to prevent fatalities.

Each time you get behind the wheel, just remember that you may or may not live to see the new year arrive. Despite what authorities and the Safety Council do, the final decision rests with the driver.


