

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) - The Malcolm X Liberation Front and the Florida Islamic movement have called for Gov. Reubin Askew's resignation. The groups say he has failed to act on problems facing disadvantaged blacks and whites in Florida.

"Because of the governor's inability or lack of courage to display leadership needed by the big state of Florida. we would like to ask the governor to step down to allow omeone else to meet the problems," Robert Perkins of Tallahassee said Friday.

Perkins said Askew had failed to act on a number of requests from blacks dating to early 1972, including Perkins' charges of prejudice in his firing from Florida State University.



Higher Housing Costs Expected

By JULIAN STENSTROM

If the costs of property, labor and building materials continue to rise at their present rate, potential home buyers can expectwith some degree of assurance—that the prices for single family homes will continue to increase at a rate of about six per cent a year for the next few years.

This prediction, made in a privately circulated newsletter known as the "Florida Growth Report," bears out the contention of Eve ette Huskey, the Maitland Realtor who is probably best known for his development of Seminole County's Sweetwater Oaks, that the best way to save later is to buy now. Huskey's experiences indicate the cost of home construction

is rising approximately 15 to 20 per cent a year. And, with the cost of materials rising daily the cost of labor is certain to follow, particularly with the announcement last week that the February increase in the cost-of-living index as the highest monthly in-

Consequently, the only sensible advice anybody associated with the real estate business could give a potential buyer today is to buy now and-as Huskey says-save later.

All along forecasters have been saying that mortgage interest rates would decrease during the first quarter of 1974, and sure enough this has been happening. However, the forecasters also say that any decrease might be short lived and that interest rates could increase during the second quarter.

While we are not yet in the second quarter it is interesting to note that several news articles appearing in previous editions of The Herald indicate that several of the nation's major banking systems have announced prime rate hikes. Consequently, don't be surprised if mortgage interest rates follow suit and perhaps set all time record highs by the end of June.

Population Projections

City Manager Pete Knowles of Sanford is projecting a population on nearly 98,000 people for the city by the year 1998. Knowles says on the basis of present information, including water connections and other utility use, Sanford's current poppulation is just under 21,000 people. By 1975, he predicts, the number of people in Sanford will pass the 23,500 mark, by 1980 it'll hit 32,700, and by 1985 the population will be nearing the 46,000

Of course, Knowles is only taking into consideration population increases which he predicts will occur within the corporate limits

With the development of Heathrow and Greenbelt near Lake Mary, assuming this can be completed within the next 10 years, the 1975 population of the Sanford "market" area—that is the Do You Know About Your Carpet? northern 40 per cent of the land mass of the County plus the Southern Volusia areas of Osteen, DeBary, Deltona and Enterprise-could easily surpass 100,000.

Land Use Legislation

In view of the controversies in Seminole County relative to the land use legislation proposed by the County Commission which would make it mandatory not only for the County but all municipalities within the County to formulate a land use program, it is interesting to note that the federal land use bill, which passed the Senate by a vote of 64 to 21, did not even get to the floor of the House of Representatives. The Rules Committee refused to send the bill to the House floor by a 9-4 vote.

There are now conflicting reports from Washington as to the fate of the land use legislation in the current Congress. The National Association of Realtors played a prominent role







I am one of these people who likes to do business only with people I know personally. Recently, I listed my residence with a broker who is a personnal friend of mine. The listing was submitted, with my approval over my signature, to the Multiple Listing Service in this area. The house was shown by a salesman representing another broker whose office is also a member of the MLS. In the event an offer is made on my property by the prospective buyer, who is supposed to deal with me? The broker who listed the property or the broker whose representative showed the property?-MDW Dear MDW:

According to the by laws of the Multiple Listing Service operated by the Orlando-Winter Park Board of Realtors all negotiations on property submitted to MLS shall be conducted through the listing Realtor. However, there are exceptions. first, the listing Realtor may give the selling Realtor or his office, authority to negotiate directly. Secondly, if the selling Realtor's office cannot contact the listing Realtor the selling Realtor may proceed to submit the offer to the owner of the property. The latter situation could occur in an instance whereby a prospective buyer needed to have his offer presented, for

example, before leaving the area. If you desire any offer to be presented by the listing Realtor in all circumstances we suggest you contact your listing Realtor and advise him of your position. We are certain that he will honor it. Under MLS rules, however, the selling Realtor dows have the



Paul Powell, sales manager at Joe Creamons Chevrolet, Oldsmobile and Cadillac in Sanford, also reports large automobile sales have been picking up in recent weeks.

"They're not back to normal, but they're looking good,"- is his optomistic comment.

"There's going to be a shortage of large cars," he predicts. "The factories are now For a while us.
Southerners were forsaking love affair with big automobiles and smaller ones.

But now there are indications that the rift has been healed, and the public is rushing back to big automobiles dealers to kiss and make up. "Sales of big cars are three times as good today as they were in January," says Ted Endicott, sales manager at Jack Prosser Ford in Sanford. "About 75 per cent of our sales are back hie cars, which is about normal," Endicott "January was extremely slow for big cars," ays Prado. "I suppose only 35 per cent of sales ere big cars; now it's up to 55 per cent.

"I think people were scared of gasoline ationing and were holding off buying big cars are a while. But now the oil embargo seems to be fting they are reverting to the luxury of the urge car, rather than the economy of the small ne." "They're still buying small cars," he adds, but not like three months ago."
Endicott says his large automobile customers ndicate they are after comfort, drivability and afety, and the gas mileage doesn't matter all hat much.

This demand for luxury and safety has been in important factor in the swing back to large automobile purchases at Clark Chrysler-lymouth, Casselberry. "Customers are used to more of a luxury feel n you get in a small car, and they feel more are in a large automobile," explains George Kellogg, president and general manager of rk's. "In addition, people with families need larger models." Kellogg says sales of large automobiles are nitely on the upward swing, and he can see rmal" just around the corner. He says they e still selling a good volume of small cars, ever. Ceasar Prado, new car sales manager at my Bolton Ford in Maitland, says sales of automobiles had picked up considerably in ast month.

'January was extremely slow for big cars; now it' geared to producing smaller models, but the public just is not accepting them."

Bob-Endicott Pontiac-Buick, a big car oriented dealership, is finding sales are a lot stronger today than three months ago.

'Things usually pick up in the spring season, but the easing of the gas shortage had definitely had something to do with our high sales this past month," says sales manager Bill Taylor.

'Our small line is being outsold by the large cars. People who got small cars during the energy crisis are finding they're not as comfortable or safe as the large cars they're used to," says Taylor.

Small car salesmen were reluctant to admit a drop in sales.

'Sales are still fairly steady," says Bill Baker Volkswagen salesman Pete Rich, in Sanford. Burgess, sales-manager at Graffeo Imports, Birmingham, Ala.

Lee Laney, owner of Borough Lincoln-Mercury, Charlotte, N.C., says, "People who have that kind of money (to buy big cars) aren't worried. They figure there will be gas; it'll just cost more."
