TREMENDOUS ADVANCES IN PEST CONTROL SEEM ABOUT READY FOR USE.

The war has brought tremendous advances in pest control and it now seems that the farmer is on the verge of getting benefits from these advances. New remedies found effective for pests both here and in far places, but which were largely taken by the armed forces until the war ended, give promise of being excellent for controlling household and farm pests, in future. Many of the slightly publicized new materials already are on the civilian market.

Farmers have found DDT to be highly effective in controlling flies, mosquitoes, roaches—and other pests, but already have registered experiences which emphasize the necessity for caution in its use. It will kill some beneficial insects as well as harmful ones and it has killed farm animals when improperly applied.

Aerosol bombs, of which more than 16 million have been used during the past three years by the armed forces, also will be available for the control of household insects. They contain insecticides dissolved in a liquefied gas held under pressure in a container. When a valve is opened the sudden change in pressure allows the contained solution to boil violently. The escaping liquid, forced through a small orifice, turns to vapor as it hits the air. This disperses the insecticide as a very fine colloidal suspension in the air, which is quite effective in controlling insects in enclosures or other places where the air is still.

Although Friday will find the Gators in "fair shape" to start against the "Hurricanes," Lieb points out that with the game being played on Friday, Florida hasn't had the advantage of an extra day of rest and practice that Miami has.

The Gators had only from Monday through Wednesday to get in shape for the game, while the Hurricanes had the advantage of Saturday and Sunday to rest up. The Gators entrain for Miami Thursday from Waldo.



RURAL COMMON SENSE

NEW PROCEDURES, NEW PACKAGES AND FASTER MARKETING FOREIGN seem likely to bring more retail packaging of fresh foods, on or near the farm, with a consequent trend away from the handling of fresh fruits, vegetables and meats in bulk and toward the greater use of packages, according to USDA and University of Florida College of Agriculture. New packaging materials, such as V-board, new waterproof lacquers, adhesives and plastic films that helped provision out military forces in far away places—doublets will find application on the postwar home market. Higher standards developed just before the war and proven at the Florida Experiment Station, offer promise of widespread use as supplies of rubber again become adequate.

And the growth of self-service stores will call for more packaging of farm products, while the expanding use of fresh frozen fruits and vegetables in packages may create a stronger influence toward the storing of fresh produce in bulk. Of course, packaging of foods now sold in bulk may cost more elsewhere along the line to market, but the economists see considerable saving, too. They say packaging nearer the farm will save handling extra bulk and give more protection against pilfering, loss of weight from evaporation and from bruising and soiling up by customer sorting. It may save food value by keeping the stuff fresh longer and give the consumer the satisfaction of buying a product ready for cooking without having to prepare it or sort it out.

The effect of increased use of frozen fruits and vegetables on those areas which now make a specialty of producing fresh vegetables and fruits for the winter market remains to be seen. The frozen products may expand the market, or they may compete with the higher-cost fresh vegetables.

Concentrates seem destined to play an increasingly important role in the marketing of fruit juices, particularly. Canning already is an important industry in the field.

That faster transportation will come in the next few years seems a certainty. The air lines are making plans to haul perishable produce quickly to market, and the railroads are planning lighter, more satisfactory cars

and faster schedules. Farmers will continue their efforts to have the price spread between producer and consumer reduced, with more efficiency in the handling of their products on the way to market.

Large Sugar Cane Crop Is Foreseen

CLEWISTON, Fla., Oct. 22 (Special)—Largest sugar cane crop in the Florida Everglades in recent years will provide a sugar-short nation with one month's supply for every person in the United States according to indications here as the 1945-46 harvesting season opened today.

Clarence R. Bittins, president of the United States Sugar Corp., largest single-cane producer on the continent, said, "Only the September hurricane kept the crop from setting an all-time record from the Everglades. Present

indications are that we will have a much larger crop than any in recent years."

Harvesting of the cane will start simultaneously today on the company's 12 plantations, which extend some 52 miles around the southern shores of Lake Okechobee. The cut cane will move to the sugar house, where grinding operations begin tomorrow morning, continuing 24 hours a day until the close of the harvest.

Approximately 30,000 acres of cane will be available for grinding, and the company also will grind cane for independent growers in this area. In addition to raw sugar, the crop will provide

upwards of five million gallons of blackstrap molasses.

Sufficient labor to conduct the harvest is available, but the major portion is imported, and the company is anxious to use all the domestic labor it can secure. Bittins reported, German war prisoners, who were formerly employed in field cultivation work, have been transferred from the area.

"Condition of the cane crop, despite the hurricane, is good, and we have been able to improve cultivations of the fields because of a better labor supply during the cultivation season," Bittins said.
