

Secret Service Official Says Agency Is Over-Extended

MIAMI (AP) - The Secret Service, faced with two attacks on President Ford and one on presidential candidate Ronald Reagan within three months, is "overextended" by the current large field of presidential candidates, says a top service official.

"It's going to get worse, and there are more candidates on the way," said Bob Newbrand, special agent in charge of the Secret Service office in Miami following the attack Thursday on Reagan by a young man wielding a toy gun. Newbrand said that the service was augmented by agents from U.S. customs and other federal agencies, but "we're very thin right now."

Fromme Makes Appearance

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) - Lynette Fromme has made her longest courtroom appearance in two weeks, but there are signs she will continue to boycott her trial on charges of attempting to kill President Ford while the defense presents her case. Miss Fromme showed up unexpectedly Thursday

during a hearing with the jury absent. She sat quietly for nearly an hour as attorneys argued about a defense move to call a prosecutor as a witness. But she returned to her cell when the jurors were called back for a brief closed-door meeting with the judge, an indication she is maintaining her refusal to take part in the

NYC Tax Hike Imminent

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) - The state legislature appears ready to enact a \$200 million New York City tax increase package - including a 10 per cent hike in city residents' income taxes - which it believes necessary to get President Ford's approval for federal help to permanently rescue the city from default. State officials also said late Thursday they are "very near" completing a \$150 million financial arrangement to

help the city avert a possible default next week. The city survived a near brush with default on Thursday, when the state's Municipal Assistance Corp. scraped together \$100 million and rushed it to the city treasury to help meet a \$127 million payroll.



Test Of Detente Appears Imminent

When President Ford announced the departure of three key administration executives in the socalled "Sunday morning massacre," the first shoe fell in the United States of America. Americans will be analyzing what happened and why for many

The second shoe fell abroad. From Peking to Paris and from Moscow to Manila, allies and enemies are sifting through nuances to determine whether there is a new U.S. policy toward detente and, if so, how it affects them.

The concern centers around the dismissal of Secretary of Defense James Schlesinger and the selection of Donald Rumsfeld to succeed him.

Mr. Schlesinger is a known quality, brilliant forceful and a person with profound convictions about the need for a superior defense establishment. Cautious about detente, Mr. Schlesinger deals in specifics - numbers of weapons and their destructive power.

Mr. Rumsfeld also is brilliant and forceful, but in spite of his long tenure as a public servant nobody is certain exactly where he stands on detente. A conviction is growing that he may not be able to provide the necessary counterforce to Secretary of State Henry Kissinger who is the architect of the grand design and the spearpoint of accommodation with the Communists.

Members of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization have expressed regret at the imminent departure of Mr. Schlesinger, whom they consider a known quality and staunch friend, as did South Korea and Israel. For the most part our allies are willing to accept President Ford's word that he believes in a strong defense and to follow the lead of the U.S.

Their long-range assessments will be guided by the short-range behavior of the Soviet Union and Communist China.

If the Soviet Union is tempted to test the will of the United States during the transitional period in the U. S. Department of Defense, Europeans as well as Americans will have new evidence of Soviet tactics. If the Soviet Union mistakes the changing of the Defense Department guard as a softer U.S. attitude toward detente and seeks to rush through a treaty advantageous to Moscow, that, too, will tell us something.

China also will be watching the unfolding drama in the United States with microscopic interest. If Peking sees a softening U. S. attitude toward detente, President Ford will encounter a cool diplomatic climate in Peking after Thanksgiving. China would like to see the United States return to the depths of the cold war with Russia and undoubtedly is nervous about the possibility of a softer U.S. attitude toward Russia, or smaller U. S. defense budgets.

Against this backdrop, it is plain that President Ford has to make it abundantly clear in the immediate weeks ahead that the U.S. concept of detente is unchanged-that a strong defense is an essential element in our peaceful intentions.

On Secrecy


The Senate vote to open up its committee meetings to the public was not unexpected. Lawmakers in post-Watergate Washington are loath to endorse secrecy. Even so, the 85-0 tally in favor of the so-called "sunshine"

legislation is a paradox. Shortly before the decisive vote, 16 senators had participated in a lastditch effort to scuttle the open-meetings bill by voting for a proposal that would have retained traditional procedures intact.

The resistance was not strong enough, apparently, to support a recorded vote against sunshine. Other measures, approved and pending, will allow public

scrutiny of House-Senate conferences called to work out differences in bills passed in each chamber and of the procedures of most federal agencies, boards and commissions. The lawmakers may not yet be convinced themselves that

secrecy is all bad, but they have acknowledged that in the public's mind, business conducted in dark corners behind locked doors must be regarded with suspicion.

Guerrillas Kill Three

Israelis On Golan Heights

TEL AVIV, Israel (AP) - Arab guerrillas from Syria attacked an Israeli settlement on the occupied Golan Heights and escaped after killing three 19-year-old army sergeants studying at a religious school, the Israeli military command reported today.

Another Bible student was wounded with a hatchet. The Israeli military command said the raiders slipped through the United Nations buffer zone between Israeli and Syrian forces and told one of their victims they were fighters for Al Fatah, the Palestine guerrilla group headed by Yasir Arafat, the chief of the Palestine Liberation Organization.

But in Beirut, the Marxist Popular Democratic Front for the Liberation of Palestine claimed responsibility for the attack and said the guerrillas were "interior forces," from inside Israel.

Spaniards View Franco

MADRID, Spain (AP) - Spaniards began streaming past the body of Generalissimo Francisco Franco today as the police throughout Spain stepped up precautions against terrorist attacks. But the nation was quiet in the wake of the death of the 82-year-old dictator who had ruled it for 36 years.

The open coffin was placed in the Hall of Columns in the 18th century National Palace in Madrid to lie in state for two days. Hundreds were waiting when the doors opened

Canadian Postmen On Strike OTTAWA, Canada (AP) - Many Canadians face the

Tests Pollute Atmosphere

WASHINGTON (AP) - Two of Russia's recent big underground nuclear tests apparently have spewed some radioactive debris into the atmosphere, U.S. intelligence sources report.

Radioactive gaseous debris was collected outside Russia's territory following a 3.8-megaton test on Oct. 18 and a two-megaton blast on Oct. 21, sources said. A megaton is the equivalent of one million tons of TNT.

Rudd In Cuban Jail

CHICAGO (AP) - Mark Rudd, former Weather Underground leader, is reportedly in a special camp for rehabilitation in Cuba.

Attorney Luis Kutner, who specializes in international law, said he was contacted by friends of Rudd who said the former Columbia University student was being held in a camp in Pinar del Rio, a province southwest of Havana, on unspecified charges.

Kutner said he has written to the ministry of prisons in Havana to find out if and why Rudd is being detained. Rudd of Maplewood, N.J., led a 1968 student revolt at Columbia and played a key role in organizing the Weatherman faction of the SDS.

Cooperation Possible

HOUSTON (AP) - Prof. Konstantin D. Bushuyev, Russian technical director of the first manned international space mission, says the mission confirms international cooperation is possible and valuable.

"For the public, the docking and technical matters were not so important as showing that two great nations can cooperate," Bushuyev said. He and Glynn S. Lunney, U.S. technical director of the Apollo-Soyuz Test Project, held a news conference Thursday.

Lunney said the U.S. plans no joint flight until the space nuttle program is ready in 1900. We have decided to put our time, attention and money in the shuttle program, then continue joint flights," he said.
