

reported early today. Hawkins had a bare majority margin of only 61 votes. She needs only one vote over 50 percent to avoid confronting Frey in the runoff.

The two staged a bitter intraparty war in the 1978 governor's race in which Jack Eckerd, with Mrs. Hawkins as his lieutenant governor candidate, defeated Frey for the nomination. The Democratic runoff four weeks hence will be a replay of the bitter second primary in 1974 in which Stone beat Gunter by only 10,600 votes after running second in the first primary. 

Adm. Zumwalt Says Carter Damaged National Security

WASHINGTON (UPI) - To blunt criticism of his defense policies, President Carter personally made a political decision to make public top secret plans for the "stealth" aircraft that can evade radar detection. retired Adm. Elmo Zumwalt charged in letter to be

Zumwalt, the former chief of naval operations, said the disclosure of the weapons breakthrough was "unbelievably harmful to the national security" because it gave the Soviet Union "a five-year head start" to begin developing a counter technology. The retired admiral said Carter ordered the stealth program revealed to diffuse criticism for the

president's decision to cancel the B-1 strategic bom-Zumwalt made the charges in a letter obtained by United Press International. The letter is to be released at a Capitol Hill news conference by Sen. Richard

Iran Spurns Muskie Letter

By United Press International Iran's hard-line Prime Minister Mohammad Ali Rajai said there would be no deals on the 52 American hostages and drew roars of "Death to America" from a crowd in Qom by publicly spurning a message from

Secretary of State Edmund Muskie. In other developments, fierce clashes on the Iran-Iraq border continued Tuesday night with Iran claiming to have shot down two Iraqi MiG fighters. Tehran Radio also reported seven executions at dawn today for treason and corruption.

Polish Chief Courts Labor

WARSAW, Poland (UPI) — New Communist Party eader Standaw Kania visited a hotbed of labor unrest and promised to respect workers' demands. But Poland's main dissident group that supported the summer's mass strike came under sharp press attack. Kania, who replaced Edward Gierek as party chief after the settlement of the 18-day walkout at the Gdansk shipyards, told party officials in the southern industrial city of Katowice Tuesday mismanagement had led to the crippling wave of summer strikes.

Economist To Lead China

I'EKING (UPI) - China's parliament accepted the master economist Zhao Ziyang as head of a new streamlined government in the most extensive reshuffle since the Communists seized power 31 years

In addition to the Hua-Zhao switch, the National People's Congress, ending the most important meeting in its history, accepted the resignations of six of the country's 18 vice premiers and the dismissal of a seventh. It then hamed three new men to replace them in a slim-look Cabinet to guide the country through the

Libya, Syria Merge

DAMASCUS, Syria (UPI) - Libya and Syria today announced their merger into a single Arab state - a sprawling entity separated by their two implacable

"We announce the merger of our two countries in political, economic, military, cultural and all other fields," the state-run Damascus radio said in announcing what was called the Tripoli Declaration.

It would appear the problem with animals, more specifically dogs running at-large, is not with animals, but with people.

And if the Seminole County Animal Control Board has its way, before this year is up the people problem will be attacked directly.

Seminole County's current "leash law" is too weak to provide animal control officers with enough meat to attack the growing problem of dogs running loose, annoying neighbors and in many cases biting children and adults.



Ukraine Highway Offers A Strange Slice Of Russia

CHOP, U.S.S.R.(UPI) - The long drive from Moscow to Roadside militiamen are warned of approaching foreigners Hungary at haying time slices through a Russia far removed from cosmonauts and sports spectaculars. It is more like a journey back in time.

The 300-mile stretch from Kiev to Lvov cuts through the neart of the Ukraine, breadbasket of the Soviet Union. Scores of horse-drawn carts, empty or laden with fresh hay, plod along the narrow highway that, with truck traffic on the in-crease, workmen halfheartedly are trying to turn into a

> Travel by car is still rare on Soviet highways, except maybe from Moscow north to Leningrad. Soviet roads simply can't cope with heavy traffic.

From Moscow southwest to Kiev the road is flat, straight and - at dusk - incredibly dangerous. Long stretches are without roadsigns, safety reflectors or even lane stripes. Most Soviet drivers turn on no lights until well past sunset; then only parking lights come on. Anyone violating this unwritten law is met with furious high-and lowbeam flashes from oncoming

Rusty trucks belching black smoke ply the highway between these two major Soviet capitals alongside mammoth, Russianbuilt Karnaz long-haulers. Few drivers pull to the right on the slow climb up a hill - or bother with night lights or reflectors when they park on the shoulder to sleep.

Even under the best conditions, the 500-mile drive from Moscow to Kiev is an 11-hour ordeal. Three Americans recently added two hours by leaving Moscow on a road called the Kiev Highway. It is only for Soviet drivers. A militiaman on the edge of Moscow brought home the

message with a blast on his whistle as the foreigners' car whizzed by. Back in Moscow, three more officers gave dif-Foreigners traveling by car must first clear their routes and arrival times with the foreign ministry. Cars owned by non-Soviet drivers carry white plates for easy spotting among the

There are too many roadside police stations to count along the 1,000-mile route to Chop on the Hungarian border, but it

must be close to 75.

and wait patiently to report the event to headquarters. The Kiev road shows a side of Soviet life never seen in the Soviet press. Babushkas with scarves drawn tight sit along the asphalt road selling berries or cucumbers from rusty buckets." Battered cars and smoky trucks dart among the horse-drawn

Old farmers, unshaven and toothless, work every scrap of roadside with scythes. Workers stay in the fields until sundown, gathering hay with pitchforks into slender stacks topped with plastic sheets to deflect the rain.

Just across the border hay is in neatly stacked bales. In Hungary much of the work is done with baling equipment.

Beside the multi-lane highway being built from Kiev to the Polish border are roadside cafes named "Koop" where a mixture of rice and meat is ladled out to hungry truckers and a

Gasoline stations are choked with long lines of trucks and cars, but two or three pumps are reserved for foreign tourists who can buy the better grade gasoline with coupons. The restrooms out behind are best left undescribed.

Soviet officials respond harshly to tourists snapping shots of horse carts or wooden huts. In Chop itself, a customs check reveals Soviet sensitivity, if not paranoia. Cars are examined over a grill-covered pit by customs workers searching for icons, dissident literature or unauthor-

ized letters. Workmen with screwdrivers dismantle seats and probe inside the doors. They dig through luggage and feel along hemlines. A box of tea is taken off to be x-rayed. Personal letters are read and

cameras are opened. A darkhaired woman named Alexandrova questions travelers to catch them in contradictions. A roll of color film is confiscated and returned half an hour later - developed, although poorly. "We have to make sure you don't have anything that would

make our country look bad," Alexandrova explains. Then it's back on the road, over a silver bridge and across the border to Hungary - only three hours to a hot bath in Budapest, miles if not decades away.
