D. Roosevelt, began work on the declaration in 1946. It was completed by the Social Committee here after nearly two months of word-by-word examination.
The declaration provides an unprecedented meeting place for the thoughts and ideas of dozens of different peoples, religions and governments. It combines principles of the constitutions of Soviet Russia, the United States, England and France. Civilizations and cultures of the Orient and the West find expression in the lists of rights.
It is hailed by U.N. officials as "one of the great landmarks of civilization," though it will have only moral authority, at least at first. It proclaims a "common standard of achievement for all peoples of all nations" and calls for a "new organ of society" to recognize and observe the rights.
A human rights covenant, legal in binding all signatory nations, is to be drawn up before next year's U.N. assembly. Under its provisions all signatory nations would agree to imposition of sanctions in case of violation of the rights.
Measures to enforce observance of the rights also are to be drafted. Proposals for enforcement include creation of an international tribunal empowered to give binding decisions and establish a code of law. The general assembly would, if necessary, implement the tribunal's decisions.

Under the Bernadotte Plan, Jews would be taken from the West Bank and they would receive West Bank in its stead. The original U.N. partition plan gives the West Bank to the Jews and Western Galilee to the Arabs.
As the Political Committee debated Palestine's political issues, the Security Council's committee on Palestine scheduled a meeting for 5:00 P.M. today. A U.N. source said the committee would meet with Ralph J. Bunche, acting Palestine mediator, progress made to date in carrying out the council's Nov. 29 resolution.
That resolution ordered the withdrawal of combat troops in the Negev to positions they held prior to the outbreak of hostilities.

Two weeks of round the clock detecting work resulted today in the arrest of a 22 year old man police accused of participating in a \$20,000 Pennsylvania holdup and the subsequent slaying of his companion in crime.
The slaying began Nov. 10 when Daniel Lambert, wealthy race horse owner, was held up and robbed of \$20,000 in cash and securities in his Altoona, Pa., home, including ten \$100 bills he had hidden in his vest.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26—(AP)—The National Negro Council today charged that 2,000,000 negroes were denied the right to vote in five southern states this year and asked a Senate investigation.
Edgar G. Brown, director of the council, presented petitions for the investigation at the office of senator Jenner (R-Ind.), chairman of the Senate privileges and elections subcommittee. Jenner was out of the city but office assistants said the request is under consideration.
Brown asked the public hearings be conducted at Birmingham, Ala.; Jackson, Miss.; New Orleans, La.; Atlanta, Ga.; and Columbia, S. C.
