
between that explosion and the atomic explosion as there is be-tween a pea-shooter and a conventional artillery shot.

We were approximately 7 miles away from the place where the shell expladed, which, incidentally. was a bull's-eye and a real credit to the boys who simed the gun. We had to wear glasses that were so dark we could hardly see the sun through them. Even with these glasses we were almost blinded with the light from the explosion. Our first sensation was of tremendous light and heat. Then in 29 seconds the sound and plast hit us at the same time. From the distance of 7 miles there was still enough shock to knock your hat off and maybe knock you over if you weren't expecting it.

After the explosion was over we waited about three hours and went into the area where the shell

The department said a seventh man was indicted on charges of making false statements in an application for a job at the Orlando, Fla., air base. All seven were residents of Or-

ange County, Florida, where a series of violences occurred in 1949 and 1950.

The grand jury began hearing testimony in October, 1952, and indicted four persons last Decembor, charging one with perjury and the other three with making false statements.

The Justice Department said the investigation is continuing-
