





Yet there have been times when we have, prodded by sad experience, pointed out that there is, in fact, no such thing as "off the record" when more · than one person is listening.


Will all present hold their tongues? Will there be no further discussion about their veiled topic elsewhere? Can it be logically expected that everyone who is present will surely make what he hears a prisoner in his mind?

. We are reminded of one-time President Cal-vin Coolidge — "Silent Cal" — whose Vermont bred common sense is given as the basis of his description of an effective committee: "Three's enough-two of them out sick!"

What spurred this comment comes not only from personal experience but from a recent article in the LaGrange (Ga.) Daily News by Alan Thomas of the LaGrange College News Service. He referred to meetings where "public figures ... addressing audiences had requested members of the press to "put away their notebooks"."


But to his credit-enough credit, we think, to merit his election-he does speak the truth.







# Chicken

BY CECILY BROWNSTONE Ameriated Press Food Editor Chicken breasts and seedless green grapes make a lovely dish that's just right for company. You can prepare this dish in advance, if you like, and reheat the chicken breasts in the sauce. But if you do this, add the grapes during the last few minutes of the reheating.

Another hint about the making: If the chicken breasts have free pieces of fat on the underside, use a kitchen scissors or a sharp knife to cut away the fat a before you flour the chicken. What do you serve with this good dish? Well, the sauce is made from chicken broth and light cream plus a touch of cury powder, so you'll find that rice is a perfect accompaniment. Any green vegetable will be another fine addition, or you

can settle for just a salad. An excellent choice for the salad would be a combination of crisp greens and marinated artichoke hearts. The artichokes come in 6-ounce jars and are dressed with oil, vinegar, salt and spices. The marinade makes a perfect salad dressing. after adding extra olive oil and wine vinegar along with salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste. And another tip: the artichoke hearts come quartered. but they should be halved again se that they mix well with the

briefly; long chilling won't do the crust or the meringue any Another tip: when the custard-type mixture is cooked, it has to be both stirred and boiled for a matter of minutes. Stir slowly, in the form of a figure eight; this way you can watch the boiling and time it.

When adding the meringue, spoon part of it fully around the 9 edge of the filling, then spread 5 it out to touch the inner edges of the crust all the way around. Heap the rest of the meringue in the center and push it out to
