Pilots to fight flight restrictions at airport

SANLORD On April 7, the Sanford Airport Authority met to consider adoption of a policy regulating touch and go flight training activities during peak traffic periods at the airport. Now, the 340 000 member Africalt Owners and Pilots Association JAOPAI has announced it will light the plan calling it a violation of federal law-

The Authority is considering limiting certain general aviation flight activities including flight training between 1 p.m. and 6 p.m. on Thursdays I ridays and Saturdays the times which coincide with the airport's eight foreign charter

fludits per day the Authority is also considering establishing

'No-Fly Zones' within four indes of the airport. supposedly designed to reduce delays and adverse operating effects on airline traffic

There are no studies or data which demonstrate safety or operational problems for the few air carrier charter flights using the Sanford Airport," said Bill Donn, AOPA vice president for regional allairs. 'Airline traffic accounts for only 0.3 percent of total operations

In 1997, the AOPA figures for general aviation including flight training, accounted for 344,000 takeoffs and landings at Sanford, while there were only 4,800 air earrier operations that year. an average of 13 per day.

An autopsy should be completed on Lopez today by the Seminole County Medical Examiner. School officials said that Lopez had no prior records of serious medical problems. There were also tests being done to see if any drugs or alcohol were involved.

Lopez was noticed having trouble at 8:30 a.m. An athletic trainer Was brought over by Lopez's teacher to help revive the teen but to no avail.

Bernardo Lopez had a half-brother who died while lifting weights. Winter Springs police are now trying to ascertain whether there is a link between the two deaths.

OVIEDO - Major development is once again proposed for the City of Oviedo. The matter was previously brought up for consideration before the Oviedo City Council but has drawn controversy.

If approved, it would be one of the largest residential developments proposed in years.

Under consideration is a development agreement and conceptual development plan for Live Oak Reserve PUD. It consists of 1,041 acres on the south side of CR-419, (Greeneway), and 700 feet east of Twin Rivers Boulevard.

The development is being planned by Stanford Development Group, Inc., which has announced the possibility of 2,000 homes on the property.

The proposal was presented for consideration during the previous City Council meeting on April 6, but was tabled following extensive discussion. much of which focused on pos-

sible problems the development may cause harm to the environment.

There was controversy as a result of the earlier meeting on Live Oak Reserve. After hearing from the public, the council closed the public hearing and allowed the developers time for rebuttal. When members of the Picase See Oviedo, Page 3A





Is psoriasis contagious?

DEAR DR. GOTT. My husband, at age 77, developed psoriasis on the palms of his hands, according to his family doctor. The skin dries, peels and cracks. Can I eatch this from

DEAR READER: First of all, his skin disorder doesn't sound like psoriasis, which does not commonly affect the palms and does not ordinarily appear suddenly in the elderly Moreover, psoriasis usually doesn't crack and peel, rather, it appears as a chronic, inflamed, scaly series of patches, often on the elbows and trunk. In any case, psoriasis is not

What does your husband have? There are several possibilities, ranging from eezema and acute skin allergies to a fungus infection, which can be spread from person to person. In addition, drug reactions to common prescription medicines can cause such skin problems.

In my opinion, your husband should be examined by a dermatologist, who can diagnose the disorder and suggest appropriate therapy.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My husband had terminal lung cancer and was given regular morphine injections at the end. Did the drug accelerate his death or was it given for pain?

DEAR READER: Based on the sparse information you supplied. I cannot say. Ordinarily, morphine is administered to dying patients to relieve discomfort. This is entirely appropriate and ethical. Most responsible physicians would not use morphine simply to hasten death.

To a large extent, the issue you raise depends on one's perspective. Is a doctor saving life or prolonging death1

In a terminally ill, suffering patient. prolonging death — using intravenous feedings, assisted ventilation and dialysis — is inhumane But, heaven knows, this approach is too often the

Under other circumstances, salvaging a life is paramount - for example, following an accident, surgery or an acute illness from which survival is likely.

In your husband's case, the doctors were probably correct in deciding to make him comfortable and allowing him to die with as little pain as possible, even though modern technology DR. GOTT PETER GOTT, M.D.

would have permitted them to keep him alive indefinitely. Perhaps all we can hope for is a doctor who, when the end is near, has the knowledge, compassion and experience to recognize that prolonging death is cruel and inappropriate.

WIN AT BRIDGE

Winner or loser?

By Phillip Alder

If you wish to be a winner at bridge and who doesn't? — you must track losers, especially when playing in a suit contract. After the dummy comes down, count all your losers (and your winners, if you can do so without taking a week or two. If your loser count is not more than you can afford, that is a good indication to draw trumps as quickly as possible. But if you have too many losers, you must do something about the extras-

For example, consider this fourspade contract. West leads the heart queen in answer to his partner's opening bid. How would you proceed?

There is a temptation for North to push toward three no-trump, but that contract is always in danger when you have several aces to dislodge. Here,


three no trump goes two down. In four spades, there are three aces

missing, so you'd better avoid losing a heart trick. And you must take preventive measures now. Win the first trick in hand and play a diamond, driving out the ace. Win the next heart in the West dummy and discard your heart loser on the third diamond. If that has | Q 3 passed off safely, lead a trump, With this layout, you can ruff East's heart \$6.2 return, draw trumps, and concede a trick - your third loser - to the club

Note that if you win trick one in the dummy, East can defeat you by ducking the first diamond, taking the second, and returning a heart, stranding you in hand.

To get rid of a loser, normally you either ruff that loser in the shorter trump hand (usually the dummy) or discard it on a winner in the other
