The meeting tomorrow, in the Commissioners Room of the court house, should be an opportunity for citizens to be heard. This is the crucial meeting of the year. The 17-02 project could either become a reality at tomorrow's meeting or it could become a complete failure.

Whether or not you want 17-92 fourlaned, widened, and paved should be a sublect on which you give your own personal approval and have your own say at the public meeting of the County Commissioners. Unless you do give your personal views, wishes, and approval, the commissioners are left to use their own discretion in carrying ent road and paving plans for your communfty.

Each individual in Seminole County is personally concerned with the four-laning of 17-92. One of the two most important projects in the Fifth District, according to Road Board Member William Dial of Orlando, it can control the economy of our various communities in the county.
