The Seminole County Board of County Commissioners meets today in regular session.
On the agenda are issues concerning hardscaping paving option for sections in the U.S. Highway 17-92 Fern Park improvement area, a joint planning agreement with Oviedo, participation in a project that would bring a community swimming pool to the Sanford area, an update on proceedings for the Battle Ridge development dispute with Winter Springs.

Florida Lottery officials announced eight tickets matching all five numbers in Friday night's FANTASY 5 drawing. According to lottery computer records one of the winning tickets was sold in Casselberry. Each ticket holder will receive a cash prize of \$38,999.40.

The Seminole Community College Faculty Art Exhibit is on display at the Fine Arts Gallery in Building O on the college's main campus in Sanford until Dec. 13.

A group of Seminole Community College students and staff completed a mural Tuesday for a room in the Rescue Outreach Mission in Sanford, an impressionist landscape depicting the St. Johns River.

Five art students and one faculty member worked on the mural. The students are Ruthann Jammal, Kris Garcia, Kris Chatterton, Laura Schneiderman, and Scott Horne. Faculty member Jere Moore also worked on the mural.

The paint for the mural was donated by local businesses.

Wrong inmate released from jail

SEMINOLE COUNTY - The Seminole County Sheriff's Office is searching for an inmate who was inadvertently released from the John E. Pulk Correctional Facility on Oct. 29.

Carlos Lopez, 22, was being held in protective custody for Orange County on a charge of accessory to murder after the fact. During a court appearance on Oct. 22, Lopez was erroneously charged with possession of cocaine.

Deputies discovered Lopez missing when Orange County investigators visited the Seminole County jail to interview the suspect. Seminole County Sheriff's Office spokeswoman Deanna Brown said.

"Every effort is being made to take Lopez back into custody," Brown said.

On Oct. 29, Judge Frederick Hill dismissed the possession charges when it was determined they belonged to a different Carlos Lopez. The Orange County hold order was overlooked when Lopez was considered for discharge by correctional facility staff, passed through processing, and released.

"The hold should not have been overlooked," John E. Pulk Correctional Facility Director Greg Futch said. "We're taking a look at the whole event. There were some human errors. We're examining the procedural process to see if any reforms need to be made. This is not only our problem, now the sheriff's office needs to track him down."

Lopez was being held in protective custody by Seminole County because Orange County prison officials were concerned for his safety.

Environmental groups say plan violates state law

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Three environmental groups are boycotting a meeting with county staff and government agencies on Friday at the Sylvan Lake Park to discuss design standards for development within the Wekiva Protection Area.

Members from the Florida Audubon Society, the Central Florida Sierra Club, and Friends of the Wekiva River are boycotting the meeting because they say the proposed development violates state law.

Florida Audubon Senior Vice President Charles Lee said the premise of the meeting would be to discuss the design of a

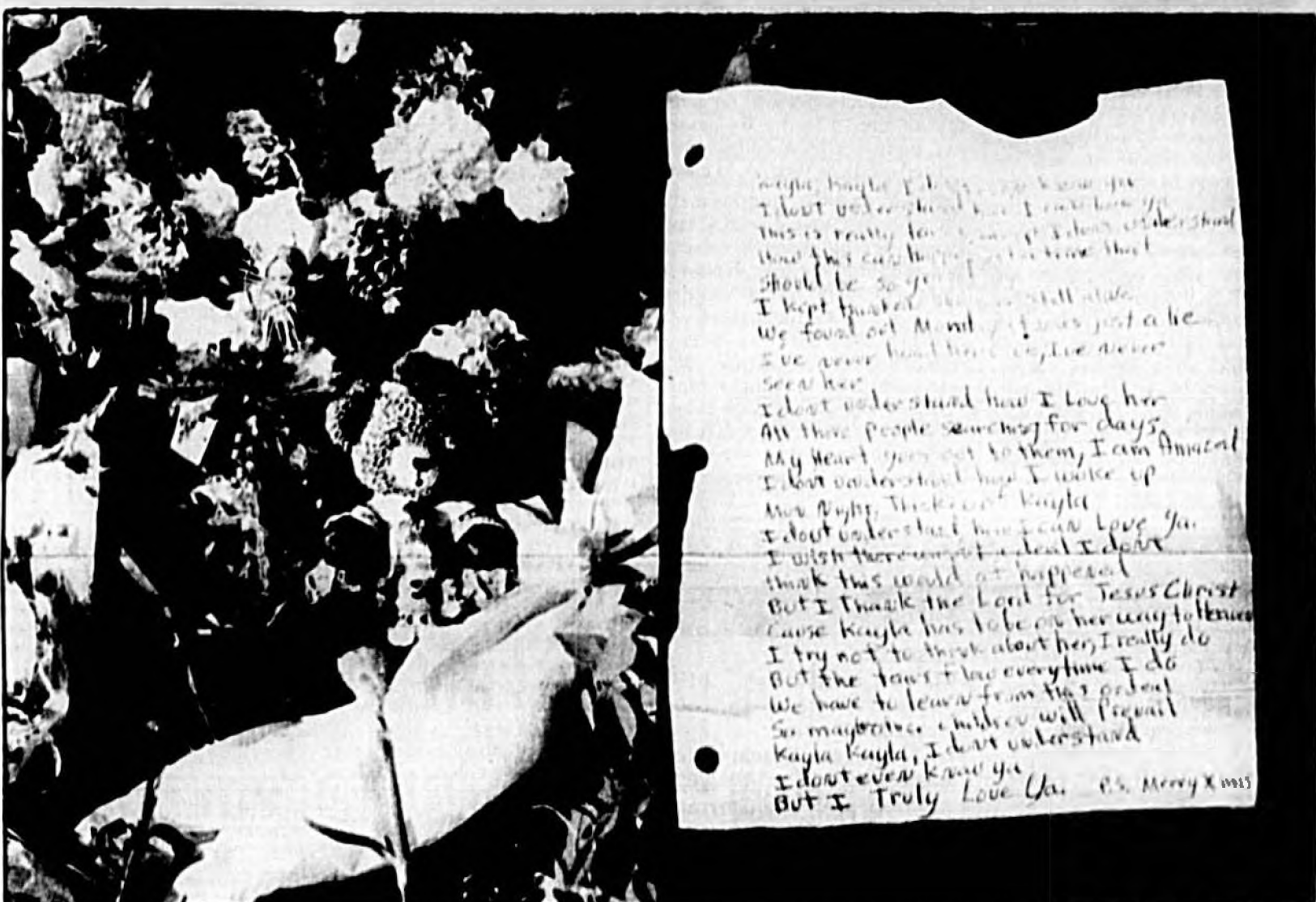
prototype Planned Urban Development with densities of 2-3 units per acre in the Wekiva Protection Area. These densities would violate the 1988 Wekiva Protection Act, which requires the area to remain rural, Lee said.

"We will not take part in a meeting whose fundamental purpose is to create a premise

that attempts to justify or excuse actions by the county that violate the laws of the State of Florida," Lee said. "We would have no problem taking part in a meeting, so long as the premise of the meeting is within state law."

Sanford Boys and Girls Club will get facelift

County has full plate for last meeting of the year

SEMINOLE COUNTY - The first time the new Seminole County Board met, all was civil and kind. "One down and who knows how many to go," Commission Chairman Carlton Henley said.

Today, the board has a triple header - morning, afternoon and evening sessions which constitute the last meeting of 1998. The next meeting won't occur until Jan. 11, 1999.

Today's full agenda includes a hardscaping project by the engineering division for U.S. Highway 17-92, a 5-year extension of the solid waste residential hauling franchise contracts, a D.A.R.E. agreement with the sheriff and county schools, the acquisition of Katie's Landing (not to exceed \$700,000) and a settlement to the Battle Ridge issue between Oviedo and Winter Springs.

Jerry McCollum, the county engineer, said that the proposed hardscaping project is a continuation of the current effort by the county to jump start the CRA activities in the Fern Park area. It includes design and construction of entrance features, mast arm signals, sidewalks, bus stops and landscaping.

The Commission is expected to approve and authorize a School Facility Joint Use Agreement among the City of Sanford, Seminole County

School Board and the Seminole County Government for a Seminole Community Swimming Pool. The School Board is donating 4.31 acres of land at the Seminole High School to build the facility.

The City of Sanford will be responsible for construction of the facility. On or before Dec. 1 of each year, the city will provide the School Board and the County a written report regarding the use of the facility. The city also will operate and maintain the facility.

Another item up for approval by the BCC is a 1988/99 Community Service Agency Agreement for a Child Protection team. This plan provides medically-based diagnostic services for child abuse and neglect cases through referrals by all law enforcement agencies and the Department of Children and Families.

The services include physical and sexual abuse examinations, forensic interviews, documentation, 24-hour telephone consultation and expert witness testimony. The total cost of the Community Service Agency Agreement and Child Protection Team is \$1,106,126.

At the 7 p.m. public hearings, the BCC will discuss plans for the Heathrow International Business Center on property located south of County Road 46A and west of International Parkway.

Pearl Harbor 57 years later

Most of those who visit the U.S.S. Arizona shrine at Pearl Harbor daily were not born when the great battleship was sunk by the Japanese 57 years ago.

And who could have imagined what has occurred since the disastrous attack on the U.S. Naval base on Dec. 7, 1941.

America declared war the following day - a World War waged in both Europe and the Pacific. A war that did not end until the U.S. had dropped A-bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki.

Today, millions of Americans drive automobiles made in Japan and buy an assortment of other products from that country. Major-League baseball players use Japanese gloves. Japanese players like Hideo Nomo are millionaire players in America. An American All Star team has just visited Japan this winter.

Men have walked on the moon, found a cure for polio, surfed the Internet, run sub-4-minute miles, and hit 70 home runs in one season - and been joined by women on U.S. warships since the attack at Pearl Harbor. The U.S. has even elected a president who wasn't born until five years after Pearl Harbor.

Former Japanese military men who fought against America say they are ashamed of what happened at Pearl Harbor and the atrocities such as the Bataan Death March. A few years ago, one of the pilots who led the attack on Pearl Harbor was interviewed by ABC-TV and said he had no regrets. He considered the sneak attack a great victory.

As the years go by, there are fewer U.S. veterans left to tell of the horrors of Dec. 7, 1941 when 200 Japanese fighter planes zeroed in on a sleeping target. The attack began at three minutes before eight on a Sunday morning - a day for church, a day for recreation. And for 3,000, a day to die.

Henry Lachenmayer, 79, was a musician second classman about the U.S.S. Pennsylvania. He had the presence of mind to stow his trombone before heeding the frantic call to battle stations.

"I'm proud to say that our ship was the first in action and that we accounted for not less than eight enemy planes," Lachenmayer wrote in his Pearl Harbor diary. "No one could imagine what happened in this most horrid of nightmares."

The Japanese attack, Lachenmayer said, came so suddenly that those on the ships in the harbor could offer only the slightest - yet brave - resistance.

The Arizona split in half after she took two bomb hits amidships. Directly forward of her, the U.S.S. Oklahoma capsized. The U.S.S. Nevada tried to reach the open sea but was torpedoed.

Men died instantly, and those badly burned screamed for relief of their pain. A Marine lieutenant had both legs blown off. Medics carried off those they could locate.

Japanese pilots continued the pillage for an hour. The U.S. battleships were moored so close to one another that the Japanese could aim at one and hit another.

President Franklin Roosevelt said Dec. 7, 1941 was "a date that would live in infamy." War was declared the next day. Miraculously, the Pacific Fleet was rebuilt and America stole the advantage from the over-confident Japanese in the Pacific.

Christmas cactus ideal for the holidays

The Christmas Cactus, contrary to what you may expect, is native to the rain forests, where it can be found hanging on trees. Its pendulous growth makes it ideal for hanging baskets. The plant does not have leaves but flattened, jointed, green stems that look like leaves with pointed lobes, claw-like in appearance. Because the stem segments resemble crab's legs, the Christmas Cactus is sometimes called Crab Cactus. The flowers are very striking and borne at the tip of the stems. Color varies from white through orange to blue. The fruit is rare but when present it is a red berry.

Culture: Even though this plant is an epiphyte, like many orchids and bromeliads, in Florida it is grown in media containing organic matter. A mixture of perlite and peat moss is often used to grow this plant. The plants should be watered regularly, but avoid excessive watering. Plants grown in pots need good drainage. Watering is very important during bud and flower formation, too little or too much water will cause the

plants to drop their flowers. Plants are usually fertilized every month with a diluted water-soluble fertilizer. Keep plants quite dry, unfertilized and at a temperature about 55 degrees F during November and December to promote flowering. Plants can be grown outdoors during the summer but need some shade to protect them from sunburn. They are not cold tolerant and must remain indoors during the winter. Filtered light is best for growth.

Flowering: To induce flowering of these plants, both temperature and length of darkness must be carefully controlled. If the night temperature is maintained between 50 and 55 degrees F, flower buds will form regard-

less of day length. If the night temperature is kept between 55 and 70 degrees F buds will form. If the plants remain for at least 13 continuous hours in complete darkness. If the night temperature is maintained above 70 degrees F, buds will form if the plants remain for at least 15 continuous hours in complete darkness. Maintain these conditions until flower buds are fully developed, which may take about 6 to 9 weeks. If the plants are not exposed to the above temperature and light requirements, flower buds will not form. Any exposure to light during this dark period, will interrupt the formation of the flower buds. After the flower buds are formed plants will flower regardless of light or temperature conditions. Temperatures above 90 degrees F may cause buds to drop.

Propagation: In spring take cuttings from last year's growth which has not yet become woody, leave them to dry for a few days and later place them on a rooting media. Too much water will cause the stem sections to rot.

Holiday cacti: Two genera of

closely related plants, Zygocactus and Schlumbergera and their hybrids are used to name these plants as Christmas Cactus, Thanksgiving Cactus or Easter Cactus. They are known collectively as the Holiday Cacti. The Christmas Cactus has red, pink, or white flowers or combinations of these colors. The Thanksgiving Cactus has bright orange-red flowers and the Easter Cactus has wider and rounder stem segments, and the buds take longer to develop, consequently, they will bloom later than the Christmas Cactus.

Pests and diseases: Mealybugs can cause some damage to these plants, they can be controlled with a local application of a soap insecticide or they can be removed with a cotton swab and alcohol. Slugs may also become a problem in the garden.

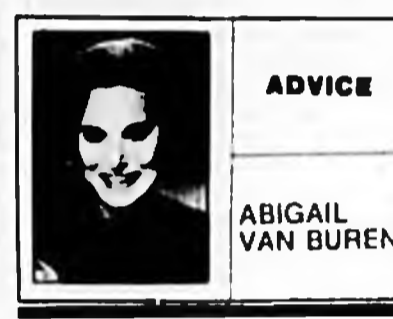
Diaries give voice to ordinary events

DEAR ABBY: Please tell "Tempted in Tennessee" not to destroy her diary of 50 years. She should leave it to a woman's history archive, such as the Newcomb College Center for Research on Women in New Orleans.

Women's lives are reported far too often through the eyes of the men around them. Their writings and papers are either considered inconsequential or, if they're saved, they are archived with those of their spouse.

Diaries give historians and other scholars insights into the daily lives of ordinary women (and men) and are a valuable resource. Public television recently had a program about the diary of a midwife in early 18th-century Maine. This diary is the focal point of a marvelous book by Laurel Thatcher Ulrich, "A Midwife's Tale." Reading the diary excerpts in this book gives one a picture of the daily experiences of women in that time and place. Ulrich went beyond just the daily activities and wove them into a historical background.

The place for longtime diaries is, ultimately, a research library. Asping to the archivist at New-

comb, if you do not want to give up the papers themselves, they can be copied onto acid-free paper and the papers preserved for historians. The archivist will also tell you how to maintain any privacy you feel is needed. (I am currently doing this with a collection of letters my uncle wrote during World War II.)

Please don't destroy records of lives — let them become part of our history.

prehensive planning division, said the purpose of the meeting is to discuss development plans that would meet environmental standards. He said the meeting is planned as a work session, and not publicly announced.

The environmental groups said they want the meeting to be publicized.

The Wekiva Protection Area is home to an abundance of wildlife, including threatened species such as the Florida Scrub-Jay, American Kestrel, American Bald Eagle, fox squirrel,

and the Florida Black Bear, said Keith Shue, Wekiva Issue Chair for the Central Florida Sierra Club.

"The whole ecosystem would be impacted," Shue said. "The Wekiva River is spring fed by an aquifer. You don't want to damage the water system in the area."

Shue said a report released on Nov. 24 by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection was critical of the proposed development in the area because the 2-3 units per acre density did not meet the rural requirements of the Wekiva Protection Act.

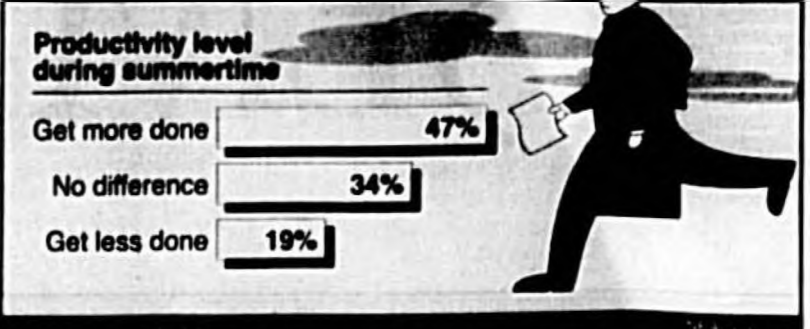

It's tough because there's such a finality to it. The season's over, there's a clear cut winner and there's nothing left to talk about until the following October.

College football is different and people will be talking about this season until they kick it off again next fall. K-State fans can whine all they want. Gator fans can rue the fact that their two most hated rivals are playing for the national championship.

Leave college football alone and enjoy a great season.

Where did my blood go?

DEAR DR. GOTT: I recently had lab work done that showed half of my blood was missing. After being admitted to hospital, I had a GI series, a barium enema, a sigmoidoscopy, a gastroscopy, a bone marrow examination - and I was given three units of blood.

At the end of all this, my doctor said everything was normal, and my problem was probably caused by taking aspirin. Can you give me a simple explanation of this scary and frustrating experience?

DEAR READER: It is...

You were anemic. This could have resulted from improper blood cell formation, destruction of blood corpuscles within your body, or loss of blood. But if you weren't producing enough blood, the bone marrow test would have been abnormal, and the blood tests would have revealed if your blood cells were deformed or being destroyed.

By the process of elimination, then, your doctor was left with the probability that you were losing blood intermittently. Painless bleeding often occurs in the intestinal tract, such blood may not always be evident in the stool. The doctors investigated your intestine with several tests. Evidently, you did not have a tumor, ulcer or diverticulitis, the three most common causes of intestinal bleeding.

Aspirin may be the culprit. Along with other medicines used to treat inflammation and pain, aspirin can lead to bleeding from the stomach. The drug can cause gastritis, a raw inflammation of the stomach lining, which can ooze blood and may be difficult to diagnose.

If I were you, I'd lay off the aspirin and have your stool periodically checked for blood, perhaps as often as once a week for awhile. If the bleeding doesn't return, you can blame the aspirin and rest easy. However, if it starts again, you'll have to undergo more testing, which may include mesenteric arteriography, a fancy X-ray study to identify a source of bleeding within the large bowel.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am 21, uninsured, and I have very badly decayed upper teeth. What's the best and least

expensive way to have them fixed?

DEAR READER: Check with a dentist. Ordinarily the cheapest way to treat badly decayed teeth is to have them removed and replaced with china choppers. If you want to save your teeth, the dentist may be able to repair and cap them, however that's a more expensive procedure. As an alternative, you might look into the possibility of being treated at a dental school. Dentists in training often do superb (and supervised) work at a fraction of the usual cost. It's part of

WIN AT BRIDGE

Keep following the rule

By Phillip Alder

Here is one of those tricky bridge questions. It is a suit contract. Dummy has a side-suit singleton. You're next, with, say, ace-empty fourth in this suit. When declarer calls for dummy's singleton, should you win with the ace or play low?

Normally, it will be right to duck - unless the ace is the setting trick. First, you hope declarer has the king jack. If you win with the ace, he gets one trick for sure. If you duck smoothly, he might finesse the jack and win no trick. Even when declarer has the king queen, it can be fatal to win with the ace - as in this deal.

North was aggressive, lunging straight into Blackwood. True, if

South's red suits were reversed, six spades would be laydown. Yet partners never seem to have the ideal hand! The ideal response is a four heart splinter bid, showing game values with at most one heart. Here, South, with duplicated heart values, would beat a quick retreat to four spades. However, this pair treats a four heart response as natural.

A diamond lead defeats the contract by two tricks. Yet understandably West selected the club queen. Declarer won with dummy's king and immediately called for the heart three, hoping to persuade East to win with the ace. And note that if he does rise, South has 12 tricks: six spades, two hearts, one diamond, two clubs and one club ruff in hand.

Yet East had been there before. He played low smoothly. That cost one heart trick, but two diamond tricks came back in return. The declarer had no chance.
