



Your Income Tax

Net income, upon which the income tax is assessed, is gross income less certain specified deductions for business expenses, lessess, contributions, had debts. etc. A storekeeper may deduct as a business expense amounts spent for rent of his place of business, advertising. premiums for insurance against fire or other losses, cost of water, light, and heat used in his place of business, drayage and freight bills, and the cost of maintenance and repair to through various entrances. delivery wagons and trucks and a reasonable allowance for

salaries. A professional man, such as a lawyer, doctor, or dentist, may deduct the cost of supplies used in his profession, expenses paid in the operation and repair of automobiles and used in making professional calls, dues to professional journals, office rent, cost of water, light, and heat used in his office, and the hire of office assistants.

The farmer may deduct as necessary expenses all amounts actually expended in carrying on the business of farming. such as amounts paid in the production and harvesting of his crops, cost of seed and fertilizer used, cost of minor repairs to farm buildings, and cost of small tools used up in course of a year or two. The cost of farm machinery, equipment, and farm buildings is not leductible as expense.
