

Mayfair Co-Medalists Bean And Jaeger Fire Low 71's

Fleischer And Fox Make Title Flight With Five Other Teenage Golfers

Smooth striking Eddie Bean, Washington, D. C., and Fred Jagger, Daytona Beach, tied for the lead in Monday's first flight of 36 TPs to make a record field of 36 qualifying entries in the fourth annual men's amateur invitational golf tournament at the Mayfair Inn Seminole Country Club yesterday.

The qualifying round was marked by the unusual number of high school linksmen who placed in the coveted championship flight. Of the 32 qualifiers in the title bracket,

Orlando's Edgewater High golf team members all made the championship flight. Fred Bentzon and Austin Jones, both of Edgewater and Joe Eubanks, Daytona, led the prep wonders with 73's.

Sanford's own Melvin Fleischer carded a 74 and Jimmy Fox blazed home with a worthy 78. Rounding out the top 100'ers were former national champion Al Kelley with a 79 and Don Bispplinghoff, National Junior Champ and last year's Mayfair runner up, who reeled on 80.

Two former winners of the Mayfair-Seminole Invitational, defending champion Ralph Bogart, Washington, D. C., and Elmer T. L. Tamm, Fred Spencer, 1951 winner, were among the 25 other qualifiers to make berths in the championship flight.

Bogart tied his brother, G. W. Spencer, with 72 while Bogart posted a 71.

The first winner of the tournament, Herb Smith of Orlando, who turned 40 yesterday in 1956, was one stroke short of the select title division with an 82.

Art Buffin noted amateur from Wilson, N. C., and recent competitor in the International 2 Ball at Orlando, shot a respectable 72 over the 70 par course to rank among the top 10 house entries in the meet.

The championship flight and the first four brackets began match play eliminations this morning starting at 9:00 a.m. The fifth flight entries will launch play on Thursday.

The eliminations will proceed daily subdividing into consolation brackets from tomorrow through Sunday's championship finals.


