

Mayfair Co-Medallists Bean And Jaeger Fire Low 71's

Fleischer And Fox Make Title Flight With Five Other Teenage Golfers

Smooth striking Eddie Bean, Washington, D. C., and Fred Jaeger, Daytona Beach, tied for the medalist honors with one-over par 71's to pace a record field of 86 qualifying entries in the fourth annual men's amateur invitational golf tournament at the Mayfair Inn Seminoles Country Club yesterday.

The qualifying round was marked by the unusual number of high school linkmen who placed in the coveted championship flight. Of the 82 qualifiers in the title bracket,

of seven were teenagers, representing high schools in Sanford, Orlando and Daytona Beach. Orlando's Edgewater High golf team member also made the championship flight. Fred Boynton and Austin Jones, both of Edgewater and Joe Eabanks, Daytona, led the prep wonders with 73's.

Sanford's own Melvin Fleischer carded a 71 and Jimmy Fox closed home with a 71. Rounding out the "prep seven" were two more Edgewater stars, Al Kelley with a 72 and Don Blasinghoff. National Junior Champ and last year's Mayfair runner-up, who recorded an 80.

Two former winners of the Mayfair-Seminole Invitational, defending champion Ralph Bogart, Washington, D. C., and Sanford's Jim Spencer, 1951 winner, were among the 25 other golfers to share berths in the championship flight.

Spencer tied his brother, G. W. Spencer, with 72 while Bogart posted a 74.

The first winner of the tournament, Herb Smith of Orlando, who turned the trick in 1950, was one stroke short of the select title division with an 82.

Art Ruffin, noted amateur from Wilson, N. C., and recent competitor in the International 2-Ball at Orlando, shot a respectable 72 over the 70-par course to rank among the dark horse entries in the meet.

The championship flight and the first four brackets began match-play eliminations this morning starting at 9:00 a.m. The fifth flight entries will launch play on Thursday.

The eliminations will proceed daily subdividing into consolation brackets from tomorrow through Sunday's championship final.

One Of Greatest Heavyweights "Big Jim" Jeffries Dies At 71

RURIBANK, Calif. (AP)—James J. Jeffries—"Big Jim," the boilermaker boy who became one of the world's greatest heavyweight boxing champions—died last night. He was 71.

Jeffries, a semi-invalid since a stroke seven years ago, died in his home in bed after asking his nurse and housekeeper, Mrs. Lillian Bull, to call a doctor.

He had been feeling rather well in recent weeks, even up to attending a social function at two Mrs. Bull said. But he died before the doctor arrived.

Dr. William M. Nethery said a heart attack (coronary thrombosis) was the cause.

Never knocked out in his 19-year ring career, Jeffries reigned as champion of the heavyweights from 1899 to 1905, when he retired undefeated. But, coaxed out of retirement, he met Jack Johnson, his successor on a technical knockout in the 15th round to close the career of Jeffries, then 35.

But in his prime, many veteran fight fans aver, there was no one like Big Jim for speed and hitting power. Carrying 220 pounds on a 5 foot 1 1/2 inch frame at his peak,

he twice knocked out Jim Corbett and the great Australian, Ruby Robert Fitzsimmons.

His victories over Sailor Tom Sharkey, Gus Ruhlin and Joe Choynski rank among the fiercest battles in the days when prize fights were long and brutal. His overall record: 23 fights, 11 knockouts, 7 decisions, 2 draws, 2 exhibitions—and the one loss to Johnson.

Born in Carroll, O., April 15, 1875, of Irish-American stock, Jeffries was one of eight children of a Methodist clergyman. The family moved to Los Angeles when Jim was only 6, and the lad went to work early in railroad shops and iron foundries as a boiler maker.

He had his first professional fight in 1891, at the age of 16, knocking out Hank Griffin in the 14th round and earning \$500. His mother then persuaded him to quit the ring until he was 21.

Jeffries won the heavyweight title by knocking out Fitzsimmons in the 11th round at Coney Island, N. Y., June 9, 1899. Five months later he successfully defended his crown with a 25-round decision over Sharkey.

Don Bisplinghoff, 16-year-old National Junior Champion from Edgewater Heights of Orlando, fell victim to the cool, consistent play of C. E. Ruffin, 22-year-old ranking amateur from Wilson, N. C., on the 18th green of yesterday's second round play in the championship final of the Fourth Annual Men's Amateur Invitation Golf Tournament at the Mayfair Inn and Country Club. Ruffin advanced into today's quarter-final match by defeating the North Carolina leader in the first flight play. Bisplinghoff had won the tournament in 1951 by thrashing his arch-rival, Sanford, 16-year-old Melvin Fleischer, 4-3.

C. E. medalist Eddie Braun, Winston-Salem, N. C., stayed in the championship quarter-final tomorrow by nipping Roy Symes of Sanford, 16-year-old, in the initial round, 5-1.

Edna E. Johnson, 17-year-old Daytona Beach phenom, forced into a consolation match by losing to first-rounding Sanford's 16-year-old Jimmy Fox, 6-3, and later defeating another Sanfordite, Eddie McCullough, 6-3.

Daytona Beach fans were disappointed, however, in their champion's performance. She was defeated in the quarter-final by the quarter-finalist, a 2-up win over the 16-year-old Winston-Salem winner, Jim Spencer, Sanford, 7-6.

Following champion Ralph Hooper, Washington, D. C., played the consolation match against the quarter-finalist, Alton McConell, Island, N. C., in the quarter-final, 7-6.
