Fagan is vacationing on compensatory time he has accumulated and may not return for work until next week, according to police liaison Commissioner John Morris. The decision for Fagan to join the task force was made as the result of a meeting to resolve differences between

Fagan reportedly volunteered to join the task force during the Jan. 31 meeting, according to Morris. City and DEA officials confirmed Tuesday that Fagan would join the task force. However, Fagan may not know his transfer has been approved effective today, according

"Well, I'm not sure," Butler said when asked if Fagan had been informed his transfer goes into effect immediately. "I haven't been able to reach him."

Fagan is to report to the DEA's Altamonte Springs office. However, a DEA spokesman there said today he has not reported for duty yet and that notification of his assignment to that office has not been received yet.

As a member of the task force, Fagan will retain his rank with the Sanford Police Department and his current rate of pay and benefits according to Morris. Fagan's salary is \$17,741.04 per year, according to city records, plus 17 percent for fringe benefits. Fagan's salary will be paid by the city of Sanford.

However, the car and per diem he will receive will be paid by the DEA, Morris noted. Fagan will be the second Sanford officer currently

#### Iran: Mobs Protest Regime; **Bakhtiar Slates News Parley**

TEHRAN. Iran (UPI)- Hundreds of thousands of protesters demanded the ouster of Prime Minister Shahpour Bakhtiar in nationwide demonstrations today and opposition religious leaders took virtual control of the major cities of Isfahan and Shiraz and scores of smaller towns and villages.

In the escalating political battle for control of Iran, Bakhtiar promised to put the case of his embattled government to the nation in a news conference Thursday.

#### 400 Babies: 'Dark Disease'

NAPLES, Italy (UPI) - The "dark disease" of Mount Vesuvius has reached epidemic proportions, and doctors today took extraordinary measures to treat 400 infants suffering from the respiratory illness. The infection has caused the deaths of at least 59 infants in the Naples area, and doctors said Tuesday two more babies - an 18-month-old boy and 12-month old girl were admitted to Santobno pediatric hospital suffering from symptoms of the same viral infection.

The officer returned to Sanford was Sgt. Roy Williams. Sgt. Williams currently serves as internal investigations officer for the police department, according to Butler. Other area departments do not supply as high a proportional number of officers to the task force, ac-

cording to Harper. The Seminole County Sheriff's Department is the only other law enforcement agency in the county supplying officers to the task force. That 200-man department has three officers on the task force.

The Orlando Police Department, a 400-officer unit, has four officers in the task force.

Formed as a re-organization of the old Bureau of Narcotics within the Treasury Department, the federal Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) came into being in 1973 as the arm of the U.S. Justice Department's war on drug traffic.

1975. Based in Orlando, the task force draws on officers from law enforcement agencies in Seminole, Orange Volusia, Brevard, Lake, Occesia and Merica Counties. Officers from those participating agencies are sworn-in as federal agents with powers of arrest in any part of the country. The officers, in essence, become federal officer

on loan from their local department. Task force officers usually work undercover to infiltrate drug trafficking operations. They will often adopt an appearance to make them look like someone who might



when he died, called the police 911 emergency number at 11:16 The Times quoted one source as saying Miss Marshack had

placed a call - at 10:15 p.m. or shortly afterward - to Ponchitta Pierce, a close friend, and reportedly asked Miss Pierce to summon help for the 70-year-old former vice president and four-Miss Marshack and Miss Pierce live in the same building, 25 W.

The Times' source said that Miss Pierce got her doorman to

summon Rockefeller's chauffeur to the Rockefeller townhouse at 13 W. 54th St., where he was later found by responding medical According to the sources, Rockefeller died about 11:15 p.m., an

hour after he was stricken.

Miss Pierce, who hosts a local television public affairs show, was asked Monday if Miss Marshack had contacted her and replied, "I'm not denying anything," but has been unavailable for

### **Mexico Offers** U.S. Way Out

Energy Secretary James Schlesinger doubts if oil production in Iran will ever return to the 6 million barrels a day that were flowing into the world market before that country sank into

This, he says, could lead to another energy crunch for the United States, Western Europe and

It could, but does it have to? A crisis is being averted right now because Saudi Arabia and other members of the Arabdominated OPEC cartel have increased their

production to cover the Iranian losses.

Our security, where energy is concerned, still hangs on the willingness of a handful of Arab

leaders to keep supplying us with oil.

Mr. Schlesinger talks of possible supply problems later this year and the "last resort" of rationing as though the United States must be a passive victim of an accident of history, as it was during the 1973-74 Arab embargo.

We would rather hear him talk more positively

about another accident of history — the fact that there is enough oil waiting to be produced in Alaska and Mexico to plug the Iranian gap and then some. By shaping up our own energy policy and practicing some deft diplomacy, the Carter administration could take the sting out of the loss of Iranian oil and overcome the baleful influence

which over-dependence on Middle Eastern oil sources is having on our foreign policy. Mr. Carter will have the first opportunity to do so when he visits Mexico next month.

He can impress on President Jose Lopez Portillo the importance of making Mexico's rich oil and gas resources a counterweight to the OPEC monopoly, and the willingness of the United States to cooperate in developing those resources for the lasting benefit of the Mexican people.

This means Mr. Carter must be prepared for give and take — not the mostly-take and little-give

The collapse more than a year ago of a Mexican offer to sell us natural gas was the direct result of our Energy Department's refusal to let U.S. pipeline companies pay what the gas is worth — a price based on the equivalent of home heating oil delivered in New York.

This kind of effort to shield U.S. consumers from the real value of energy is only one flaw in what passes for our energy policy.

Even as we and other industrial countries entreat Mexico to step up its oil production, there is more oil coming out of our Alaska pipeline than our distribution system can handle.

Mr. Carter is refusing to authorize the export of any Alaskan oil because this might create the and coal-conversion programs his administration

Coast must be shipped via the Panama Canal to the East Coast at a heavy additional expense. North Slope producers have been shying away from new frilling activity because of the marketing bot-

This problem also could be resolved in Mexico City. Japan, worried about its Persian Gulf oil sources, has been negotiating to buy Mexican oil.

A plan is under consideration which instead would divert some Alaskan oil to Japan while an equal amount is supplied by Mexico directly to the U.S. East Coast — reducing the transportation costs for all concerned and easing the Alaskan "glut." Provided, of course, that Mr. Carter would

go along. The collapse of Iranian oil production poses the same kind of challenge as the Arab embargo presented five years ago.

But there are new options to meet it today — if Mr. Carter and Mr. Schlesinger can break out of the kind of thinking that has given us an energy policy with an over-emphasis on controlling prices and reducing demand for oil and gas, to the neglect of increasing supplies. The time for a turnaround is

gallon container size plants and 500 of the 5-gallon container size. The smaller azaleas will be sold for \$2 and the larger will cost \$5 each. The azalea sale will have a two-fold benefit. It

will beautify the community as a whole by encouraging residents to plant the colorful azaleas and the profits will go to beautify the grounds of the Sanford Civic Center and the Chamber of Commerce building.

The beautiful flowering shrub has become so common in recent years brightening the yards of rich and poor alike, but when I was a child there was only one place to go to enjoy them. That was the old Brewer Estate on Osceola Avenue in Winter Park. Every spring it was opened to the public so that

everyone could enjoy their beauty. Later I remember watching the development of Kraft Azalea Gardens on Alabama Drive where I played as a child.

In the late 40's, many new varieties were grown and introduced into the area by Jules Cole and Hibbard Casselberry of Belgian Azaleas, Inc. Old-timers may remember the azalea gardens which were located in a woodsy area on 17-82 between Triplet Drive and the Community United Methodist Church.

To attract visitors and potential azalea customers, pretty girls strolled the paths attired in ante bellum gowns a la Cypress Gardens. The Beautification and Civic Improvement Committee also hopes to arrange for a sale of oak trees at a minimal cost for those who would like to replace some of old water oaks which have gotten





#### **County Wants Special Act**

#### **Backing Military Pay Plan**

County commissioners are requesting the Seminole County Legislative Delegation to introduce a special act in the upcoming session of the legislature ratifying the county's method of compensating employees who are reserve military personnel when they are in reserve training

The act proposed would permit the county to continue compensating their employees the difference between their regular salaries and the pay they get from the federal government. "They will have equal pay and would not receive more than they are normally paid,'

Commission Chairman Bob French said. Law in Florida for 40 years has been that persons on military leave from their permanent jobs with local government receive full salaries from both.

#### 'We'll Give Drilling Permits'

"Thanks, but no thanks," commissioners told the St. Johns River Management District Tuesday to its offer to grant permits to those persons drilling wells in Seminole County.

A new law would permit the water management district to grant permits for the wells and relay to the county information on the permits granted.

But commissioners decided they will retain the authority to grant the permits and share the information on who has received the permits with the water management district

#### Eatery Seating Rules Eased?

Restaurateurs will no longer have to follow the county's stringent seating capacity regulations to obtain liquor licenses from the state after a special act of the legislature applicable only in Seminole County is repealed. County commissioners voted 4-1 Tuesday to make it known to the legislative delegation they are not opposed to the special law being repealed in favor of the general law applicable in the rest of the state. Commissioner Dick Williams, casting the only negative vote, said he believes the county ought to continue with a higher standard.

# For Killer

After deliberating about 90 minutes today a circuit ourt jury recommended the death penalty for erry Melvin Sims, convicted last week in the laying of reserve Seminole County sheriff's deputy

Each member of the jury was polled individually by Circuit sudge Thomas Waddell and 10 of the 12 said yes to the death nalty. Of the 12-member jury, nine are women the remainder en. Two of the women during the judge's polling, said they did ot agree with the advisory verdict calling for the death penalty. lorida has the electric chair in such cases.

Judge Waddell withheld final sentencing pending completion of a pre-sentence investigation and set of no specific date for sentencing. Sims was remanded to the custody of the Seminole County Sheriff's department.

The jury could have recommended life. Under a life sentence, Sims would have had to serve 25 years in prison before being eligible for parole.

Sims was the third man convicted in connection with the robbery-killing during a holdup at the Longwood Village Pharmacy on Dec. 29, 1977. Pfeil, 55, was entering the pharmacy to fill a prescription for his wife when he became involved in a shootout with Sims and was killed.

The only man still at-large in the incident is Clarence Eugene Robinson of Jacksonville, who is believed to have planned the robbery. Curtis Baldree was sentenced to two years in jail after he agreed to cooperate with authorities and testify against Sims. James "B.B." Halsell was sentenced to 10 years in prison for his part in the robbery. Halsell also testified agains Sims during the three day trial.

In the past five years only "Crazy" Joe Spaziano has been authorities. Spaziano is on death row in Raiford Prison for the hidnerping and mutilation murder of a young Orlando woman.
