

Galabow And Minor To Hook Up In Real Duel Tomorrow; Feds Lose To Leesburg, 3-1

One of the season's best pitching duels—Involving Sam Galabow of the Sanford Celeryfeds and Tige Minor of the Cocoa Indians—is in prospect for local fans who visit Municipal Park tomorrow afternoon.

These two youngsters will be pitted against each other in a Central Florida Baseball League game that is scheduled to start at 3:30 o'clock.

For the Indians, it will be another opportunity to advance further toward the league lead and at least keep abreast with the Leesburg Islanders, with whom they were tied for second place today.

For the Feds, it will be a test of the five new players who arrived Monday and an opportunity for the fans to size up their talents with the view to getting a line on what may be expected for the remainder of the first half.

Manager Bill Cobb, victim of five errors and a ball game at Leesburg yesterday is ready to give the new men every opportunity to produce. In yesterday's game at Leesburg, four of the five had their chance, with some fans declaring that they will fill the bill without trouble just as soon as they get their bearings.

Since Manager Cobb has released Ed Leyey, Walter Yowell and Jim Mobley, and because Joe Barnes still is on the ailing team with a throat infection, the starting line-up tomorrow probably

will be as follows:

Fans are loud in their praise of the work yesterday of Burch, outfielder who may be called back to Mississippi any day. He rapped out two hits in four tries and hit two line drives that were caught by Barcessi on his other trips. In the field, he is credited with one error but it was on a ball which some observers say should have been scooped up by the shortstop before it got into center field.

Jack Reed promises to lead the Feds to a victory tomorrow. The veteran, labeled "Evolution" by his fan followers, is just about in shape after a season of teaching at Ocoee and, since he taught Tige almost all he knows about pitching, there is a possibility that Jack will be able to smack the youngsters offerings in every direction to lead the Feds to that long sought victory.

While the Feds and Indians are playing here, the Leesburg Islanders will be at Deland with the Reds. Jack Hogan, former umpire, has been signed by DeLand to replace Lacout in the outfield. Lacout will do the catching from now on, Gene Connell having been released.

First inning errors cost the Feds a 3 to 1 victory at Leesburg yesterday, a defeat which was another of the several hard luck games which the Feds have dropped.

Only two men reached first on him after the third inning, one on a single and the other on Askey's second error, and again Cobb was forced to see a game go over the side because his mate killed the pitch behind him.

The Feds reached Jack McCullough for eight scattered hits, scoring once in the third. However, the old batting punch again was missing and what might have been a victory was turned into defeat.

Leesburg scored twice on three hits, one of them a double. Miller opened with a single through short, pulling up at second and when Burch was credited with an error in handling the ball, Bonner was safe at first and Miller went to third when Cates muffed an easy roller, and Miller scored when Barcessi's roller was collected by Hackney. Ice Cutting Nows Ruling High Court Despite Ruling

Enlistments In
NRA On Voluntary
Basis Exceed Sto-
ries Of Defections

WASHINGTON, May 30.—Scattered breaks appeared yesterday in the ranks of the NRA army of industry and business—mustered by the Supreme Court—enlistments on a voluntary basis continued the rule.

Great corporations and associations throughout the country added their pledges to a long pile of promises that standards would be privately discarded, several defectors occurred in isolated sections. Ice cutting in New York was made with a charge that virtually the entire fur industry had abandoned the 35-hour day and was working unlimited hours. The charge, voiced by F. Hodgson, executive director of the code authority, was by a spokesman for the workers' union.

The labor leaders repeated determination to hold the day gained under NRA. Southern plants informed employees of changes in wage hour schedules.

Piney Woods Shirts Company, Greenville, S. C., employing workers, announced a wage increase 25 percent and decrease in working hours to 40 and 44 a week. The Glass Battery Company of Knoxville, cut the pay of its men and increased their shift and that the Bok & Cawood mill at Gastonia, was notified by Philadelphia headquarters that a mini-

shifts would go into effect weekly. In the removal of code restraints, price cutting spread from New York to Kansas City. Cigarettes were being sold cents a pack, and Los Angeles W. H. Loughry, ex-secretary of the food and drug code authority, said some had been slashed as much as 50 percent.

He warned that "price will result in wage reduction and an increase in the labor."
