

## Feds To Meet DeLand Reds Here Tomorrow At 3:30; Lose Twin Bill By 4-1, 3-2

The Sanford Celiyfeds will end a three game home stand at Municipal Park tomorrow afternoon when at 3:30 o'clock they meet the second place DeLand Reds in single game.

Jim Mahaffey, Apopka left-hander, will be on the mound for the Feds against either Earl Porter of Daytona Beach, or probably Bat Sacrouf, DeLand catcher who is said to be ready to take a turn on the mound for the rest of the season.

Mahaffey has looked impressive in two starts for the Feds this year, and, with support at the bat, he may be counted upon to win. Porter has been held out of action for 10 days owing to an injured side which is supposed to have mended. If he doesn't start, it is likely he is out since both Fisher and Laits worked Sunday and are supposed to be tired out.

After tomorrow's game, the Feds play a double-header at Cocoa Thursday and another double-header at DeLand next Sunday. Cocoa comes here to morrow for a single game and Leesburg plays a double header here Thursday week.

After two more or less mediocre performances before a large crowd at Municipal Park yesterday afternoon, the Feds dropped a double bill to the league-leading Leesburg Islanders by scores of 4 to 1 and 3 to 2.

The Islanders won the first game by combining three powerful hits and a walk in the first inning off the Harder.
