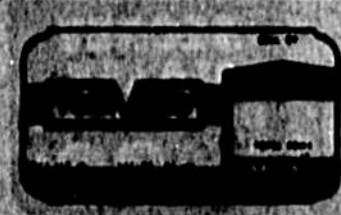

## 'Fever' Burns 'Em Up

WYOMING, Mich. (UPI) — The book version of the popular movie "Saturday Night Fever" apparently is a bit too hot for officials at a high school in the Grand Rapids suburb of Wyoming, Mich.

The book was banned from Rogers High School library shelves as "inappropriate reading" for the teenage students because of its four-letter words and explicit sex.

Principal John Pytman even said he thought the book should be burned, although there are no actual plans for such a move. Pytman did say, however, that the school will dispose of its three copies of the book.

"We've got two (copies) in our hands and we're after the third," said Pytman. "It has no place in our school. We've got a lot of good things to put into the library."

The book is bad enough that it ought to be burned," he said. The book, written by H.W. Jackson, is the sequel to the current best-selling novel starring John Travolta. It was one of 800 paperbacks added to the school's library in mid-January under a \$1,500 state grant aimed at encouraging students to read.

A committee composed of parents and students selected the books to be ordered, but, as assistant school superintendent Eugene Berens put it, "This one apparently slipped through."

It was a group calling itself the Interfaith Committee Against Blasphemy that persuaded high school officials to pull the books off the library shelves.

"I don't understand why they are pulling this unabridged version in the library where it would be available to 16-year-olds," said Rev. Wesley Mamber, pastor of the Church of the Nazarene.

# Lease-Buy Agreement For Roumillat Legal

Should Not Worry

Did Seminole County commissioners act illegally in approving a lease-purchase agreement for the Roumillat building in downtown Sanford?

At least one Seminole County commissioner says they did. But the county's legal adviser says the agreement is perfectly legal.

The county commission voted 5-2 Tuesday to approve a lease-purchase agreement with the owners of the Roumillat Building. The total price for lease and purchase of the structure is \$90,000. The cost of the building is listed at \$80,000 and renovations to the third and fourth floors is listed at \$10,000. Modifications to the first floor and carrying costs bring the total to \$90,000.

Commissioner Harry Kwiatkowski raised the legal questions in opposing the agreement.

"I think there is a stipulation that anytime we are involved in something over \$2,000 we enter into something called bidding. To allow government to take advantage of the competitive situation," commented Kwiatkowski.

"My question is, are we violating the bidding process mandated by law?" Kwiatkowski asked.

"The lease of the second floor is up at the end of the month," noted Stewart, "so I will probably suggest the agreement be made effective on the first of April. That would be the smooth way to handle it."

Terms of the agreement call for the county to extend its current lease of the second floor of the building for five months. The county rents the second floor for its manager office at a rate of \$8,000 per month, according to Robert Ellis, director of administrative services.

## Ex-Neighbor Is Held In Slaying Of Girl

OCALA (UPI) — Police said today they have charged a 29-year-old man with the murder of 8-year-old Trina Gail Thornley.

Adams, a former neighbor of the Thornley family, is alleged to have made an obscene telephone call to the Thornley home last Monday.

Adams' arrest came on the heels of discovery of the skeletal remains of the Thornley girl in a wooded area near Ocala Municipal Airport. She had disappeared Jan. 13 on her way home from school.

Police said dental charts confirmed that the remains are those of the missing girl. Tentative identification had been made earlier from traces of clothing found with the remains and school books with her name inside found nearby.

Shortly after the little girl's disappearance police issued an alert for a man who tried to convince a 13-year-old girl to get into his car.

## Israelis, Palestinians Battle In S. Lebanon

Renewed fighting broke out today between invading Israeli forces and Palestinian guerrillas in a 6-mile-wide strip of Lebanese soil and the Palestinians said Israeli reinforcements were pouring into the battle zone.

Israeli Prime Minister Menachem Begin said Wednesday his country's 17-hour punitive raid had ended and Israeli forces would stay until an agreement is reached to prevent terrorists from returning to the border region.

## Italy Rebels Grab Top Politician

ROME (UPI) — Terrorists today kidnaped former Premier Aldo Moro, Italy's most influential politician, and named down his bodyguards in a daring daylight raid that threw the nation into political turmoil.

Telephone calls to news offices in Rome, Turin and Milan said the abduction was carried out by the Red Brigades, an extreme leftist group that has claimed responsibility for many past killings, kidnappings and bombings.

Police said five or six gunmen opened fire on the 61-year-old Moro's limousine as the head of the nation's largest political party was being driven to Parliament for debate on the installation of Italy's first Communist-led government in 21 years.

Such is the dilemma facing U.S. senators as they prepare to vote today on one of the proposed Panama Canal treaties. President Carter, awaiting the vote and also watching the Italian situation closely, said a Democratic gathering Wednesday evening that he was looking for a "Palestinian home" along the Panama Canal. Moro's kidnapping was the first abduction of a major Italian politician since the end of World War II.

**Close Vote Seen For Canal Pact** WASHINGTON (UPI) - Both opponents and supporters today were expecting the first of two Panama Canal treaties to be approved on a close vote in the Senate. The two parts, bargained in 13 years of negotiations by two Democratic and two Republican administrations, would return full sovereignty over the U.S. Canal Zone and yield control of the canal to Panama on Dec. 31, 1999. The first treaty, set for a vote this afternoon following nearly six weeks of debate, would guarantee the seaway's permanent neutrality and grant the U.S. defense rights. Senate sources said as a result of Wednesday's furious bargaining and lobbying, supporters finally captured the 67 senators needed for the required two-thirds approval for ratification of the first treaty. Supporters of a Democratic party hand-over into Wednesday night, Vice President Walter Mondale pushed Senate Democratic leader Robert Byrd - who has been holding an effectively 50-50 - in and behind - to vote for the Panama Canal treaty. The second treaty, to be voted on next month, details the conditions under which the seaway will be turned over to Panama at the end of the 20th century. But the U.S.-administered Canal Zone would be dissolved within three years of ratification. On the eve of the vote four key senators announced support. An ever stronger coalition, guaranteeing the United States to keep the canal open with troops if necessary, was expected to be approved before the final vote. The latest UPI tally before the vote showed the ratification of the neutrality pact had the support of 69 senators, two shy of the needed two-thirds. That tally listed 38 senators against or leaning against and five undecided. The Senate adopted two other changes Wednesday: One, sponsored by Republican Sen. Strom Thurmond, would place all Americans buried in Panama in one cemetery to be permanently operated by the United States. The vote was 88-1. The other, approved by voice vote, set out five factors to be considered in setting canal tolls.

**Key Parts Of First Canal Treaty** WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Panama Canal treaty today would guarantee permanent neutrality of the Panama Canal and grant indefinite U.S. authority to defend it. The pact's major provisions, at a glance: -The canal will remain neutral after Panama takes full control Dec. 31, 1999. Any other canal built in Panama will be permanently neutral also. -The canal will remain open in peace and war to all ships. No vessel may commit hostilities in the waterway. -The canal will be operated efficiently and tolls will be just and equitable. -The United States and Panama will defend the canal; the United States has the right to act against any threat to the canal but not to intervene in the internal affairs of Panama. -U.S. and Panamanian warships will "go to the head of the line" in times of war. -The United States may continue to grant Columbia toll-free transit. When Panama takes over, Costa Rica and Colombia may get toll-free passage.

# Mixing Makeup With Tinted Glasses

According to make-up artist and cosmetics expert, Trish, looking gorgeous in glasses is easier than it seems.

The trick is to think of yourself as an artist working with a color wheel, with the principles of addition and subtraction. Let's spin the color wheel and see what happens.

With today's tinted the

newest thing in fashion frames, it's important to remember, when applying make-up under these colored lenses, that opposition on the color wheel will be unflattering to one another because together they create a "muddy" neutral.

Pick instead from colors near each other than are complementary to one another.

You'll see that red tinted glasses would look least complementary over green make-up, but tinted lenses would not be flattering over orange-based make-up, nor yellow tinted eyes. In such cases, you get a muddy effect and on unflattering one.

One pretty way to avoid this is to choose a monochromatic color plan based on the color of your eyes, thus identifying the pigment.

Match your make-up to everything — your eye color, hair color, frame color.

A single color scheme can be extremely effective — especially with blue, green or brown, and it's especially lovely at night.

Far-sighted women must be careful with eye make-up as the corrective lenses needed have tend to magnify the eyes.

For women with this problem, eye is definitely more, and make-up should be soft and selected from the neutrals such as light browns, greys, and greys. No strong colors should be used close to the eye area.

Trish suggests that if you use a liner, it too should be in a neutral shade, stroke onto the outer corner of the lid.

Blue, greens and pinks should be blended carefully away from the eye and towards the outer edge of the lids and brows.

## Chains, Pearls 2 Hits

Fashion's new favorite, the "Little sailing" chain, pairs with pearls — two or even three strands of varying lengths worn with a pearl choker to give handsome neckline. It's in. Shorter bracelets do the same for pearl bracelets.

Chains come in every conceivable type of link — 2-link, 3-link, figure 8, round, square, rectangular and oval to name some.

Many of the new chains have small pendants with real stones such as diamonds, pearls, opals, rubies, and sapphires to highlight the necklines.

Look for chain-drop earrings this spring, as earrings show three or more chain drops to give an elongated look.

# Spring Forecast: Casual Layers & Layers

The fashion forecast for April in Paris calls for layers and layers of casual chic in bloom as Pre-a-Portier makes its spring-into-summer debut.

The theme of Paris fashion for the warmer days of 1973 is relaxed and easy, with lightweight fabrics and full cuts promising cool comfort on hot days.

In spite of the emphasis on layers of shirts, pants, blouses, vests and tunics, masterful styling and attention to fine weight fabric guarantees that no woman will be willing for fashion's sake this summer.

Khaki is the dominant fabric of the Paris collections, lending its crisp and easy natural touch to almost every collection. Fine cottons for day and chiffons at night are perfect for gentle pleating and multi-layering.

Tank tops and T-shirts remain popular, with Kenzo working this look into a whole line of young and breezy T-shirt dresses.

Sweater sets also continue to play an important part in the Paris fashion statement, with beautifully textured stitches adding a special touch to delicate boucle sets and cool fisherman's net weaves worked into tops and tanks.

While there are still many bright touches of color in the French collections, the big trend in color for spring is seen in the subtly-lined neutrals - fast blue mixed with brown, soft yellow blending with the ever-present black.

There are, in fact, many surprises from the designers this year. Going against the trend of both the present collections and her past tradition, Sonia Rykiel stands alone as an advocate of bright reds and bold yellows mixed with stripes of black and fringed on all edges.

Karl Lagerfeld for Chloé sees spring evenings in dark-toned prints, in contrast with the past winter's trend to the



Lushly colored prints drifting into cascades of ruffles, legs and shoulders bared for evening wear.

And for Yves St. Laurent, the 1973 collection is a triumph in color, a subtle blending of mustard tones, feline greens, plums, violets, browns and teal blues - with occasional touches of clear red - combining to form one of his most brilliant color statements.

Stripes are scattered throughout the collections, from Kenzo's dresses to Sonia Rykiel's sweater layers. While St. Laurent sees prints as visions of butterflies for evening, many designers looked to a colorful summer cornucopia for print inspiration, and dresses covered with bright cherries and berries show up everywhere.

The most important message to come out of Paris this spring is definitely pants

— and the shape to come. Through the long and the short of it, the shape of pants has undergone a complete change - almost an inversion - in the minds of Paris designers.

One are any of the flared looks of the previous seasons. Pants have shifted their lines, with all the emphasis now appearing in full legs with thin tops and tapered ankles.

Sometimes, as in the collection of St. Laurent, the change is seen as a subtle, pencil-legged effect, with raw hems left to cuff as the wearer descends.

As in the shell-inspired pants of Kenzo, ethnic touches of India and Arabia, the hearse and the desert may be seen in many of the designer's offerings. Dolce & Gabbana reflects this new approach in sweater tops printed with scenes of palms and dunes.

Kenzo accentuates his outfit with path helmets and Nehru caps and collars. Cuffs and tunics take on almost bodice proportions.

If the ethnic trend is not completely gone from Paris

the focal point has at least shifted from the European continent, aside to Cairo and Casablanca.

Yves St. Laurent, consistently against the general trend, has abandoned both his former fantasies and the current influence of colonial India and has turned his attention to some other than the bustling streets of New York City for his clean, contemporary inspiration.

The new designs are simple, understated, the color palette muted, the fabric taken from the surplus store and incorporated into the kind of fashion that goes with the modern lifestyle of the world's most exciting metropolis.

From the brilliant new colorings of St. Laurent to Kenzo's witty drawings to the romantic "digi" dresses of Marc Bohan for Christian

Dior, this year's spring-summer collections from Paris include some of the most original and beautiful designs the city has offered the fashion world in a long time -

## Fetching Fashions For Black Hairdos

"Choose a hairstyle that's right for you," he says. "Take a good look at the hair you've got. Look at its texture, how well it handles and how it falls naturally."

"The more you want to change your hair from its natural condition, the more time and effort you must devote to it."

Know yourself and be honest, says Dym. If your life is really busy, give thought to an easy-care style.

Take a good, objective look at the shape of your face, he advises. Note any special features you want to play up or down. Then have a talk with a good hairdresser who specializes in black hair care.

Dym's hairdressers in using relaxers, straighteners, perms, perms, pressing head rollers, or whatever else is needed to achieve a particular hairstyle.

"But," he insists, "they should be carefully selected and used only by skilled professionals on hair that has been prepared for them."

Any hair fashion, he continues, must start with a good, healthy base of hair, sometimes more easily said than done, since black hair is extremely delicate, sensitive to chemicals and prone to breakage.

If your hair is damaged beyond sensible hope of recovery, Dym recommends cutting it short and starting over again. Healthy hair begins with a healthy diet. Hair can't absorb external nutrients, so be sure you eat plenty of protein and take vitamin supplements.

Healthy hair is clean from the scalp out, washed at least once a week with a neutral pH or slightly acid shampoo. After the initial cut, it should be trimmed often to minimize breakage.

If hair is exposed to wind and sun, protect it with an oil-based spray that seals out drying elements.

Massage your scalp every day. Use the tips of your fingers and rotate gently. It stimulates circulation and feels fantastic.

# Lake Mary: Sworn Complaints On Police

Complaints against individual Lake Mary police officers will no longer be recognized by the city council unless they are included in sworn statements, according to a formal complaint procedure adopted Thursday night.

Both Councilman Cliff Nelson and Edith Griffin opposed the sworn statement requirement. But, while Nelson voted against that portion of the procedure, Mrs. Griffin voted for it.

"We're country people here and almost all of us know each other," Mrs. Griffin said, adding she could see no reason she or anyone else should have to sign a sworn statement.

"I could talk with the chief of

police and could go to the state prosecuting attorney and give him a sworn statement," said Mrs. Griffin.

Councilman Pat Southward responded that she agreed with what Mrs. Griffin said and that all citizens have the right to go to the state attorney.

"It would be ideal and more harmonious by talking out the complaints or if persons would not go to the state attorney. But, there seems to be some pressure, originating either inside or outside the city, for some intermediate steps," Mrs. Southward said.

And city attorney Gary Hensley said the state attorney would not do anything about police harassment, as an

example, and would only do something if a crime was involved.

"Citizens only know they have a gripe against a police officer," Nelson said, insisting the procedure of a sworn statement is not completed. Nelson said oral complaints would permit a preliminary and summary for summary, Page 2A

informal investigation to determine merit before formal steps were taken.

Councilman Bert Peruchio, Southward and Harry Terry pointed out that sworn statements against individual officers are required under state law in the police bill of rights.

"We have to recognize state law," said Peruchio.

The council, at the same time, included within the procedure that complaints from citizens against the police department as a whole can be directed orally or in any manner citizens wish to the mayor, council men, city clerk, city attorney or any officer of the police department.

The official receiving the report would have the responsibility of reducing the complaint to writing.

The procedure requires that a letter of acknowledgment be sent to citizens for other type complaints and reports on final disposition of the complaint would be made to the mayor, the council and the citizen.

# Carter Warning To Soviets: We'll Increase Our Arsenal

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. (UPI) — President Carter today warned the Soviet Union against using its military might for "political blackmail" and said America is prepared to spend more on its own arsenal if necessary.

In what was billed as an "unprecedented" defense statement, the president also told the Soviet Union its stepped-up military activities may erode "popular support" in the United States for joint ventures by the two nations.

The president made his address at Wake Forest University before leaving for a nuclear disarmament summit in Geneva, Switzerland, where he will spend the weekend.

Carter pointed to the Russian arms buildup and an "outrageous" incursion on the part of the Soviet Union to use its military power in Africa and other crisis spots.

To protect the nation and maintain peace, he said, "We shall have to continue to support strong and efficient military forces... we will not allow any other nation to gain military superiority over us."

Besides greater strategic arms, he said the Russians also have built up "conventional" armaments which "could be used for political blackmail and could threaten our vital interests" unless the United States and its allies maintain their own conventional military strength.

# Soviets Blast Back: 'Patience Is Limited'

MOSCOW (UPI) — The Soviet Union today accused the Carter administration of making contradictory statements on the second round of Strategic Arms Limitation talks and warned that Moscow's patience "is not without limit."

An editorial in the Communist Party newspaper Pravda called on Washington to "give more serious thought to the problems that arise in connection with the strategic offensive arms limitation talks and truly realize how much is at stake."

Pravda said the Soviet Union had enough patience to "get to the essence of the problem" of SALT and find a "mutually acceptable solution."

"But its patience however, is not without limit," it said.

The editorial was one of a series in recent weeks attempting to prod the United States toward concluding a second SALT agreement.

Pravda said Washington's "unilateral policy" blocked implementation of the preliminary agreement reached at Vladivostok in 1974 by then President Gerald Ford and Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev.

Soviet or proxy forces into other lands," the relations with the United States would degenerate.

"The popular support in the United States for such cooperation will erode," the president told about 2,000 persons in his Wake Forest speech.

A top-level government official, who accompanied the president from Washington, said Carter was concerned with "growing patterns of Soviet intrusion" and its "growing... capacity to intervene in local conflicts."

To underline his theme, Carter was to spend the afternoon off the Georgia coast aboard the nation's newest nuclear-powered aircraft carrier, the \$1.1 billion USS Dwight D. Eisenhower, for an air power demonstration.

Debunking as a myth the view the present defense budget is too burdensome, the president said, "We can readily afford the necessary costs of our military forces, as well as an increased level if needed to prevent any adversary from destabilizing the peace of the world."

# K-Mart Plaza Approved, 200 New Jobs Anticipated

A new K-Mart shopping plaza is coming to Sanford. The shopping plaza will be open for business by March, 1979, the plaza's planners said at Thursday night's Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission meeting.

The shopping plaza, to be located on the southeast corner of U.S. 17-92 and Airport Boulevard, will create about 200 new jobs for Sanfordites, said Phil Holmberg, president of Holmberg Construction Co., based in Jacksonville.

The company will build the shopping plaza, Holmberg said. "It should be open in about a year," the builder said.

The planning and zoning commission Thursday night voted an unanimous approval for the project's site plan. The plan indicates there will be 118,000 square feet of retail business space at the plaza and parking spaces for 647 cars.

The plan shows a K-Mart store with 68,327 square feet of retail space, 28,228-square-foot food store and 13,000 square feet for other retail businesses.

Zoning board member Gordon Meyer said traffic around Airport Boulevard and U.S. 17-92, to be generated by the new shopping plaza and new Southern Bell offices under construction

nearby at Southgate Road and State Street, might create a need for widening Airport Boulevard from Southgate Street to U.S. 17-92.

"I think you've got a good site plan here, but we need to think about recommending to the city commission that Airport Boulevard be widened to four lanes out there," Meyer said.

"With cars coming to the K-Mart plaza, and with 200 cars a day coming into Southern Bell offices, there will be additional traffic. We're going to have another State Road 438 unless we plan for the future now. And it's cheaper to do it that way," said Meyer.

Jim England, a Jacksonville consulting engineer working on plans for the project, said most of the traffic generated by the new shopping plaza would travel on U.S. 17-92.

Meyer and others indicated they were not criticizing the K-Mart shopping plaza site plan, but that additional lanes on Airport Boulevard near the shopping center might be necessary to accommodate future traffic.

"We hope to start construction within 30 days," said England.

"The shopping plaza will provide about 200 jobs, and we plan to fill them all locally," said Holmberg. — MARR WEINBERG
