Game With College From Tennessee Is Expected to be the Hardest of the Year

Several Men To Play Final Game

Attention Centers on Backfield as Turkey Day Draws Near

STETSON UNIVERSITY, DeLand, Nov. 22.—Coach Herbert R. McQuillan and his charging band of Florida State S. I. A. A. Hatter champions have plunged into the most strenuous training program of the season in preparation for the final engagement of the season when they meet the powerful Maryville eleven at Sanford on Turkey day.

The well groomed Maryville eleven, of Tennessee, will invade Florida and attack the Hatters with great anticipations of victory. The Tennessee gridmen base their hopes on past records of the preceding in S. I. A. A. circles three down 33 to 7 when the latter was out season. The defeated George-Carson-Newman machine by a 10-0 score and defeated the strong score of 10 to 7.

The widely heralded fighters of the Kentucky eleven were able to muster up enough strength to score only one touchdown against Maryville. Consequently, the Tennessee machine is being regarded by many pigskin followers as favored over the Stetson outfit.

This view is not altogether substantiated for during the past few weeks the remarkable development of the Hatter squad has bordered on the sensational, and yet the well sustained progress is only the result of a thorough foundation laid by Coach McQuillan at the very beginning of the season.

Outcome Uncertain
What the outcome of the Stetson-Maryville clash will be is, therefore a matter of dire uncertainty. Coach McQuillan, fully aware of the threatening strength of the Maryville eleven, is preparing his lads for what is beyond all question the biggest battle of the Hatter season. The clash will terminate the season and the Stetson mentor is doing everything possible to make the concluding contest one of glorious victory.

Turns To Backfield
Captain Spot Courtney and his fellow players of the backfield have galloped through the present season like trained horses of warfare, and now Coach McQuillan is concentrating his attention upon them for the final encounter. Up until midseason he had his command eight backs, composing the "war horse" and "pony" backfields, but he has condensed the army somewhat, so that the quartet to start against Maryville, will in all probability consist of Captain Spot Courtney at left half, Chet Freeman at right half, Punch Leonthal at full, and Larry Bernard at quarter.

Lewis Developed Star
Pete Lewis, Fort Mende's valuable contribution to the Stetson squad, may well be hailed as a developed star in the Hatter aggregation. His exceptional playing during the season now closing ranks him along with the Palmetto star, Captain Spot Courtney, who is now being looked upon as one of the most capable backfield men in Southern football circles. Both Captain Spot Courtney and Pete Lewis are light men, tipping the scales around 140 pounds.

Line Appears Ready
The here-to-foro impregnable Hatter line appears well ready for the battle with the Tennessee outfit. From Tom Smith at left end to Spike Weisinger on the other end the Stetson line presents a fighting array of line slaves.

Don Geiger, towering 216 pound Hatter tackle, in participating in the Aggie game played the last football game he will ever play on Cummings Field, for Thursday he will have completed four years of service with the Stetson team and will make his exit from the pigskin sport.

Failure of Northwestern and Michigan to get together caused each team to play a double header with one of their opponents. Northwestern arranged a home and home affair with Indiana while Michigan did the same with Minnesota.

Big Ten Class
Last season Northwestern did Michigan 3-2 in one of the most surprising upsets of the year. Only a defeat by Chicago kept the Purple from having a clear claim to the title.

Since Michigan lost only to Northwestern, there was some doubt as to the 1925 champion in the Western conference. Northwestern showed real sportsmanship when it conceded the honor to Michigan.

Now these two teams again meet up as the class of the Big Ten. For that reason it is all the more regrettable that a meeting between the two was not scheduled for his year.

Northwestern avenged this lone score by rolling up 38 points against Chicago, the largest total recorded against Stagg's Maroons.

In a season that has featured stellar backfield combinations, Northwestern offers an array of ball toters and passers, not to mention kickers, who are outstanding.

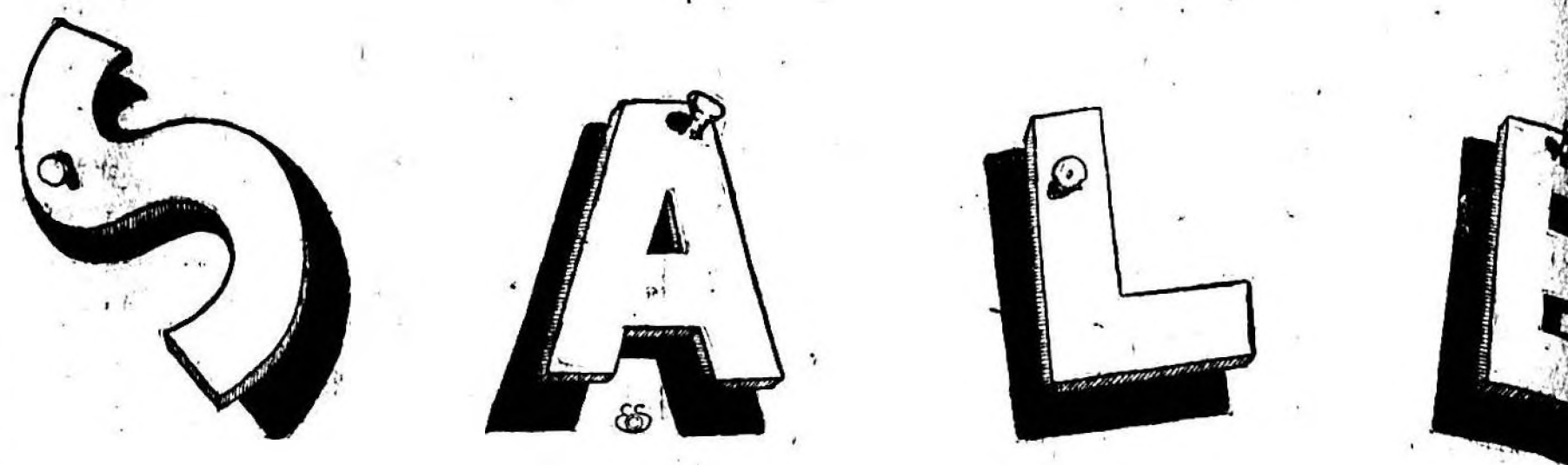

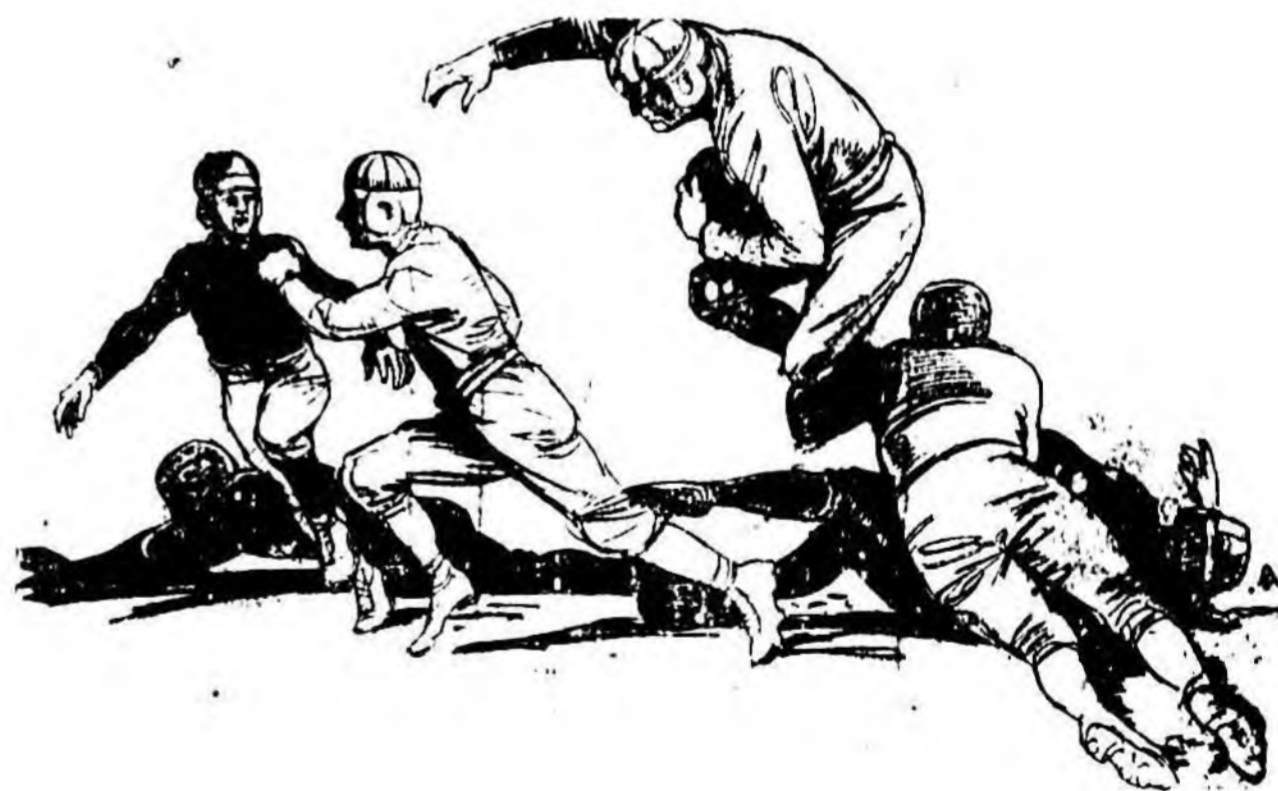

Pair Of Lazy Bank Clerks Responsible For Clearing House

LONDON, Nov. 24.—(AP)—The London Bankers' Clearing House through which checks for 40,437,119,000 passed during 1925 is really the outcome of two lazy bank clerks' ideas.

Before the Clearing House was established the collection of checks was a laborious affair, each bank sending messengers to another bank to cash checks over the counter. About the year 1770 two clerks, each going to the other's bank, happened to meet in a tavern and it occurred to them much trouble would be saved by exchanging checks and settling the difference in cash. This arrangement worked so well that other clerks copied it and in that year the yard of the Five Bells public house near Lombard Street became the recognized meeting place for clerks to exchange checks.

Eventually bankers adopted the lazy clerks' idea and rented a room for the purpose, but actual rules were not drawn up till the beginning of the nineteenth century. In 1854 joint-stock banks had become so strong they were admitted to the Clearing House

LEOPOLD LINKED WITH ESCAPE OF SIX PRISONERS

One of Slayers of Chicago Boy Claims Prison Ethics Forbade His Testifying as to the Activities of Others

JOLIET, Ill., Nov. 24.—(AP)—The name of Nathan Leopold, one of the two wealthy "thrill slayers" of little Bobby Franks in Chicago, has been linked with the escape engineered by six convicts on trial for the killing of Deputy Warden Klein here last May.

Leopold pleaded in court yesterday that penitentiary ethics forbade his testifying about the activities of other convicts but the men on trial for the lives were not so reticent and later described to their attorney the efforts they said they had made to release the Chicagoan.

According to the story told the attorney, Leopold's hands actually were freed from manacles but no key could be found to his solitary cell and the men were forced to flee without him.

Klein was killed in the solitary house and the convicts insisted, the attorney said, that the only reason they invaded that part of the prison, was to loose the young convict.

Two of them had been students under Leopold, and their version described how two Mexicans lingered at his cell, in answer to his plea to be taken along, and were finally summoned by their leader to give up the attempt to free their former instructor.

Leopold was in solitary confinement for the theft of sugar, and early in the investigation of the break it was hinted that he might have got himself sent there for a purpose.

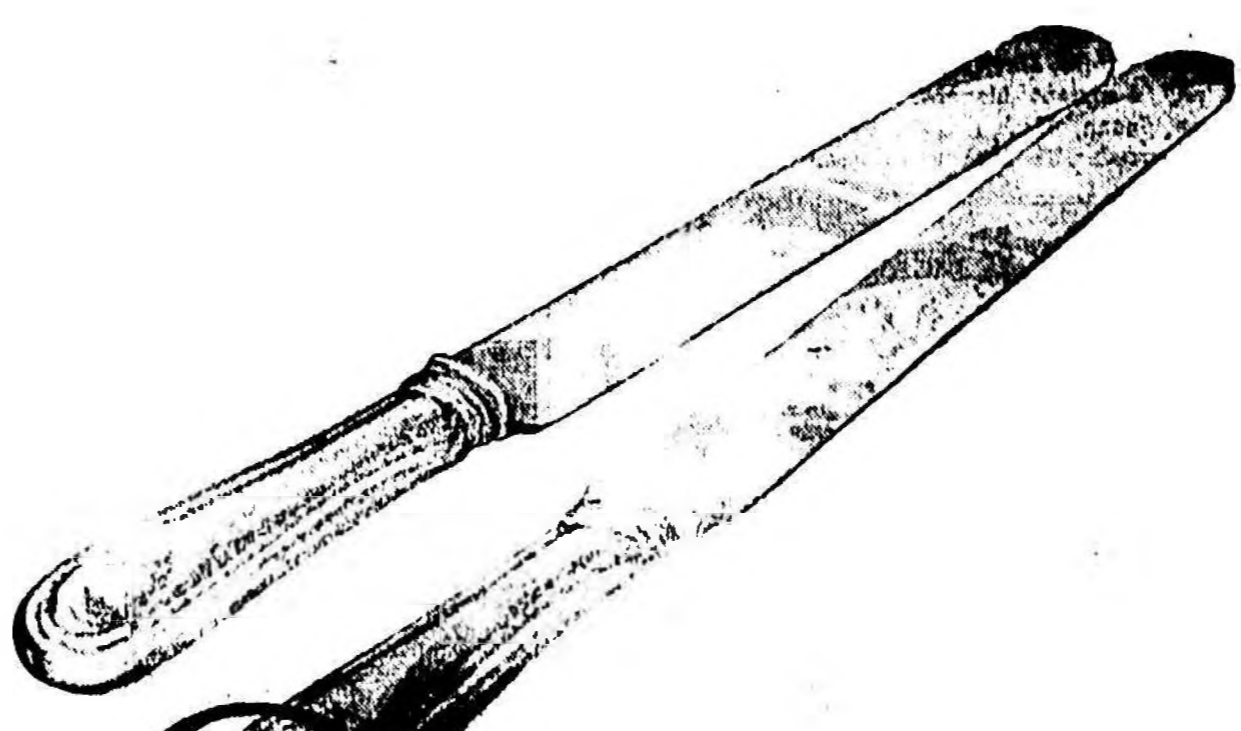

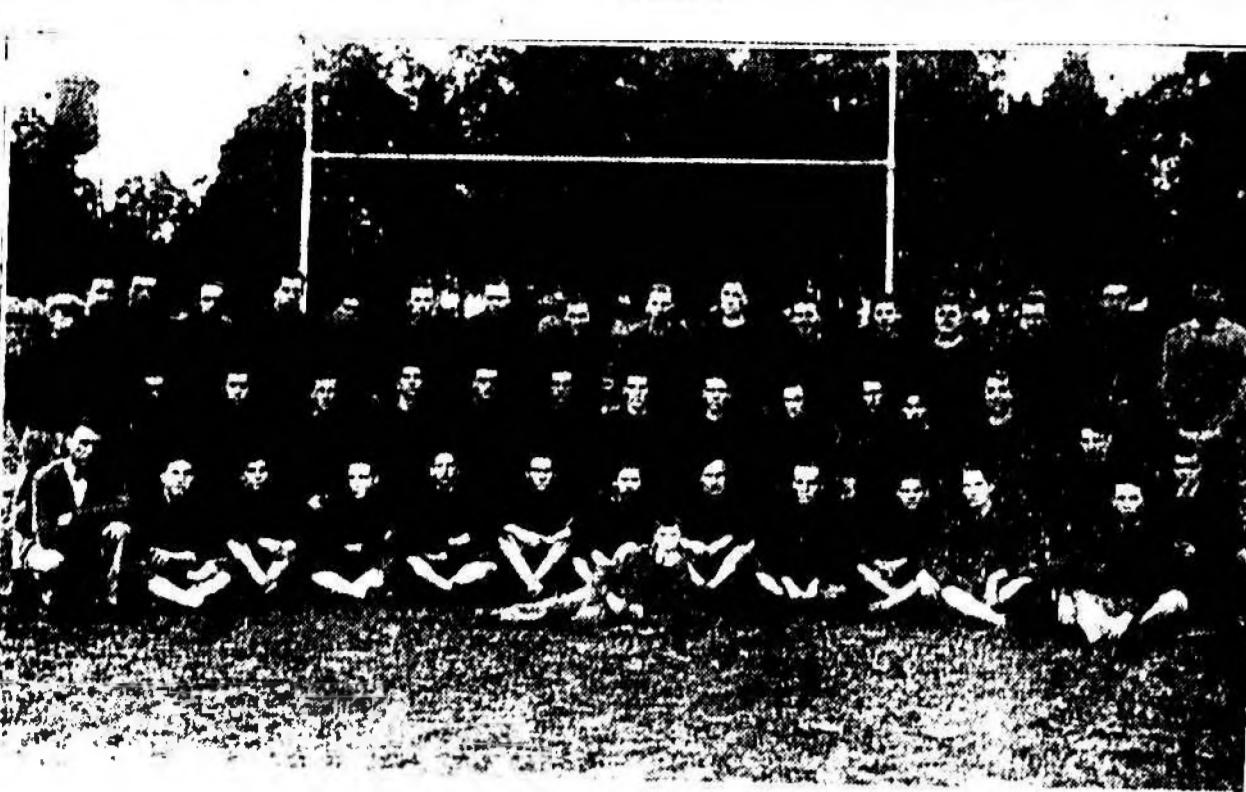
