State To Take Control

NEW YORK (AP) - Mayor Abraham D. Beame has agreed to relinquish the major share of the city's fiscal controls to the state in return for a massive infusion of state loans to avert city default on its debts. Although Beame denied that his fiscal powers were being further eroded, the agreement, in effect, gave Gov. Hugh L. Carey and State Controller Arthur Levitt full control over the city's budget revenue estimates and thus the power to control the city's expenditures.

Natural Gas Decision Awaited

WASHINGTON (AP) - A White House decision is expected in the next few weeks on ways to ease an expected

natural gas shortage this winter. The announcement Tuesday by Press Secretary Ron Nessen came amid published reports that President Ford may seek congressional authority to continue federal controls on propane gas through next winter. This bottled gas is widely used for heating and farm purposes.

Nessen said Ford is considering a number of steps to cushion the possible economic impact of his plans to veto extension of oil price control.

Major Heroin Ring Smashed

Federal Drug Officials Say MIAMI (AP) - The seizure of \$7.4-million worth of beroin and the arrest of a California couple here caps the cracking of a "major heroin smuggling cartel which reached from Bangkok, Thailand, to the East Coast.'

Spokesmen for the Drug Enforcement Administration and U.S Customs said Tuesday that a suitcase containing 13.6 pounds of heroin was seized from a baggage area of Miami International Airport.

Congress Prodded On Energy Program

President Ford has jarred Congress many times during the last year in an effort to get the Democratic majority to act on an over-all energy program for the United States of America, all to little avail.

However, none of the President's prodding was as stern and decisive as his recent announcemen at Vail, Colo., that he will let the price controls on 60 per cent of domestically produced oil expire at the end of this month by vetoing an extension proposed by Congress.

His decision was not an easy one to make during an election year when much can be made of rising prices, but it was the logical one. The need to conserve gasoline and oil is critical, and the few cents a gallon increase in the price of gasoline that decontrol will bring will make Americans more cautious about wasting.

Additionally, the United States cannot procastinate any longer in diminishing the political and economic problems that dependence upon Arab oil supplies brings. Decontrolling petroleum prices will help private oil firms in the United States acquire the capital they need for exploring and developing new energy sources. The capital needs, incidentally, have been estimated at a minimum of \$40 billion a year over the next 10 years. That is about the total revenue that the United States will collect this year from all corporate income taxes, and it is more than the total cash flow of the 25 biggest oil companies in the United States.

As President Ford said in Vail, the United States is "running out of time"-Congress should

A preferable course would have been for Congress to compromise with the administration before it left for its month-long recess — to phase out the price controls gradually.

Had Congress done so, the economic impact that higher gasoline prices will bring, which is expected to be relatively slight, would have been even more insignificant. President Ford will be able to cushion some of the impact, fortunately, by removing the \$2 tariff from the price of imported oil if his action at Vail is not overridden by

Congress can mitigate the economic impact still more by approving an excess profits that oil firms will get when decontrolled oil rises from \$5.25 per barrel to about \$11. The government could return the money to the economy readily by some method like a general income tax reduction.

If Congress overrides the President's veto, it has the obligation to come up with a constructive energy program of its own - something that it hasn't been able to do since October, 1973, despite the critical need.

The most foolish course that Congress could follow when it returns from recess early next month would be to continue its pointless, noncompromising confrontation with the administration.

Timor Government Flees To Offshore Island

MACAO (AP) - The government of war-torn Portuguese Timor fled early today from the capital of Dili to the offshore island of Atauro, the Portuguese government of Macao reported.

A government statement said the evacuation was ordered by Portuguese President Francisco da Costa Gomes following a heavy bombardment of Dili on Tuesday. The report said the casualty toll was increasing but it gave no figures.

The Macao freighter MacDili, which was in Dili harbor to remove refugees, was used for the evacuation, and "the whole operation went off very smoothly," the statement

The skipper of the MacDili said in a message received in the Australian port of Darwin that his ship braved a hail of gunfire to tow a flotilla of small boats containing the escaping governor, Lemos Pires, and his party to Atauro.

Delegates Work Backstage

LIMA, Peru (AP) - Angry challenges to the in dustrialized nations are dominating the public sessions of the conference of nonaligned nations. But delegates and aides are hard at work backstage on the basic economic problems of the Third World.

Political and economic working groups raced against a Thursday noon deadline for completion of proposals for the 81 nations attending the conference to sponsor at the special economic session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York next week and at the regular General Assembly session opening later in the month. One economic specialist predicted solid approval for a resolution calling for a giant development fund to be set up by the Third World nations themselves, with each pledging an equal initial amount and large voluntary contributions later.

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt (AP) — Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger says only "nuances" remain to be resolved in a new Israeli-Egytian agreement providing for another Israeli pullback in the Sinai Desert. Israeli officials in Jerusalem said today a key part of the pact already is complete and ready for signing. They said the completed section obliged both sides to refrain from "the use or threat of force" and was to be signed directly between Israel and Egypt. Kissinger reported "remarkable progress" in the

negotiations after his arrival from Israel late Tuesday afternoon to confer with President Anwar Sadat.

One-Time Ethiopian King Selassie Dies

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia (AP) — Haile Selassie, the diminutive strong man who ruled Ethiopia as the "King of Kings" for 58 years before he was deposed by the military last September, died today. He was 83. The government said the former monarch was found dead in his bed by a servant early this

In Washington, intelligence sources said an Addis Ababa radio broadcast reported that Selassie died as a result of illness affecting his prostate gland. Last May, Selassie was reported seriously ill with a prostate condition.


