

### Earthquake Topples Buildings,

MEXICO CITY (UPI) - An earthquake rocked a wide area of Mexico for 60 seconds early today, toppling several buildings and causing blackouts in a residential section of Mexico City. There were no immediate reports

The University of California's seismograph station at Berkeley rated the quake at 7.5 on the open-ended Richter

The Mexican radio said the quake was felt as far north as the industrial city of Monterrey. 600 miles northeast of Mexico City, and as far south as Oaxaca, Berkeley, 320 miles from the capital The quake's epicenter was believed to be in southern Mexico.

### Vietnam Charges War Crimes

BANGKOK, Thailand (UPI) - Vietnam today formally accused invading Chinese troops of murdering and raping civilians, including seven children they "chopped. . . into

Radio Hanoi said a war crimes commission was established to present evidence of alleged atrocities to the United Nations and the world. It said experts also will be sent to Cambodia to collect evidence the Peking-backed Khmer Rouge government massacred hundreds of thousands of residents before it was overthrown. Establishment of the war crimes commission indicated Vietnam expects repeated conflicts with China, analysts said.

### **Border Clashes Halted**

BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI) - Border clashes between Marxist South Yemen and pro-Western North Yemen have ceased and the two countries are moving to reestablish normal relations, Arab League mediators said. ### On Talmadge Prosecution

WASHINGTON (UPI) - The Justice Department is delaying a decision on whether to prosecute Sen. Herman Talmadge, D-Ga., or his former top aide for operating a secret bank account until Senate hearings into misconduct charges are concluded.

The decision virtually assures that Talmadge's chief accuser - his former administrative assistant, Daniel Minchew - will not be under indictment when he testifies against Talmadge in the Senate Ethics Committee. If Minchew had been indicted, his credibility would be damaged at the hearings scheduled to start April 23. He and Talmadge have been engaged in a one-on-one battle over culpability since last summer when existence of the secret bank account containing \$39,000 was disclosed.

### A Blow To Energy Supplies

By UNITED PRESS INTERNATIONAL Standard Oil of Ohio and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, in two separate actions, have dealt potentially serious blows to East Coast energy supplies. In Cleveland Tuesday, Sohio announced its decision to abandon a \$1 billion crude oil pipeline designed to transport Alaskan oil from the glutted California market to eastern markets.

At the same time, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission in Washington ordered five East Coast atomic power plants closed within 48 hours because their cooling systems "may" be unable to withstand earthquakes.

### Plant Issue Unresolved

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Retreating from the pronuclear stance of the Energy Department, members of a federal task force question whether more atomic power plants should be built before nuclear waste problems are

The issue of new reactors was one of several left unresolved by the 14-agency task force that has studied the waste disposal problem for the past year. Another dealt with the pace of efforts to provide sites where radioactive waste can be kept safely for thousands of

The group's final report, prepared for submission to President Carter, echoed uncertainty expressed by some 15 state governments that have, in effect, banned new atomic power plants pending resolution of the waste disposal issue.

### Carter Can't Take Blame For It All

There are a lot of armchair strategists and statesmen who are faulting President Carter these days for his conduct of foreign policy.

We hear cries of "Chamberlain" and "give-

away" and "patsy" and "weakness." It is popular to suggest that under other leadership, this country would never be a "pitiful, helpless giant" but would be a strong and stern policeman imposing peace and order upon a grateful world.

Unfortunately, it isn't true. The critics, many of whom are seeking President Carter's job, aren't too specific about what they would do different. One writer suggested that Carter should attempt to mediate between China and Russia on the issue of the Chinese invasion of Russia's client. Vietnam. One would have thought that attempting to mediate between the Arabs and the Jews in the Middle East would have been enough to make all Americans wary of the prospects of mediating between the two

Communist superpowers in the Far East. The clarion call for leadership sounds simple and clear. But it is meaningless without specifics. What would the critics have done in Mexico City to compel a more positive outcome? What would they have done in Tehran to save the shah or substitute a more moderate government or stave off the revolution?

What are the credible alternatives in today's

We have a system of self-government in which in the final analysis the people make their own foreign policy. If there are no easy answers — and we believe there are none in this period of reaction against the tragedies of Vietnam and Watergate it does no good to suggest that simple answers can

If it becomes necessary that the American people gird themselves for new measures of selfcontrol, discipline and sacrifice — and we believe it may very well soon become mecessary for trades measures to be taken — it is irresponsible to encourage them to blame all their problems on their

The world today is a difficult and dangerous place. We need leaders not only in the White House but also in the political opposition and in the media who are willing to acknowledge the difficulties and the dangers without blaming the current occupant of the White House for all of them.

# LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (UPI)-A baby born Feb. 9 with his heart completely outside his body has undergone three operations and may be the first baby in medical history to

survive the birth defect and be able to live a normal life. Only one other - a boy in Philadelphia - has lived through the operation and subsequent complications that are part of ectopia cordis, or "outside heart." But, he must have artificial breathing assistance. Five-week-old James Leake Jr., however, is breathing

on his own and taking all food by mouth, doctors say. According to the child's mother, Rowena Leake, the boy Dr. Doyne Williams, chief of cardiac surgery at the University of Arkansas Medical Sciences Campus who

headed the surgical team, said Mrs. Leake's pregnancy had been normal and doctors had no warning of the birth

Williams and Dr. J.B. Norton, a pediatric cardiologist arrived at Doctors Hospital within 30 minutes of the child's birth. Using a new emergency van outfitted with medical equipment, he was moved to University Hospital and within three hours had undergone the first corrective

surgery.

Three days were allowed for Jimmy to adjust to his heart's new position. Then he was returned to surgery where Williams, Dr. James Campbell and Dr. Clay Wellborn were able to place the heart almost completely beneath the sternum near its normal position in the chest. In the third operation Feb. 19, skin grafts were removed from the baby's flank and moved to areas on his chest and abdomen where other skin had been borrowed. For the duration the operations, Jimmy was on a ventilator and fed intravenously. Two weeks ago, he was

given food via a tube to his stomach, and gradual weaning from the ventilator began. and has been fed orally. Like all babies who have undergone surgery, he is kept in an oxygen tent, the doctors
