I WAS THINKING OF THEM TODAY when I came across the story of Juan, a little 12-year-old who lived in Spanish Harlem for about a year. The rest of them are still there, and Juan got out, but the question is moot, as they say, whether as got the break or the kids who stayed behind did.

Five years ago, a friendly but not wealthy Puerto Rican couple came across him in a little town. He was hungry and he was lost. They were generous people and they took him into their family and for three years he was happy with them.

Then, two years ago, they all climbed into one of the bucket-seat planes and flew up to New York. There was only one place for them to go, of course.

Their lack of money made them choose Spanish Harlem automatically. If they had had money, landlords in New York have & habit of looking the other way or fiddling impatiently with the "No Vacancy" sign, if apartment applicants are not white and reasonably Anglo-Baxon.

For a little while Juan was happy-unsettled by the roar and flash of the city, but happy with his foster parents. Then the father died and almost simultaneously Juan was stricken with rheumatic heart disease.

Have you ever known a rheumatic heart victim? I have known several, all adults, and those that have lived through it are men who have put part of the world behind them. It is a violently erippling disease and it has a habit of leaving its victims hanging on a thin thread over the pit of death. They tell us that heart disease is the greatest of all killers.

Well-nearly half of all heart deaths, at any age, are prompted by sheumatic heart disease.

JUAN SPENT A FEW MONTES In a hospital and then went up

to Irvington House, in Irvington-on-Hudson, N. Y. I don't want this column to begin sounding like a pitch for all the charities there ever were. Charities are fine and I contribute to some (although my income tag deductions are a trifle cloudy on this point), but you cannot write about them all the time, because people can only take so much in a single vein-so much comedy, so much tragedy, so much pathos. However, they seem to have Juan straightened out a little up at Irvington House and I thought It was worth mentioning.
