





Maverick Ousts Democratic

Appeals Judge

OCOEE (AP) — A political maverick who ran third in a field of three for the state legislature in 1963 scored a stunning upset in Tuesday's election when he was named judge of the Fourth District Court of Appeal, the second highest court in the

Spencer Cross, a 44-year-old bachelor city attorney in this tiny West Orange County community, rode a Republican wave of votes to oust incumbent Judge Sherman Smith of Vero Beach. When the votes were counted, Cross' public income jumped from \$200 a month in Ocoee to \$20,000 a year as Appeals Court

Running in the new 10-county district, created by the 1965 legislature, Cross defeated Smith 154,526 to 129,379.

The Appeals Court District covers Brevard, Indian River, Osceola, Okeechobee, Palm

Beach, Martin, St. Lucie, Seminole, Broward and Orange Counties.

Smith, a Democrat, had been considered a shoo-in for election and was supported by the Bar Association in each of the dis-

cross was named city attorney of Ocoee in 1953 following his graduation from the University of Miami Law School.

A native of Butler, Ga., he moved to Ocoee in 1935 and attended Rollins College prior to earning his law degree.

He was registered as a Democrat until 1955, then switched

He tried to qualify as a GOP candidate for the state legislature in 1958 but was turned down when he could not qualify under

An all-male jury Wednesday night decreed the full penalty — death in the electric chair — for three youths charged with rape. The decision took four hours.

In earlier testimony, the Miami Beach girl told jurors: "They should be fully punished for what they did. I want them to die."

Sentenced to death were John F. Smalley, 19, Samuel Choice, 20, and Robert Gissendanner, 18, all of suburban West Holly-

The sentence was automatic as the jury did not recommend mercy.

The pretty, 18-year-old victim said the youths forced her into a car while she was walking down a street the night of Jan. 13. While she screamed and fought, she said, they drove her to an empty house and assaulted her.

Not only the Republicans but the dissident Democrats and the dissatisfied independents "came out of the woodwork" and clobbered the Democratic party faithful . . . not only in Florida but practically the whole nation.


It was more than disunity among the Democrats that brought on the surprising Republican victories.

Political pundits are busily engaged in analyzing the results of Tuesday's elections and what brought on the upsets. They see a tiredness for the Great Society, a desire for a slow down of the federal handouts smacking somewhat of socialism, an earnest yearning for the end of the war in Viet Nam although willing and able and ready to support American forces there until an honorable end is accomp-

In other words, the American public was ready for a change . . . and brought it on through the right of ballot. It will be interesting to see the ultimate results, which will be the campaigns of 1968.

This column, like many others, felt all along a change was wanted, but, unlike so many others, couldn't see the woods for the trees. Looking at the preponderance of registered Democrats over Republicans in Florida, of the labor and Negro blocs pledged to the Democratic gubernatorial candidate, and a century-old tradition . . . this column could see nothing but a Democratic victory. So . . . how wrong.
