### South Seminole Mansion Robbed

A South Seminole mansion was robbed over serveral thousand dollars worth of furs and jewels in a Thursday afternoon burglary, according to Seminole County Sheriff John Polk.

Sheriff Polk said the Spring Valley Estates home of Ralph Kennedy, an Orlando food company executive, was entered and family jewelry and furs amounting to several thousand dollars were removed.

officers who launched an intensive investigation.

Willoughby, wanted in connection with the burying of a truck owned by the company which empolyed him, had voluntarily turned himself over to authorities and was placed in lieu of total \$10,000 bonds for destruction of private property and grand larceny charges in
