NEW YORK, Sept. 21 .-(AP) -A stolid, mild-manpered German who fidgeted during extensive questioning in police line-up, displayed no emotion today when a magistrate held him without bail on a charge of receiving the \$50,000 paid him two years ago by Colonel Lindbergh in a futile attempt to ransom his kidnaped son.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 22. -(AP) -- The United Textile Workers today ordered an end to the most serious strike In the history of the textile industry, and instructed all workers to return to their mills on Monday.

In the presence of William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor and other high ranking union officials, Francia Gorman, chairman of the Strike Committee announced.

"We have now gained every substantial thing that we can gain in this striks. Our strike has torn apart the whole unjust structure of NRA, lifting a load from all labor as well as from ourselves."

By telegraph, the striks committee wat the following to all local unions: "By the unanimous vote of the executive council your heroic strike ends in a complete victory as of tonight. A full report will be mailed at once to all local unions. Our triumph is one of the greatest in all labor history and your officers salute you.

"Report to work Monday morning an orderly as you walked out, onselous of having won your ights, and determined to maintain the same fine discipline in the hame way it was displayed in battle. Now bend all efforts everywhere to complete organization of wery worker in the industry.

"Washington headquarters will be maintained permanently and from here we shall at once begin pletely. Organization campaigns will be directed from this office and you will receive instruction number one, new series, soon.
