#### Is In Accordance With The Protocol

Fifth Session of Body Adjourns Following Strenuous Sessions

GENEVA, Oct. 3.-The Council of the league of nations decided today to hold a special meeting Nov. 15, probably in Geneva, to elaborate upon plans for an international conference on reduction of armaments provided for in the arbitration and security protocol which is planned for

The fifth assembly of the league ended its labors Thursday by nushimously adopting a resolution recommending that all states accept the protocol of arbitration and re-

Apart from the etaboration of the protocol for the peaceful settlement of international disputes, the outstanding feature of the bassions are the insistence of the delegates that economic problems, popularly regarded as belong ne exclusively to the domestic furlsan international basis, if all causes of war really would be removed. This insistence was volced by sevreaenting France, it is implied in the protocol itself, and for a time dominated the discussions of the European jurists as they strove to fashion a pact which would notunduly alarm all nations which jealously guard the doctrine of state's rights.
