Their biggest procedural move so far is breaking away from the parent organization in Orange County in order to meet the particular needs of Seminole counties.

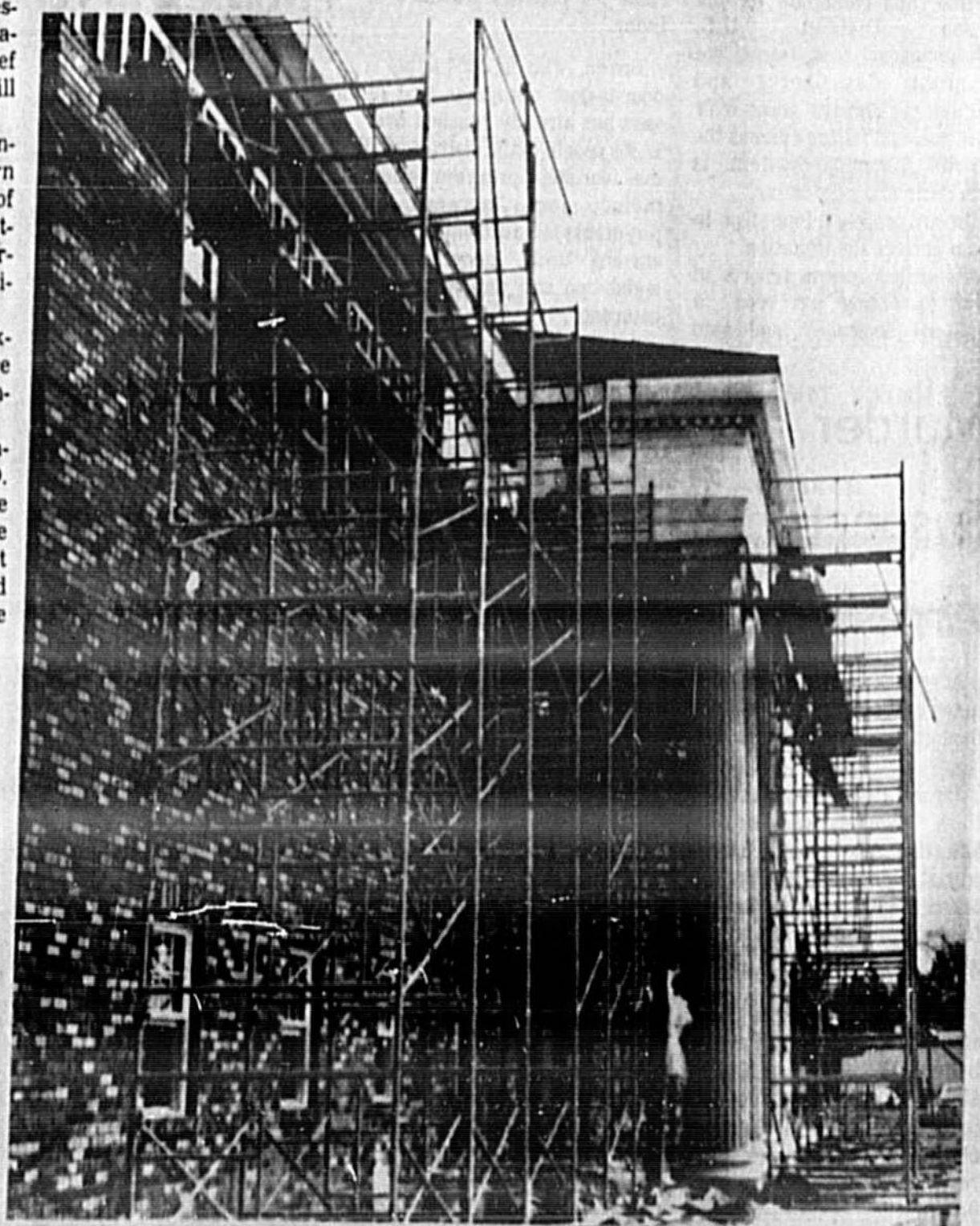
Wheat Deal Characterized As A \$300 Million Error
