

Celery Market Reports

All Of His Works Were Noted For Particu-Olar Care For Detail

LONDON, Mar. 28—(AP)— Each Arnold Bennett, one of the leading figures in the world of literature, died of typhoid fever at the age of \$3.

Between 1898 and 1925 Hennett produced some 30 novels and more than a dozen plays. All his works abow meticulous detail. Hennett was known to devote an entire page to the description of the tits of a clock.

The man who wrote the stories of the Five Towns started his literary work as an assistant edi-tor of "Woman." For seven years he was assistant editor, then editer; of the magazine.

he was assistant editor, then editor, of the magazine.

Atnold Bennett never was destined by his parents to be an author. He was trained for the law. He was born at Hanley in Staffordshire, in the potteries district, May 27, 1867, and christened "Enoch Arnold Bennett." He was educated at the New Castle School and placed in a lawyer's office. There he remained until he was 26. Duruing the time he was supposed to be poring over cases, syllabuses and commentaries, he was trying his hand at composing articles. When the opportunity to join the staff of "Woman" came he eagerly took advantage of it.

In 1900 Bennet: withdrew from the ed torial office and went to the country to devote himself polely to his novels. His and fallowed in rapid succession, is 1866 he founded his reputation with "Old Wives Tales." Later came. Clayhanger, "Hilds Lessways" and "The Roll Call." These were all realistic novels of the commonfolk of the English midlands, where he was born. They are raised for the

Commenting on what he considered the enormities of style committed by present-day writers, Bennett cited a sentence in a much discussed popular novel, which reads:

"Thus he literally pulled his eyes away and fixed them upon the piece of cake in his hand."

Bennett romphained that the author falled to describe the empty eye sockets.

In 1926 Bennett declared that the two best books of fiction he read during the year were by American writers—Theodore Dreiser's "An American Tragedy," and Herman Melville's "Pierre," written years before.

Bennett lived in Cadegan Square, London He was a member of many London clubs, including the Authors' National Liberal and United Aria.

Both men graduated from West Point not long before the Musican War and served with distinction at Contress, and Churubusco. At Chapultapec Pickett's courageous conduct resulted in a promotion; while Longstreet was severely wounded, At the outbreak of the Civil War, both men promptly resigned from the federal service and accepted appointments in the Confederate Army. Pickett soon became a brigadier general in Longstreet's division, which made a name for itself in the first battle of Buil Rim, Seven Days' Battle, Fredericksburg, Gettysburg, Chickamsuga, the battles of the Wilderness, where Longstreet was again seriously wounded. In the meantime Pickett had been given command of the department of Northern Virginia. Longstreet, following his recovery, was made a Lieutenant General.

History contains few finer examples of the skillful soldier than these two men, and much of the remarkable success of Lee's almost superhuman offorta against two welming odds can be credited to such splendid soldiers as Longstreet and Pickett, as well as Jackson, Johnston, and Stuart.







