Carter Blasts Reagan For 'Quicksilver' Economic Plan

Hollywood Chapter Rejects Actors' Pact

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — Local members of the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists have rejected the proposed contract aimed at ending the longest actors' strike in history.

The Hollywood Chapter, the first of five AFTRA chapters to cast ballots on the tentative pact, voted, 228-220, Monday night to reject the proposal. A short time later, the San Francisco region voted, 51-7, to support the pact.

The next regional voting takes place Wednesday in Washington, D.C.

Stone Not Target In Peanut Oil Probe

MIAMI (UPI) — A top official of the Justice Department says Sen. Richard Stone, D-Fla., is neither the target nor the subject of a grand jury investigation into allegations that the Frito-Lay Co. was able to corner most of the peanut oil market in 1977.

Assistant Attorney General Philip Heymann told UPI in Washington Monday, "Senator Stone is a target of that investigation, not a subject of it. Any claim to the contrary are simply mistaken."

The Florida U.S. Senator, reacting to a report in a Dallas newspaper, also denied knowledge of or involvement in the alleged deal.

Stone, who faces a tough Democratic runoff primary in Florida today against Bill Gunter, said his only involvement in the matter was to recommend to Agriculture Secretary Bob Bergland in June 1977 — along with Sen. Herman Talmadge, D-Ga., — that 78.1 million pounds of peanuts sold by the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service be sold on the world market to India.

Radiation Slows Liver Cancer

BALTIMORE (UPI) — A unique way of delivering high doses of radiation to inoperable liver cancer is adding months to patients' lives by shrinking tumors, and doctors say the technique may work against other cancers too.

The treatment developed by Dr. Stanley E. Geisler of the Johns Hopkins Cancer Center floods cancer cells with continuous low radiation for days or even weeks while sparing normal tissue.
