





Russians Lay Seige To Big City Of Kiev

Reuters Dispatch Reports Nazi Battleships Sabotaged By Rebellious Crews

(Ny tanociated Press) The Russians continued for footholds on the west bank of the broad Dnieper River. Kiev was under seige guns and apparently is ready for an encircling movement. In the Pacific the Australlans are driving on Finschhaven in New Guinea and were within three quarters of m mile of the Jupanese defenders.


