Congress Set To Vote On Aid To College Bills

WASHINGTON (UPI) -The Senate was scheduled to at the time because three begin voting today on a series visiting businessmen were of controversial amendments present in Colorado Springs, to the college aid bill support- Colo., when the warning was ed by President Kennedy.

Sen. Wayne Morse, D.-Ore., floor manager for the bill, said he would vote against two of the measures. One is a proposal to limit construction aid to public colleges and universities. The other would expand the college aid bill to include \$325 million over two years to assist states in building public

grade and high schools. Supporters of the \$2.6 billion bill have argued that such amendments would cripple the bill and cause its defeat.

The measure, far broader than the one passed last week by the House, would authorize federal assistance over five years for construction of college classrooms, grants to community junior colleges and scholarships for needy and talented American youths,

Under the bill, private and parochial schools would be eligible for low-interest construction loans,

Morse has said he doubts if a final vote on the bill would come before Tuesday.



We continue to hear two kinds of predictions: downtown retailing is continuing to decline or downtown retailing is beginning the upswing. Take your pick. In a recent address
Professor Malcolm McNair of Harvard said there will be further shrinkage of downtown retail activity. This will be true because the population exodus to the green-acred suburbs is still underway, he says.

But even if this is true as revealed in macro-statistics covering the nation as a whole, is it true for every specific city and its downtown? Obviously not. Many downtowns can be cited which are doing better in terms of dollar volume or of physical volume of goods sold. On the other hand, few downtowns today hold the big share of their region's total mar-

That's not in the cards. Nor is it really important.

At the local level countless predictions, based on local facts, indicate real growth potential for downtowns. But this is predicted on downtown being revitalized, modernized, improved and promoted. It is not automatic.

Careful analysis on one city showed that over the next 25 years downtown could boom its retail volume (in constant dollars) by nearly 200 percent. This would be true if downtown did a top notch job of revitlaizing itself.

If it does less, the gain will be less. A clear conclusion is that national trends notwithstanding, countless individual downtowns have solid stability and even enormous growth potential in the retailing sector. Dreaming won't make it so, but downtown action, courage and invest-






