#### The "Commodity Dollar"

One of the effects of the NRA campaign, which, raising industrial wages, has also raised the prices of manufactured products, thus further increasing the disparity which exists between the prices of industry and ngriculture, coupled with the persistent demands for inflation from the leaders of the farm bloc, who somehow mistakenly believe that this white rabbit will increase the prices of farm products without proportionately increasing the prices of manufactures, has brought on more talk of the "commodity dollar."

This monetary system differs from the gold standard in that the amount of currency issued does not vary in proportion with the gold reserve, but in proportion with the price level. When a period of over-production exists such as the present and prices have a tendency to decline, the amount of currency in circulation would be increased, making money cheaper, and relatively increasing prices. The purpose would be to vary the quantity or the value of the currency in circulation so as to keep average prices always at a given level.



#### The "Commodity Dollar"

One of the effects of the NRA campaign, which, raising industrial wages, has also raised the prices of manufactured products, thus further increasing the disparity which exists between the prices of industry and agriculture, coupled with the persistent demands for inflation from the leaders of the farm bloc, who somehow mistakenly believe that this white rabbit will increase the prices of farm products without proportionately increasing the prices of manufactures, has brought on more talk of the "commodity dollar."

This monetary system differs from the gold standard in that the amount of currency issued does not vary in proportion with the gold reserve, but in proportion with the price level. When a period of over-production exists such as the present and prices have a tendency to decline, the amount of currency in circulation would be increased, making money cheaper, and relatively increasing prices. The purpose would be to vary the quantity or the value of the currency in circulation so as to keep average prices always at a given level.
