Voters approve new fire station

Construction on new emergency facility could begin as early as March

LAKE MARY — The bond referendum for a new fire station was approved by a majority of the city's voters who went to the polls on Tuesday.

Seventy-five percent of the voters approved the measure, with 3,303 votes in favor and 1,088 against the issuing of \$4 million worth of bonds. Now that the referendum has passed, construction on the proposed facility could begin as early as March.

"I was hopeful it would pass," Lake Mary City Commissioner Gary Brender said Tuesday night. "But, I thought it would. The

Lake Mary Commission and the citizens within the community are aware of the importance of security in general. Police and fire are the hallmark in what cities need to do for security.

"I believe our citizens came out and will continue to come out for the city's fire and police services," Brender said. "I am glad to see that our single issue went through."

According to the city's timeline, the bonds will be posted in January, Brender said.

"By March or April, we will hopefully see some things happening for the new station, as well as the City Hall expansion," he said.

The need for a new fire station has been apparent for several years. Two years ago, \$180,000 was allocated in the city's budget for the design of the proposed facility.

The current design proposal includes a 20,000 square-foot facility that will house administration, building and safety staff and emergency response equipment crews. Plans include demolishing the department's

current facility on Rinehart Road and constructing a new building on the site. Temporary facilities will house emergency crews while the new station is under construction.

Tuesday's vote is the second time in the past several years the citizens of Lake Mary have approved a new emergency services facility. Construction on the new Lake Mary Police Department was completed almost two years ago. Along with the new fire station, the Commission has also planned for a City Hall expansion project that will include a sub-station for the fire department.

Residents oppose plans for new city development

SANFORD — A proposed townhouse development in the city's southeast sector is drawing criticism from nearby residents.

The 114-unit development is planned for a 25-acre tract next to the Rose Hill and Baker's Crossing subdivisions, off of South Sanford Avenue. Barry Walker, the project's developer, will ask the Sanford Planning and Zoning Commission to rezone the property from agriculture to PD-Planned Development.

Judy Long, a resident of Rose Hill, said she and her neighbors held a meeting in early October to organize against the development. Long said her neighbors are concerned about a lot of issues, namely how the new development will affect drainage.

"There are wetlands in the area, and already we have problems with water," Long said.

City Staff has identified potential problems with low areas and is recommending that 2.4 acres in the southeast portion of the property be dedicated to the St. Johns River Water Management District. In addition, any changes to the existing wetlands will have to be mitigated according to St. John's standards.

Residents are also concerned about the compatibility of the townhouses next to one-story single-family homes, as well as the buffer and screening requirements and the impact of traffic.

"It's not that we are against development," Long said. "We know this area will be developed. However, we want to make sure that any new projects are compatible with the area and doesn't create problems."

"There's not a single person who would say no to this development," Long added. "If it were single-family homes similar to what we have, and well designed, this project doesn't fit, and I find it hard to believe that the developers couldn't come up with a better plan."

Planning and Zoning commissioner will take the matter up for the first time during their Thursday, Nov. 7 meeting, which begins at 7 p.m. in City Hall.

Seminole County stays with incumbents

SANFORD — Voters in Seminole County stayed with the incumbents, sending U.S. Reps John Mica and Corrine Brown back to Washington.

With 95 percent of the county vote tabulated in the District 7 race, Mica defeated challenger Wayne Hogan by a 2-to-1 margin. Mica received 33,875 votes to 16,014 for Hogan.

In District 3, Brown garnered 60 percent of the vote, defeating Jennifer Carroll with 3,364 votes to the challenger's 2,258.

In the race for governor, Seminole County voters chose Gov. Jeb Bush over Democrat Bill McBride. Bush received 72,805 votes, 64 percent, while McBride earned 40,339 votes.

In the newly created District 24 for U.S. Congress, Tom Feeney defeated Harry Jacobs by a nearly 2-to-1 margin, with 95 percent of Seminole County precincts reporting. Feeney, the outgoing speaker of the Florida House, received 37,022 votes, while Jacobs received 19,006 votes.

Locally, Republican Sandy Adams outpaced the Libertarian candidate, James Coakley, for Feeney's former Florida House seat. Adams received 24,309 votes in District 33, while Coakley received 6,557 votes.

In the District 34 Florida House Race,

Republican incumbent David Meador easily won re-election. Meador received 27,562 votes, while Libertarian challenger Christopher Wheeler received 8,726 votes.

"I'm just thankful the race is over," Meador said. "It's absolutely honor to have the opportunity to serve the people. I want to concentrate on diversifying our economy, particularly in the high-tech sector, and con-

Deputies find missing child

A missing 17-month-old child was turned over to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office after investigators became concerned for the child's safety.

The female child was brought to the Seminole County Sheriff's Office by a relative just after 4 p.m. Tuesday.

Investigators believe the child was in danger after apparently being in custody of her father, 43-year-old Thomas Reynolds. Reynolds is only supposed to have limited, supervised, contact with his daughter.

Deputies believe the child's mother, 41-year-old Denise Reynolds, for unspecified reasons, contacted the child's father.

Both face the possibility of arrest after apparently trying, for the past few days, to avoid investigators, who had concerns over the safety of the child.

The child is under the supervision of the court and SC SO Child Protective Services, and had not been seen since Oct. 24. The family's last known address was supposedly the Suburban Lodge at State Road 436 and Oxford Road in Casselberry.

Investigators did make phone contact with the parents, but they were unwilling to meet with deputies. The two adults apparently had a relative bring the child to the Sheriff's Office Tuesday to give the child to the Child Protective Services team, rather than face law enforcement officials.

The elder Reynolds is of concern to law enforcement, due to past arrests involving domestic violence, drug abuse, as well as threats to harm a law enforcement officer, and to discharge an explosive device at juvenile court.

Prior to a July 8 custody hearing, Reynolds allegedly made a threat by telephone, claiming he would show up to court on the date with explosives strapped to his body.

Reynolds was most recently booked into the Seminole County Jail on Oct. 20 on that charge. He bonded out later that day.

17-92 railroad crossing to close for rebuilding

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has announced work will begin Friday, Nov. 8, on rebuilding of a railroad crossing on U.S. Highway 17-92 (French Avenue) in Sanford, in the vicinity of 6th Street.

The work, to be performed by CSX Transportation Inc. crews and subcontractors, will necessitate total closure of French Avenue at the crossing beginning at 8 p.m. Friday, Nov. 8 and continuing until no later than 6 a.m. Monday. The rubberized crossing base will be replaced with concrete segments and a single welded section of

track spanning the entire four-lane roadway will be installed.

There are actually two rail crossings in the vicinity of 6th Street. The work the weekend of Nov. 8 will be on the northernmost of the two. A second project, rebuilding the southernmost of those crossings will be accomplished the weekend of Nov. 22, beginning at 8 p.m. Friday, and ending by no later than 6 a.m. Monday, Nov. 25.

Except for the 6th Street area closings, the rest of 17-92 will remain open for local traffic up to the rail crossings. The 2001 average daily traffic along this section of US 17-92 was 3,500 vehicles.

A third crossing, in the vicinity of 13th Street, is to be reconstructed after the Christmas/New Year holidays. Variable message signs advising motorists of the impending road closures will be in place at the approaches to the railroad crossings one week in advance of each project.

CSX Transportation, Inc. will be reimbursed by the FDOT for the cost of the three projects, which total an estimated \$452,000.

Other upcoming railroad crossing reconstruction projects include crossings on SR-46 west of Meltonville Avenue in Sanford, and SR-144 just west of CR-427 in Longwood. Both will occur after the holiday period.

Gator Chaser Head Race returning to Lake Monroe for second year

SANFORD — The boats are coming back to town.

The Gator Chaser Head Race, formerly the Head of Lake Monroe Regatta, is returning to Sanford Saturday for the second consecutive year. More than 1,500 rowers, about 25 teams, are expected to compete in the day-long event.

"We had a good response from

the rowing community following last year's event," said Ezra Simmons of Mitty Events, the organizer for the regatta. "We also are receiving continued support from the Greenberg Traurig Law firm."

The event will feature top competitors from high schools, college and masters level rowers from the entire Southeast. Olympic hopeful and Rollins College alumni Gavin Frase will also be participating in the race.

the presenters would like to see the event become a regional event, incorporating rowers from throughout the southeast.

"We want to show people what Florida rowing is all about," he said.

The fun won't be limited to waters of Lake Monroe. Food and other vendors will be on shore for both spectators and racers.

tinue to enhance our education system. Improving our schools is the key doing the things we want to do.

"I also look forward to helping the city of Sanford during the next two years," Meador added. "I really believe Sanford is on the move and will become a real gem in our community."

Commenting on the key Republican victories in Seminole County and the state, Meador said the voters believe his party is on the right track.

"I believe it is validation of the policies put in place by the current administration," Meador said. "Our state and our country has faced some difficult times and I think we have weathered it better than some of our neighbors in other states. I think that's a direct result of the current team we have in place."

There was one county race on the ballot. Seminole County Commissioner Randy Morris was challenged by write-in candidate W. Alan Peltz. Morris won easily by more than 80,000 votes.

Amendment 6 passed easily in Seminole County, with 76,706 voters approving the ban, while 36,867 people voted against the measure, with 95 percent of the precincts reporting.

Amendment 9 was much closer. With 95 percent of the

precincts counted, Seminole County voters appeared to have approved the measure 56,731 to 53,667.

Barringer zooms to top in Florida

WINTER SPRINGS — Oviedo's Jenny Barringer continued her amazing season last Thursday by becoming the first girl in Florida to break into the 17's this season at the Seminole Athletic Conference Championships at Central Winds Park.

Barringer, a sophomore, posted a 17:58.4 in the 5K race to outdistance Lake Mary senior Jessica Zabel, who ran a season's best 18:56.6, the ninth-best time in the state this year.

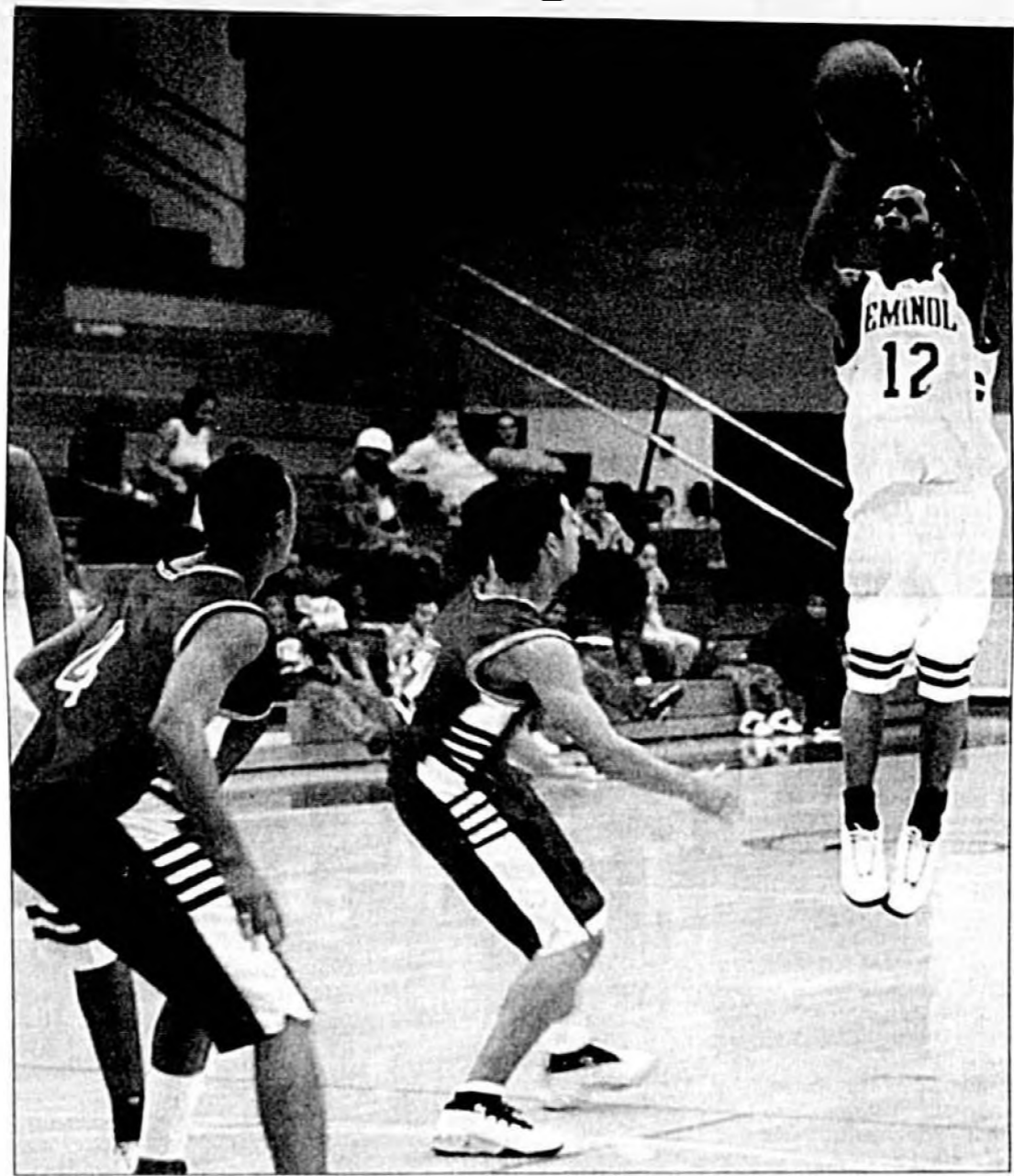
SANFORD — It's way too early to get overly excited, but this may be a special year for the Seminole Community men's basketball team.

Playoff spot on line for Patriots

LAKE MARY — As if this game wasn't intense enough.

While the Lake Brantley-Lake Mary football game lost some of its meaning when the two teams were placed in different classes in 2001, this year's game picked up some added incentive on Monday.

The West Seminole County neighborhood rivals have always marked this game on the schedule, but this year's game means almost everything to the Patriots if they hope to make a return trip to the playoffs.

Lake Brantley had a 50-50 chance of earning one of the two At-Large bids available from Class 6A-Region 1 when it crushed Sandalwood, 41-0, in Jacksonville Friday night.

But those odds went down on Monday after Winter Park (7-2) won a three-team playoff for the Class 6A-District 3 title.

Boone (8-1) wound up as the district runner-up with Oak Ridge, also 8-1, being left on the outside looking in.

But, because the Patriots are the only team that can get as many as eight victories, they have locked up one of the two At-Large spots.

The leaves Lake Brantley, Dr. Phillips (both 6-3) and Mandarin (5-4) in the hunt for the final spot.

The Patriots clinch the spot if they win and the Panthers lose. But if Lake Brantley loses and Dr. Phillips beats Oak Ridge, the Panthers would get in.

Now comes the tricky part. Mandarin can only get in if it wins its game with Wolfson (3-6) and the other two lose, giving all three teams a 6-4 record.

Since the three remaining teams have not played this season, head-to-head does not come into effect.

The first tie-breaker then becomes the total number of victories by the trio's opponents.

Syracuse squeezes past UCF, 38-35

ORLANDO — Junior quarterback Ryan Schneider set a new school record with 440 yards passing but it was not enough as Syracuse rallied from a 21-3 deficit to defeat UCF, 38-35 Saturday night at the Citrus Bowl in Orlando.

The two teams combined for 935 yards of total offense and 73 points in an entertaining contest.

Schneider broke the previous UCF record held by Daunte Culpepper, who passed for 438 yards vs. Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 24, 1998.

Schneider finished the game 28-for-47 with the 440 yards and a touchdown. Schneider now has two career 100-yard passing games, the second-most in school history. He has also thrown a touchdown pass in 17 consecutive games.

Senior wide receiver Doug Gabriel set a new school record with 124 all purpose yards, breaking the old mark held by Ted Wilson vs. Eastern

Kentucky (10/13/84). Gabriel ended the game with 12 receptions for 206 yards and five kickoff returns for 117 yards. He also rushed one time for one yard and a touchdown.

The 206 yards receiving tie Gabriel for sixth in single-game history at UCF. He also became just the seventh player in school history to go over the 200-yard mark for receiving in a game.

UCF will resume play in the Mid-American Conference this Saturday at 1 p.m. as the Golden Knights head to New York to take on the University of Buffalo. Local fans can listen to the game on 740 AM-The Team with the pregame show beginning at 11 a.m.

In an effort to shore up its defense, fullback Dee Brown has been moved to linebacker.

Brown, who has rushed for 162 yards on the season, was named the district defensive player of the year after registering 130 tackles and three interceptions as a senior at Hernando High

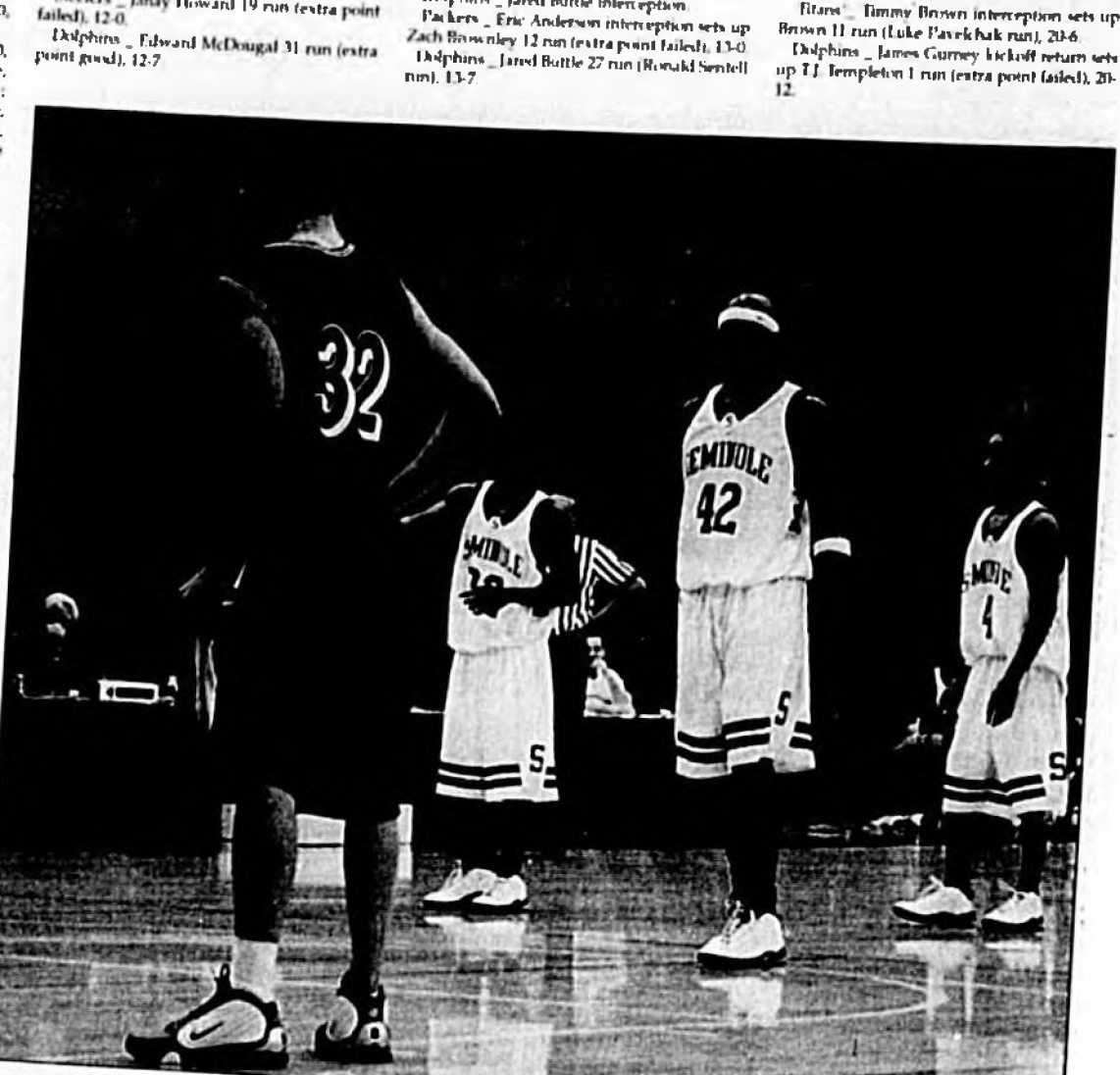

The duo forced several turnovers that got the running game going, allowing Jackson to get free for his crowd-pleasing dunks, and George buried three long three-pointers to open the paint for Witherspoon.

BCCC made an early run in the second half, cutting five points off the lead and holding the Raiders scoreless for better than three minutes to begin the period.

But another freshman guard, Justin Anderson, made two big plays that gave the momentum back to SCC.

First he made a three-point shot and then threw a perfect alley-oop pass from halfcourt over a trio of Panthers defenders to a flying Jackson for another dunk and the Raiders basically maintained a decent lead the rest of the game.

Also making a big impression in the second half was 6-foot-7 freshman Terrell Morris.
