School lunch policy announced

The Seminole County School Board has announced its policy for free and reduced price meals for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

The policy may be reviewed by any interested party by contacting the Educational Support Center of the Seminole County School Board, 400 E. Lake Mary Boulevard, Sanford, or by contacting the school the student is attending.

Eligibility is based on household size and income. The total income before taxes, social security, health benefits, union dues or other deductions must be reported.

Application forms are being sent to students' homes with a letter to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals, household should fill out the application and return it to the school.

Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used to determine eligibility.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a household has foster children living with them and wishes to apply, contact the school the student is attending for more information.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the school should be contacted. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for the reduced price meals or for additional benefits such as free meals.

International Festival begins July 23

SCC settles with land owner

Construction to begin immediately on Oviedo campus

SANFORD — Seminole Community College's board of trustees to accept an out of court settlement with Oviedo property owner John Collins, paving the way for construction to start immediately on SCC's Oviedo Center Project.

The settlement, approved unanimously at an emergency

meeting this morning, came less than an hour before the two parties were to appear before an administrative law judge. The two-day hearing concerned an appeal filed by Collins challenging the school's building permit. Although, the St. John's River Water Management District had previously approved SCC's building plans, Collins argued that the 180-acre site sits primarily on a flood plain.

The terms of the agreement call for the college to pay Collins \$180,000 for his five-acre property that sits adjacent to the campus site. He will also receive \$90,000 in an out of court agree-

ment almost five years in the making. Construction of the campus has been delayed since April pending Collins' latest appeal.

In return, Collins agrees to drop all current and future challenges to the Oviedo project.

The settlement monies will come from SCC's original appropriation for construction approved by the Florida Legislature in 1994.

The college estimates it saved \$150,000 in potential legal costs by averting a lengthy court entanglement with Collins that could have continued until next See SCC, Page 4A

SANFORD — Leslie Puik says she feels "betrayed." She says the Seminole County Commissioners turned their backs on the citizens, and for this they're going to pay.

"They put a fire behind my tail," Puik said Wednesday, still stewing over the commission allowed a 90-acre lot near Payola to be rezoned from A-1 (Agriculture) to PUD (Planned

Development).
"We helped put these men on the commission, and this is what we get for it," Puik said.

"They are supposed to represent the tax payers. But they weren't there for us at all. I'm shell shocked. Ninety-nine percent of the people pleaded for them to stop. They ignored us."

Construction at Sanford airport scheduled to begin in September

SANFORD — Construction on the Orlando Sanford Airport's domestic terminal expansion program is set to begin in September, and the \$24 million project could be complete in January of 2001.

The first phase of construction is expected to last six months and cost \$5.5 million. The second phase is expected to last eight months, and cost \$10.4 million. By the end of the first two phases, in October of 2000, the airport will have five operational gates for loading and unloading passengers.

The third phase will focus on the terminal's apron, and last 3 1/2 months at a cost of \$7.6 million. A ramp will be designed to give the airport greater flexibility in servicing a variety of planes.

By the end of the third phase, the airport will have at least seven gates.

The domestic terminal will be expanded by 103,000 square feet if all goes as airport officials are planning. The domestic terminal will also handle overflow international traffic.

"We're not doing something here today that precludes us from expanding down the road," said Victor White, executive director of the Sanford Airport Authority, adding that another seven to eight gates could be needed in the future.

The airport has a shortfall of \$7 million toward the project, meaning that officials will seek Federal and State grants and other revenues to fund the third phase.

The airport is currently in the pre-construction phase of the expansion project, which includes See Airport, Page 4A

Schools map plan to bring up grades

SANFORD - The six Seminole County elementary schools that received "D's" from the state are taking steps to improve test scores and other areas where the state said the schools are weak.

Wicklow, Hamilton and Midway elementary schools

have the lowest Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) scores in the district in both reading and math. The three schools were given "D's" on the state report card. Pine Crest Elementary School also received a "D" based on its FCAT scores for reading and writing.

Five of the six schools with

"D's" in the state report are located in Sanford, while English Estates is in Fern Park.

Idyllwilde and English Estates received "D's" based on Florida Writes! test scores. The Seminole County School Board is considering several options to improve the six schools with "D's."

The Seminole County School Board on Tuesday will begin

discussing options on how to use available state grant funds to improve the six schools.

Among the options the board will discuss are establishing Reading camps at Hamilton, Wicklow, Idyllwilde, and English Estates elementary schools. The five-week program would cost a total of \$453,000 in grant funding. Midway and

Pine Crest would also hold reading camps, but would not additional grant funding.

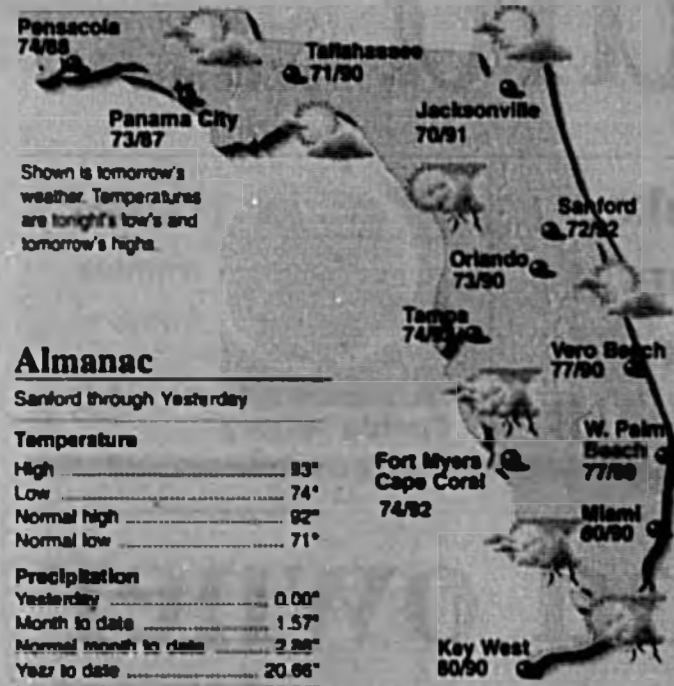
Another option is to start after school programs at the six schools, at a total cost of \$1.2 million. The state would give \$675,000 in grant funding for the program, and the District would spend \$540,654.

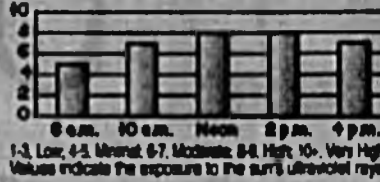

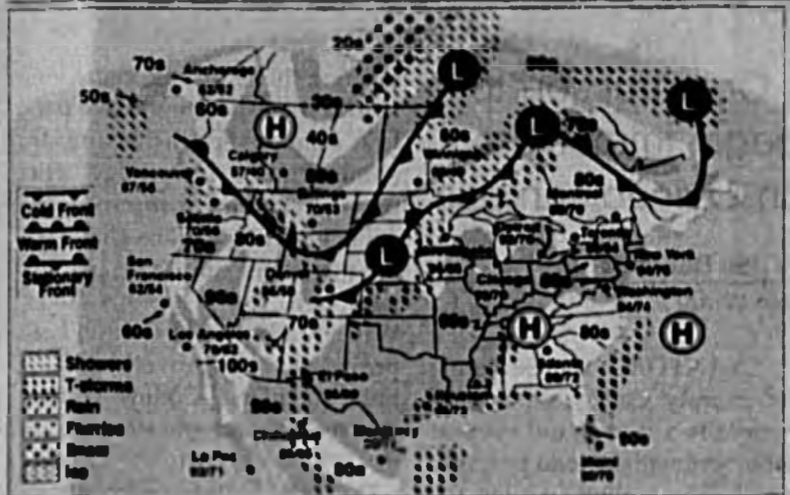

That was some entrance Teddy Ballgame made at Fenway Park Tuesday night. The excitement could be felt all about this great country.

The best ballplayers of yesterday and today reached out to say hello to the All Star and All American — Ted Williams.

Feller. Musial. Mays. Aaron. Banks. Reggie. Yaz. McGwire. Sosa. Ripken. Gwynn. Griffey, Jr. Jeter. Martinez.

Williams, The Kid at 80, beamed.

Assisted by his son, John Henry, Williams rose proudly from the golf cart which had brought him from the outfield to the pitcher's mound.

He double clutched a brand new baseball and mustered the strength to throw it into the waiting mitt of former Boston Red Sox catcher Carlton Fisk.

Ah, the joy as the Fenway baseball fans bid The Kid anew.

Baseball is many things to many people. It's peanuts and crackerjacks. Hot dogs and pop. It's strike three, you're out. Ball four. Curves and sliders. Squeeze bunts and grand slams. Opening Day. Double Play. The Seventh Inning Stretch.

For 12 precious minutes on Tuesday, it was all Teddy Ballgame — the name Ted Williams has enjoyed calling himself for many years.

By honoring Williams at the last All-Star Game of the 20th

Century, Baseball honored one of its greatest players and one of America's greatest patriots.

Williams, a Navy pilot, served five years in World War II and Korea.

He batted .344 lifetime and hit 521 home runs for the Boston Red Sox. He struck out fewer times in his career than some guys do in two seasons. He came to the majors as a cocky, skinny kid. The Splendid Splinter. In 1941, he hit .406. No one's hit .400 since. In 1960, he homered on his last at-bat. He was 42 years old.

So forget the numbers. Williams is flesh and blood. Heart and soul. There's a lot of kid in the man. There always will be. He used to stand before a mirror at home with a baseball bat in his hand. He imagined himself at bat. Against Feller. Bases loaded. Two outs. Three and two the count.

I have a feeling he still takes an imaginary swing. Teddy Ballgame never left anyone in doubt. He spit at the Boston sportswriters who he didn't like. He refused to wear a tie. He supported the NRA. He praised MacArthur. He thought pitchers were dummies. He cursed. He fished. He marched to his own drummer.

He once saw a fellow mop-

ping the floors of the Washington National Airport, and gave him tickets for a game the next day.

Williams melted at the sight of children. He supported charities such as the Jimmy Fund in Boston. He didn't want anyone to know just how generous he was. But he couldn't hide this anymore than his talent at bat. The greatest hitter who ever lived.

owners Disgusted Over Government) group that protested the urban sprawl in District 5 of the county will continue its campaign.

"If we have to, we'll go to court," she said. "Instead of playing by the rules, they've (the BCC) decided to rewrite the rule book. Three of these men are up for election in 2000. Well, they can't expect much support from this part of the county."

Although Commissioner Randy Morris was not present for the evening BCC meeting Tuesday, but he upheld the reasoning by the others on the board.

"What these residents don't understand is that their area is

already in transition," Morris said. "There are warehouses going up out there. There could be more along Orange Ave. Warehouses and strip malls. They've got mobile homes, too — eight to 10 on a single acre."

Morris said that county planners worked for strategies that would benefit the residents.

"They worked at keeping the area residential. That's the key word, residential, not rural. Industry is creeping in from every side."

"There are going to be people in the area who will want to sell property," Morris said. "They've lived there a long time and they're ready to move on. They could sell to business people."

They can sell and get a great deal for the land."

District 5 Commissioner Daryl McLain pleaded for the residents to sit down with the developers and county staff and to have intelligent dialogue.

Meanwhile the protests continue. Acres and acres of land west of the Port of Sanford are strewn with signs:

- Don't Sell Us Out, McLain. We'll Remember.
- Commissioners, This is My Property!!! What about My Rights?
- Seminole County: Florida's Unnatural Choice.
- My Land, Don't Change It.
- Our Community. Our Future. Our Choice.
- Not in My Neighborhood.

In addition, the six principals are recommending that the Board seek grant funding to provide after school tutorials for students in grades three through five. After providing tutorial support, any remaining money would be used to hire additional personnel, the principals said.

The six schools may receive state grant funding for a computer-assisted instructional program for reading and math. The software of the Computer Curriculum Corporation can be individualized to meet the students' needs.

The board will also discuss starting a home-based reading instruction program called Parents to Kids for at least 50 children and their parents, with funding from a State grant.

As part of the initiative to improve learning, each school is will form an individual improvement plan.

"We want to do more for students after school," said Marion

Dailey, executive director of instructional support services. "Every child can be taught, but some children need more time and more attention."

Dailey said that all six schools are struggling with high poverty levels, absentee rates, and with a large portion of students that are mobile, moving in-and-out of school during the school year.

Four of the schools — Midway, Hamilton, Pinecrest, and Wicklow — have poverty levels above 70 percent. Idyllwilde and English Estates elementary schools have poverty rates of 48 percent.

Wicklow Elementary School has a 60 percent mobility rate, which reflects the number of students moving in-and-out in a year. The remaining five schools with "D's" all have mobility rates ranging from 30-to-36 percent.

"When you have a highly mobile student population and a high poverty rate in a school,

those are very difficult barriers," Dailey said. "It's not impossible, but it is difficult."

The six schools with "D's" also have high absence rates. For instance, 20 percent of Pine Crest Elementary School students were absent for 20 days or more last year. The state's is 8.7 percent.

Hamilton, Wicklow and Midway elementary schools have absentee rates ranging from 10.4 to 11.7 percent. English Estates has an 8.3 percent absentee rate, while Idyllwilde has a 7.1 percent absentee rate.

"If the kids are in-and-out of class and their mobility is high, it's very difficult to show progress," Dailey said.

The school board is appealing the results of the state's report, because an error was made in the district's data for the percent of students who took mandatory tests. However, the six schools are expected to maintain "D's" when grades are revised.

Casselberry police begin on-site security checks

CASSELBERRY — The Casselberry police department feels an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.

Or in the case of home and business safety, and ounce of inspection beats filling out a police report for burglary. The department is bringing back a program designed to have police officers visit homes and businesses and conduct security surveys to help home and business owners make their locations more secure and less attractive to criminals.

"We call it 'target hardening,'" explains Officer John Catiller, the department's Community Relations Officer.

"We check windows, doors, hinges, locks, shrubbery that

block visibility, exterior lighting, house numbers, you name it.

"Unfortunately, most of the requests we get for security surveys come too late, after a home or business has been the target of a crime and the residents or owners are in a stressed frame of mind," he said. "We'd much rather prevent a crime than pick up the pieces."

Catiller, a 15-year veteran of the Casselberry force took classes in home security surveys at Seminole Community College. He says there have been a few instances where, as a police officer, he's had to make forced entries into homes.

"You'd be surprised how easy it is to get in," said Catiller.

"What we try to get accomplished during the security surveys is to get homeowners and

business owners to view their property like a criminal would and investigate ways to get in."

Home and business security surveys are conducted during normal business hours of 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday by Catiller and other Casselberry police officers. There is no charge for the survey. Appointments can be made with the department by calling 262-7616, extension 1051.

"The security surveys actually have positive benefits in a number of ways," Catiller said.

"They give homeowners and business owners a little more piece of mind and some sound suggestions, and it gives our officers a chance to personally meet and get to know city residents in a positive way rather than a distressed situation.

preparing design drawings and has an estimated cost of \$1.3 million.

White said there is a trend toward carriers such as Monarch and Airtours using larger planes, and the airport needs to build gates that can accommodate the larger planes.

Airport officials have been meeting with Pan American Airlines and other carriers to find out what improvements the carriers want in the terminal. The improvements include greater ticket counter space, windows in corridors leading to international gates, and enhanced food and beverage stands, White said.

"It has to be attractive, with a Florida feel."

White said that even if funding for the third phase falls through, the first two phases

could stand on their own.

"We'll get the funding," Sanford Mayor Larry Dale said.

Airport Authority Board members on Tuesday expressed concern that international flights have declined 30 percent through June.

There have been 360,908 international flights, compared to 452,374 last year through June.

White said that the loss of Caledonia and Britannia airlines accounts for the decline in flights. Last year, the two airlines provided about 30 percent of the airport's international flights.

"Our remaining carriers have remained consistent," White said.

The number of domestic passengers is down from 46,507 through June 1998 to 27,566 through June of this year. Cumulative cargo handled has

also decline from 7,065 pieces through June 1998, to 4,844 pieces through June, 1999.

"We've just been through the slowest part of the year," White said. "It will pick up in the summer and fall."

The Orlando Sanford Airport handles more than one million passengers per year. The majority of the passengers are on British charters.

Business is expected to pick up when Pan American Airlines provides the airport with its first regularly scheduled domestic service. Pan Am officials have not set a date for starting the flights, although they have said flights could begin in late-August.

Pan Am officials say they are working on the ticket reservations system and other areas before announcing flight schedules.

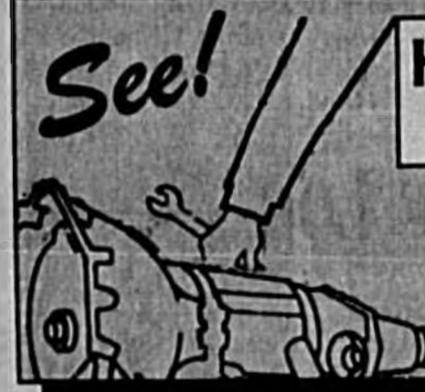
"We're excited to move forward and become a part of the Oviedo community," said board chair Dede Schaffner.

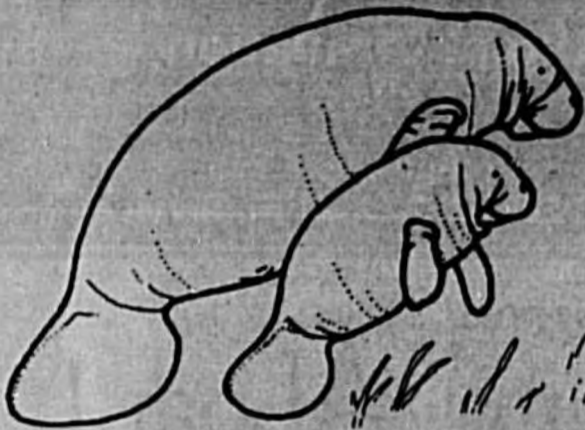

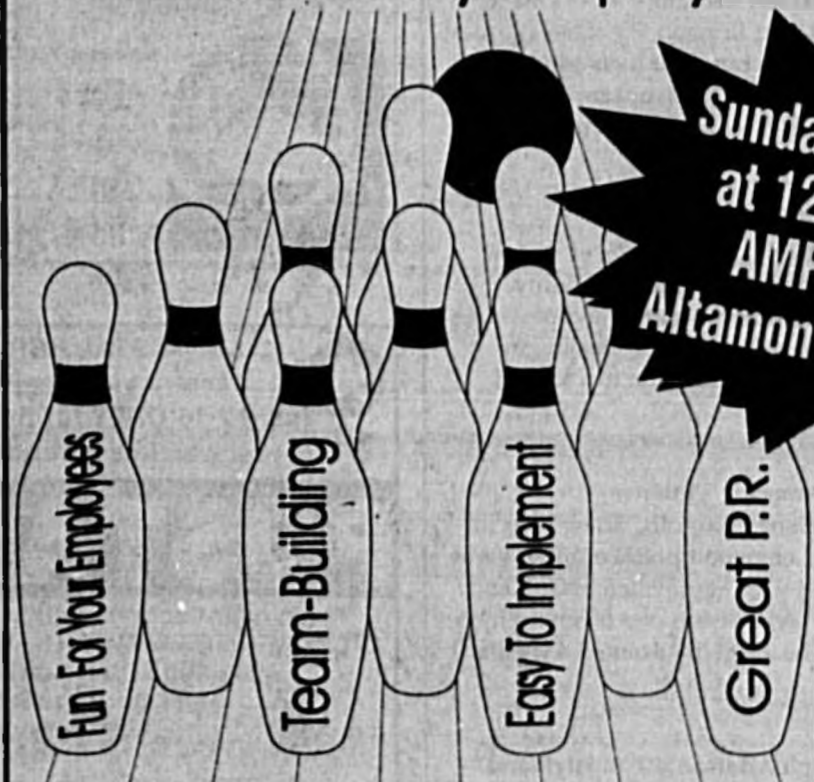

Construction begins on Oviedo elementary school

OVIEDO — Construction began this week on John W. Evans Elementary School in Oviedo. However, when the elementary school opens in August, 2000, the school district will still have overcrowding concerns.

Designed for 800 students, Evans Elementary School is being modeled after Highlands Elementary School in Winter Springs. Total costs of building the two-story school are estimated at \$10.5 million.

The school will ease crowding in Carillon, Stenstrom, Lawton, and Rainbow elementary schools. A school principal will be named by the School Board in the spring of 2000.

Without accounting for the county's expected growth, school officials estimate the district needs three-to-five new elementary schools to relieve overcrowding and move students out of portable classrooms. The trouble is that there is not enough income for the district to build additional elementary schools, said Dianne Kramer, director of facilities for Seminole County Schools.

The need for new schools exists district-wide. Kramer said growth is most rapid in the southeast area of the county, including Oviedo, and in the northwest portion of the county, including Sanford and Lake Mary.

"You can't just put new schools in those parts of the county with the most rapid growth," Kramer said. "That still leaves the central part of the County."

Construction costs are rising, up 20 percent since Highlands

Elementary was built in 1995, Kramer said.

Meanwhile, work continues on a number of major projects in schools throughout Seminole County.

The district recently completed a six-month project of repainting every classroom at Seminole High School. Construction is underway on the Olympic-sized community swimming pool at Seminole High School, scheduled to open by January, 2000, at Seminole High School.

The pool is expected to cost \$1 million to build, with funding shared by the School Board, Seminole County, and the city of Sanford. Students at Seminole High School are already enrolling in spring semester swimming classes.

"The day the heavy equipment rolled in we were ecstatic," said Seminole High School principal Karen Coleman.

Seminole High School is also receiving 100 new computers. Soon after the coming school year begins, every classroom in Seminole High School will have a computer.

The \$40 million renovations to Lake Brantley High School are nearing completion. The project has been on-going since January, 1998, and is expected to be completed in the spring of 2000.

This summer, a new administration suite and interior courtyard are under construction. The so-called "Round Building," constructed in the 1970's with open-pod classrooms, is being replaced by three academic buildings.

Other additions at Lake Brantley High School include a new Gymnasium and Media Center. The science building is being renovated. The school's

softball and baseball fields have also been relocated.

In June, the School Board agreed to a five-year plan that includes \$20 million for renovations at Lyman High School. However, school officials say the district still has \$160 million in unfunded needs.

Board members also decided in June to add one elementary school during the next five years.

Kramer said she is concerned that the state legislature will possibly add further difficulties to financing school construction with a revised statewide building code that will be discussed in Tallahassee in January.

School districts currently use a uniform building code for schools that differs from the codes used by local governments. The state legislature is considering eliminating the separate uniform code for schools in January.

One of the changes in the code that will affect school systems is the inspection process. Life-safety inspections are performed before opening a school, and sometimes work continues on a building while it is in use. By contract, local governments do not open a building until the work is virtually complete, including the landscaping.

The reform could force school districts to hire additional building officials and create another layer of bureaucracy, Kramer said. She noted that the school system already takes steps to ensure students are not in danger.

"We would never open a school until it is safe," Kramer said. "It will add expense, and lengthen the time it takes to do a school from the time it is in design to the time students move in."

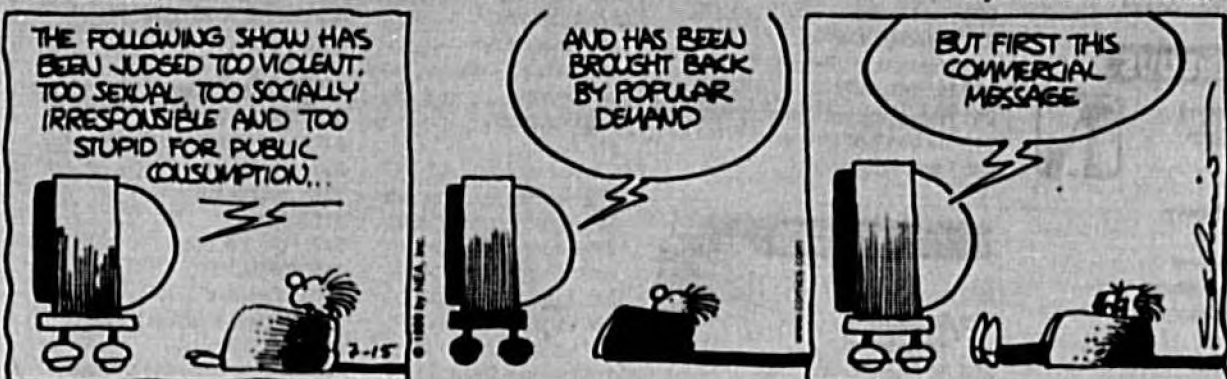

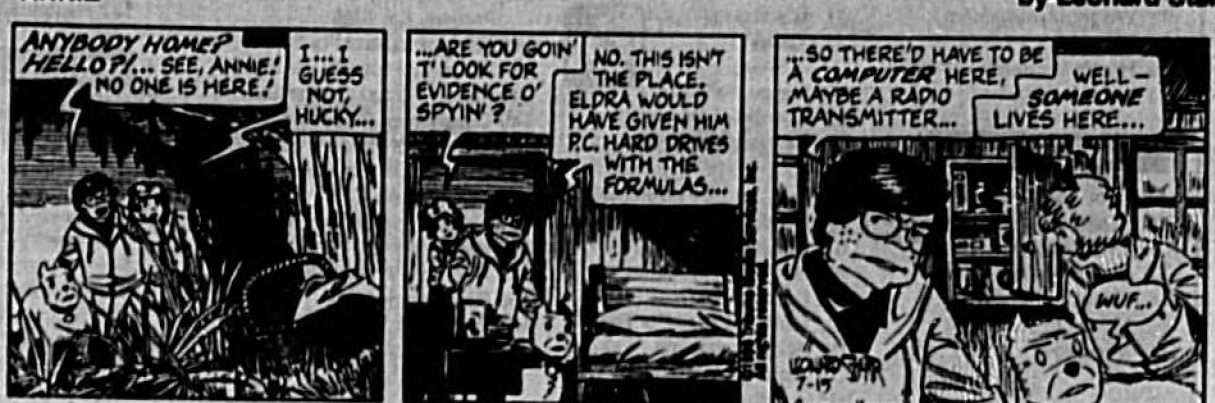

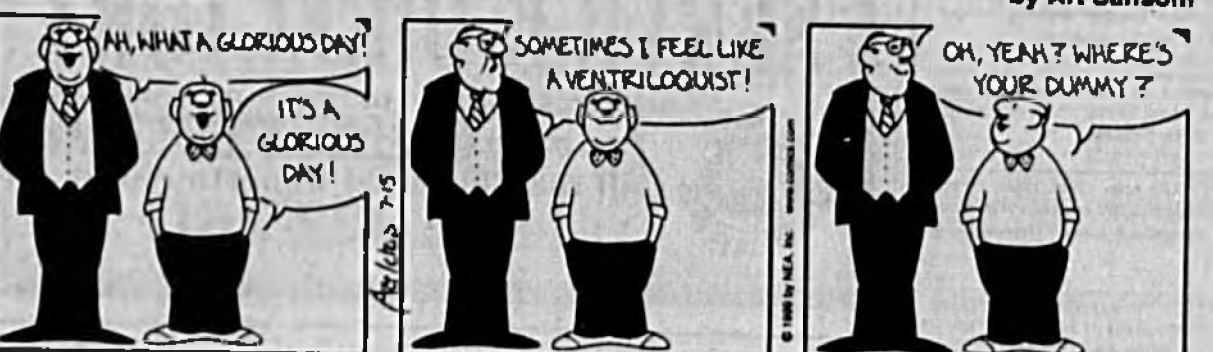

It's all in the timing

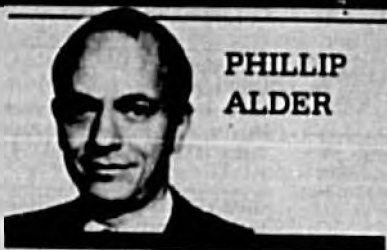

ASK DR. GOTT

Seek surgery for recurring hernia

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm a 45-year-old man who has had two inguinal hernia surgeries, one on each side, by different surgeons. Now, one has returned. Would you recommend further, traditional surgery? I don't want to have to go through this again.

DEAR DR. GOTT: You may not want to go through this again but, in fact, surgery may be your best option. No operation is guaranteed successful; some surgeons are more adept at repairing hernias than are other practitioners. Because one of your hernias returned, the surgeon may want to use wire mesh to strengthen the weak portion of your abdomen where the hernia has occurred. In my opinion, you should return to the surgeon who performed the successful hernia repair and see if he believes he can fix the recurrence.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I'm a retired 73-year-old man with dry, itchy hands. Sometimes when I grasp things, my hands crack and bleed excessively. I've been examined by several dermatologists but their treatments haven't worked. Do you have any suggestions?

DEAR READER: Dry, itchy hands may be just that: The skin may need additional lubrication. There are several hand creams that you could try, including Curel, Jergens and Vasoline Intensive Care. A lotion containing lanolin may work best.

If, on the other hand, your dry hands are caused by allergic reactions, dermatitis or low-grade skin infection, you will probably need prescription medicine. Consider going to the dermatology clinic at a teaching hospital, where super-specialists welcome challenging cases.

DEAR DR. GOTT: My grandfather suffers from severe diabetes. During the day, his sugars are over 200 and sometimes drop to 70 at night. He takes 82 units of insulin in the morning, and 17 at night. While his present doctor is an endocrinologist, I feel we should see someone else to avoid these severe swings, which produce night sweats and excruciating foot pain that are too much for him to handle. Can we improve his quality of life?

DEAR READER: Some diabetics, especially the elderly, are "brittle," meaning that their blood sugars may be exceedingly difficult to control. Even small amounts of insulin (to

treat excessively high sugar levels) can cause a form of rebound, marked by low blood sugar and a variety of symptoms, including sweats and foot pain.

I agree with you. A second opinion is in order. No diabetes specialist, regardless of skill and experience, will hit a home run every time at bat. I am certain that your grandfather's endocrinologist would be delighted to call on a colleague to assist with this difficult problem.
