



### Nazi Revolt Is Said Planned **By Columbians**

### Former Active Members In Organization Tell State Of Dictatorship Plot

ATLANTA, Dec. 10-(A') -A stranger - than - fiction story was told today by two young men who asserted that the anti-negro organization known all Columbians, Incorporated was working to set dp a Nazi-like government in the United States.

the story comes from 21-year-aid Lanier Waller and James Childers of Atlanta who were themselves active in the organi-sation until they learned that "the Columbians were planning to take over the country and es-

Both men describe themselves "former suckers" but say they have now turned state witnesses in Georgia's prosecution of the ganization. The state is trying provoke the charter of the Columbians.

Attorney General Eugene Cook announced that the state has obtained evidence for a criminal charges against several members of the organization.

Presumably Waller and Childers were instrumental in un-earthing that evidence. Just before Cook's announcement Waller declared that he and his compan-in had given information linking Columbian leader with the purchase of dynamits to blast negro

Waller said he had originally joined the group because he "just naturally doesn't like negroes. But he says he and Childers took it upon themselves to find out what they could about the organization when it began to develop into an anti-Jewish

Both men revealed that on ec. 2 they went to New York and exposed the Columbians to Professor James Sheldon, administrative chairman of the Anti-Nazi Leagus, Sheldon passed the testimony on to Georgia's state ittorney general.

The two youths said that Shelion had spies planted in the Columbiant with whom they volun-tarily established contact. Waller and Childers said they were cown to New York by Sheldon hours apart to keep Columblan leaders from suspecting that they were planning to expose organization secrets. When they returned to Atlanta, they said, Homer Loomis, secretary of the Columbians, called on them. Waller said Loomis libbed them about what they might have told and said he'd be seeing them

waller declared both he and childers, were interested only in an anti-negro organization and were strongly opposed to any program for overthrowing the government. Waiter quoted Loomia as saying to him at one time that he had plans to take over the country and be a dictator.



Chicago, Dec. 10-(P)-The National Safety Council today set forth seven rules for safety in a hotel fire such as the disastrous blaze in Atlanta Saturday. They are worth remembering, Here are the seven rules:

When you go to your room for the first time,

locate regular and emergency exits. If you detect fire or smoke act quickly but cooly; notify the telephone operator; give exact in-

Feel your door before you open it; if it is hot, keep It closed; also close transoms and cover the cracks around the door with wet towels or sheets, Do not act on impulses, or take unnecessary chances to get out of your room; you may be

safer where you are. If door is cool, open it a little; if the hall seems

safe, leave by a known exit. Close doors and windows behind you to reduce

If there is much smoke, hold or tie a wet cloth over your face and go on your hands and knees

Those are the seven rules recommended by the National Bafety Council for you to remember if ever you are caught in a hotel fire.





SEATTLE, Dec. 11, (P)—A lying Coast Guardsman has radioed that he has spotted wreckage three and a half miles wreckage three and a half miles from the airport at Toledo, Wash. The wreckage lying near the western fringe of the Cascade Mountains between Seattle and Portland may be the Marine Corps transport which has been missing since yesterday with 32 men aboard. The Coast Guard observer said he could not determine whether anyone was alive. A group of searchers have set out to investigate the report.


