



#### Restless Americans

Mass migration is not limited to the distressed proples of Europe, In only three years 27 million persons in the United States left home for somewhere else. Of these, 12 million left for military service, but all the rest were civilians, shifting from county to county, state to state, coust to coast.

The servicemen drew some followers while stationed 1 200 within the country. Industrial areas-drew large numbers to work in war plants. A considerable amount of family rearrangement went on; as relatives doubled up when men went overseas. In all, one-fifth of the nation's population | 200 pulled up stakes and at least tentatively drove them in another site during that period, says the Census Bureau.

These migrants saw more of their own land than 2 100. they ever saw before, and many of them decided there were other places even nicer than home. But now that familles are together again, and they might be able to move to a section of the country where they particularly like the scenery and climate, most of them are caught by the housing situation. So the migration, which doubtless would have continued at a rapid rate, has frozen spots.

#### One Less Monarchy

Americans are never surprised when a European country votes out its king, as Bulgaria has just done. Deep in the American tradition is hostility to monarchy, due probably to the arbitrary tyranny of King George III, which brought on the Revolution. And yet recent British kings and the Scandinavian rulers have proved that royalty can be not only harmless but helpful.

These countries have fixed governmental traditions, The duties of king, prime minister and parliament are well defined and understood. The Balkan countries are still not many years removed from Turkish despotism. Governments are unstable, prime ministers changing sometimes several times a year. 


