Moss Announces Candidacy For Post In Congress

To Campaign Primarily For Two-Party Type Government

ORLANDO, Sept. 17. (AP)—Promising a concrete campaign that will carry him to every town in the Fifth Congressional District, M. J. Moss, announced today his candidacy for congress on the Republican ticket, opposing the incumbent, "Little Joe" Hendrick.

Sanford, Fla., his birthplace, has been a center of activity for Moss during which time he has been featured in the real estate business.

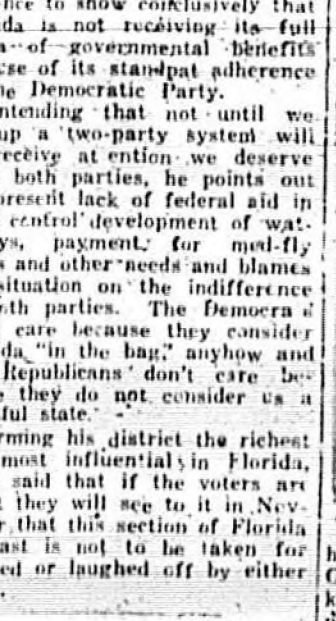
He was educated in the public schools of Pinellas, Ky. He later had two years at Center College, Danville, Ky., and two years at the University of Pittsburg, School of Mines.

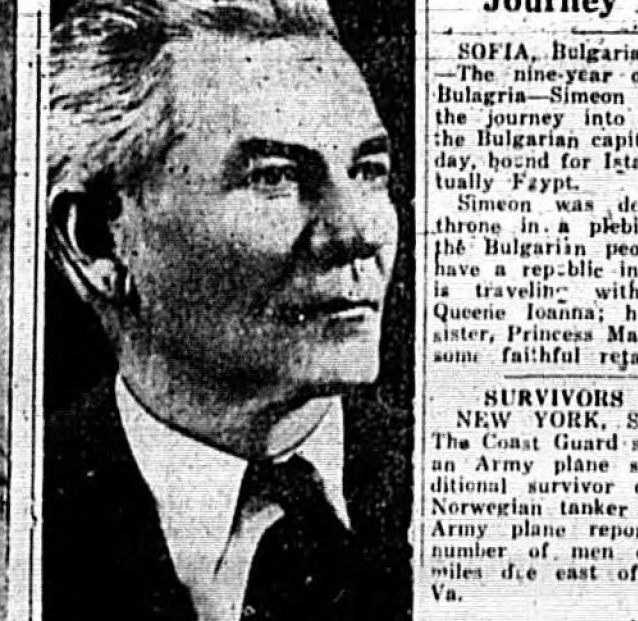

U. S. Civil Rights Plea

WASHINGTON — The Justice Department says new legislation is needed to strengthen Uncle Sam's hand in protecting your civil rights

This is the reason it gives: If local officials fail to protect your civil rights, the federal government is powerless in most cases to intervene

Suppose, for example, that you are the victim of a mob attack. The federal government cannot prosecute the mob under normal circumstances

Suppose, again, that you are beaten or murdered by a police officer after having been arrested on a false charge

The Supreme Court has ruled that in such a case the federal government can prosecute you if the police officer at the time he committed the offense had the clear purpose of depriving you of a specific federal right

This means a right made specific either by the express terms of the Constitution or laws of the United States or the decisions interpreting them

The Justice Department maintains that the federal government should have the power to act when local authorities fail to protect your civil rights

Says Assistant Attorney General Luntar Caudle, head of the department's Criminal Division: "New legislation is needed. The federal government now has little power of authority to deal with the social and government situations which give rise to civil rights problems"

Caudle gives this summary of the situation: The United States Constitution did not mention civil rights. But the first Congress, fearing interference by the federal government with basic rights, passed and submitted to the states the first 10 amendments

Other Amendments After the Civil War the 13th, 14th and 15th amendments to the Constitution were adopted. The reason was that certain states would not or could not protect the liberties of all persons

Five laws were passed providing penalties for state officers and individuals who violated the rights set out in these amendments. The

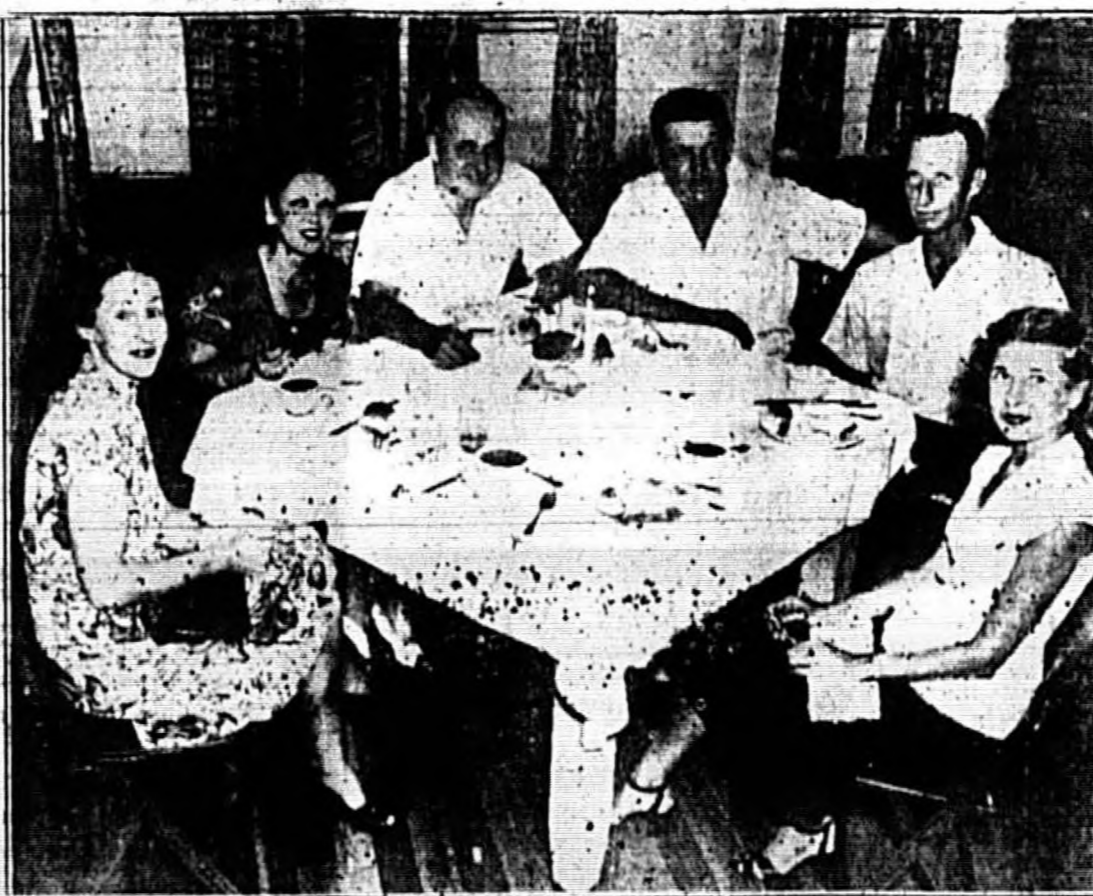

Every Third Marriage In U. S. Failure

By DR. CLIFFORD R. ADAMS Sociologists are gravely disturbed by the rising rate of marriage failure in America. It is becoming serious enough to threaten to undermine our whole social structure.

Our women, too, are becoming increasingly aware that something basic is wrong. If they are lucky enough to be happily married, they know many friends and neighbors who are in trouble. Every block in America has marriage in the state of dissolution.

Fifty years ago one marriage in 20 ended in divorce. By the end of World War I the rate had risen to about one in seven. In 1940 it was one in five. We have no final figures for the past two years but all the evidence indicates that the rate is about one in three. The rate is even higher if you consider only those marriages contracted in the past 10 years.

Furthermore, the rate will continue to rise if long-range trends continue, so that by 1965 one marriage in every two is failing. It is hard to build a stable society with such a rapid turnover in family structures. And the tensions involved in the failures will make a large part of our population neurotic. Women particularly will be afflicted, because marriage looms larger in their lives than it does in men's and because their nervous systems are more easily disrupted.

The divorce rate in some areas is higher than in others. In Dallas, Tex., for example, there were more applications for divorce last year than there were applications for marriage licenses.

Many persons who have obtained divorces in Nevada after a short residence of six weeks are in a dilemma as a result of a U. S. Supreme Court decision in 1943. In two cases one in North Carolina and one in Pennsylvania, the Court ruled that each state had the right to decide whether a residence of six weeks was in Nevada considered legal residence.

If the various states were to decide that six weeks was not long enough time to constitute legal domicile, then thousands of divorces, already legal and any subsequent marriages, would be null and void. Many persons are uneasy that their former mates may one day contest their marriages.

I could list at least 20 significant reasons why the rate of marriage failure in America has reached its present staggering proportions. Such factors are indicated as the increasing economic independence of women, the increased mobility and shifting of our populations, the psychological desire for change, the tensions and uncertainties produced by major wars and a major depression in one generation, the increasing number of children, marriages, and divorces.

However, the main trouble simply is couples today tend to marry hastily. They do not in all ways know each other well enough to know whether their attraction is based on real compatibility or merely on sexually colored infatuation.

In my book I have detailed the steps by which any individual couple can make sure their marriage will be on an enduring and vital basis. But I would like to mention here two lines of action which I believe society as a whole must take.

1. There should be a uniform federal law requiring that couples wait a certain number of months after declaring their intent to marry before they can obtain licenses. This will force couples to discuss the terms of their marriage in advance to see that every couple marrying has had some preparation for marriage in the form of instruction or counseling.
