German And French Forces Are Locked In Heavy Fighting

Paris Reports Cannonading At South End Of Front To Halt Nazi Concentration New Assault Is Made On Warsaw

PARIS, Sept. 26. —(AP)—Premier Daladier's war cabinet today derided the disavowal of the Communist Party in France. The action was taken as a reprisal for Berlin's non-aggression pact with Germany and her invasion of Poland.

A new German assault on Warsaw was launched today while German and French forces were locked in heavy fighting on the western front.

On the eastern front a German offensive against Warsaw started against Warsaw after all efforts had failed at convincing the Polish commander of the senselessness and uselessness of resistance.

Russian troops near the agreed demarcation line splitting Poland between two powers as the German troops fell back toward a new border.

Germany reported downing six French planes and two balloons. The French reported downing the German air force to two planes in air battles yesterday which preceded artillery bombardment of the Blotz Canal.

Prime Minister Chamberlain declared that vital supplies in his own hands are being made available to Britain by the Dominions.

Authoritative Polish sources in Budapest at the same time said that Ignace Jan Paderewski was likely to be being attacked with the utmost vigor.

Estonia's Envoy Department Of Hurriedly Leaves Recreation Set Up For 1st Time

Russia Believed To Be Making Demands On Baltic Neighbor

MOSCOW, Sept. 26. —(AP)—Abruptly ending his stay in Moscow after less than 15 hours, Estonia's foreign minister rushed home yesterday on what was reported to be an urgent business.

The Turkish delegation, headed by Foreign Minister Saracoglu, came for important diplomatic trade talks.

Foreign circles said they expected Russia would seek a guarantee from Turkey to close the Bosphorus to all ships opposed to Russian interest in retaining possible Soviet guarantees against any German attack on Turkey.

Diplomats were keenly interested in the sudden departure of the Estonian foreign minister.

It was understood that after the conference he left Moscow's leading hotel, the Metropole, where he was welcomed yesterday by a display of Estonian flags and the remainder of the night at the Estonian legation.

Heavy Taxes Levied On British Subjects To Pay Costs Of War

Heavy Tolls Known Levied To Meet Huge Two Billion Pound War Budget

Income Taxes Are Increased

Tax To Be 37.5 Percent Of Income For Financial Year

LONDON, Sept. 27.—(AP)—The British today levied on her citizens the heaviest taxes they ever have known to meet an estimated two billion pounds outlay in the current financial year, greatly swelled by the costs of war against Germany.

Sir John Simon, chancellor of exchequer, presenting his first budget in the House of Commons announced the standard income tax rate for the fiscal year—ending Mar. 31—would be 35 percent and for the 1940-41 year 37.5 percent. Rates are to be seven shillings in the pound (\$1.37 in \$3.95) until March 31 and seven shillings six pence (1.48), thereafter. These rates are levied on incomes in excess of exemptions ranging from 125 pounds—about \$430—for single persons to 400 pounds—about \$1,584—for married men with three children.

At the same time Sir John levied drastic direct tax increases on beer, whisky, tobacco, sugar, wine, death duties, and other luxuries. The tea tax was untouched, however.

Hitler May Return Envoy To U. S. As Move Toward Peace

BERLIN, Sept. 27.—(AP)—Chancellor Adolf Hitler, who returned to Berlin yesterday from the Polish front, is considering returning his ambassador to Washington as a "peace gesture" toward the United States, it was reported in well-informed quarters last night.

The German ambassador to Washington, 63-year-old Hans Heinrich Dieckhoff, who was a cavalry officer in the World War, was ordered by Hitler to return to Berlin last Nov. 18 to explain President Roosevelt's "strange attitude toward Germany's anti-Jewish crusade at that time."

Reich Reports Plane Successes

Germans Say British North Sea Fleet Damaged From Air

BERLIN, Sept. 27.—(AP)—The German high command announced tonight that Warsaw had capitulated unconditionally and added that "handing over of the city probably will occur Sept. 29."

MOSCOW, Sept. 27.—(AP)—The Soviet government tonight announced the Russian steamer Metallist had been torpedoed and sunk by an unidentified submarine near Estonia. The attack was said to have occurred near Narva Bay on the northern coast of Estonia. Soviet patrol ships rescued 19 members of the Metallist's crew. Five others were reported missing. Official announcement of the sinking came as the Soviet press published sharp attacks on Estonia for her handling of the submarine problem, accusing the small Baltic nation of providing naval bases for foreign powers.

The European war mounting in intensity at sea and on the western front entered today an apparently final phase at its starting point, the eastern front.

Germany said Warsaw's defenders had agreed to surrender. A Warsaw radio, describing the terrific German assault on the capital, declared, however, that "we will never give in while one of us is left."

Dies Committee Requests Purge Of Communists

WASHINGTON, Sept. 27.—(AP)—Charles Dies, of the house committee on un-American activities, today by a majority of 100 in the House of Representatives, requested the Justice department to begin "purging" about 500 known Communist agents held by government agencies.
