#### Man dies during rescue attempt

Casselberry - A 40-year-old man, who was being subdued by Seminole County deputies following a call for assistance, died early today.

According to Chief Deputy Steve Harriett, county deputies responded to a call for assistance at the Georgetown Apartments at the 600 block of State Road 438 near Red Bug Road.

The Casselberry Fire Department, which responded to a 911 call requesting medical assistance, called the sheriff's department for assistance, once the man became combative, Harriett said.

Deputies Don Rufo and Mike Bernosky, in an effort to control the man, administered pepper spray and handcuffed the man, after he grabbed at the deputy's nightstick. The man, whose identity has not been released pending notification of next of kin, died shortly thereafter, Harriett said.

Harriett said while fire department and sheriff's agents tried to help the man, who complained of heart pain, the man admitted he had smoked crack cocaine.

The case is being investigated by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, Harriett said.

## Longwood's Smith out, Manning in

Officials accept administrator's resignation, choose retired police chief as interim head

LONGWOOD - Retired Longwood Police Chief Greg Manning is the choice for interim city administrator, following W. Shelton Smith's resignation Monday.

City commissioners voted 3-2 to pass the resolution accepting Smith's resignation, which has been the subject of controversy for the past month and has divided residents. By the same margin, commissioners

voted to ask Manning if he is interested in the post.

Mayor Rusty Miles, and Commissioners AnnaMarie Vuca and Ron Sergeant had been seeking the resignation, saying that Smith was not right for the job and had let too many city projects fall behind. Commissioners Paul Lovstrand and Steve Miller asked that Smith be given another chance.

After weeks of silence, Smith told commissioners he was resigning only to get his benefits. If fired, he would not qualify for those benefits.

"I did not want to resign," Smith said. "It's so I can get benefits. I was told I would be fired for cause. I'm between a rock and a hard place."

Smith, with an annual salary of \$68,249, will receive 4 1/2 months severance pay, unused vacation and sick leave, retirement benefits, and health insurance benefits. His resignation is effective immediately.

Residents at the meeting were divided in their views. Several citizens spoke out against an unsigned flyer that was distributed to homes urging residents to attend Monday's meeting and show support for Smith.

Rex Anderson, a longtime resident, called the literature a "phantom in the night newsletter."

"The majority of commissioners have taken a necessary step," Anderson said. "There's been a lot of procrastination."

## Oviedo decides between trees and firefighters

OVIEDO - What it came down to, members of the public said, was a choice between firefighters and trees.

The trees won. In approving the 1998-99 fiscal year budget, the Oviedo City Council chose to hire a landscaping staff, including a professional arborist, to look after the trees on city-owned property. A request by the Oviedo Fire Department to hire three additional firefighters, at a cost of \$100,000 to man a new 105-foot ladder truck, was rejected in favor of the tree staff.

Henry Schuman, who was one of only a few residents to speak to the budget during the first public hearing on the matter 10 days ago, led a vocal, standing-room-only crowd, in speaking out against the proposed budget before it was approved Monday night.

"Last time when I spoke to you, I told you that I represented the silent majority," he said. "Well, they are not so silent any more. Police and fire protection should be our priority."

Schuman said he surveyed the residents of the Little Creek subdivision, through a hastily-prepared written survey, and found that 95 percent of them would increase, not reduce, spending for public safety programs. Little Creek is one of the largest subdivisions in Oviedo, he pointed out. Residents' views, he believed, were indicative of the residents of the whole city.

"What you want to do is absurd," Jim Tular told the council. "You're putting the citizens at great risk."

When the city purchased a million dollar ladder truck last year for the fire department to use for rescue work at taller structures such as the Oviedo Marketplace, they failed to hire adequate staff for the vehicle's full use. They have used the vehicle only minimally, taking

it out only when no other truck was available.

Citizens were outraged at the waste, they said.

Judy Kurbaska drew cries of "Amen" from citizens when she said the council, which is the governing body for the fourth fastest growing city in Central Florida, had their priorities confused.

"I'm shocked...that this council would give as much consideration to human lives as they would to trees," she said.

Residents said they were willing to pay more in taxes in order to maintain the level of fire service the city now has and to be sure the fire fighters have adequate staff to serve the city efficiently.

"A trained arborist can not be more important than firefighters," Tina Brazwell said. "The droughts (like last summer with resulting fires) can happen again, yet you're worried about how the trees look outside City Hall."

In the end, the city council approved a millage rate of 4.99 mills, the same as last year, and chose to approve the budget.

The crowd, restless and often vocal in their disapproval of council and staff comments throughout the one-and-a-half hour long public hearing, cheered and applauded councilman John Ariale and chairman Bob Dallari who went against the majority on the council and voted against approval of the budget.

"Our job is to balance the issues and prioritize the needs of the city," Ariale said to thunderous applause. "I'm not against the arborist, but the city would be remiss if it did not add firefighters."

Councilman John Benson defended the decision to hire the arborist rather than the firefighters, saying the landscape experts would not only be taking care of trees in front of City Hall, but also help take care of ancient and dying trees

## County has its own video debate today

SEMINOLE COUNTY - As the nation's leaders wrestle with the Clinton "Sex, Lies and Video" issue, Seminole County's leaders are wrestling today with a Public Decency Ordinance, a new budget and how to deal with two non-complying adult video stores.

Among the other items on

the county agenda: a reciprocal borrowing agreement with Orange County libraries, a land purchase for use as a trailhead for the Cross-Seminole Trail and the results of a poll of Holliday Avenue residents concerning their willingness to fund a sidewalk on one side of the street.

The county commissioners meet in three separate sessions - at 9 a.m., at 1:30 p.m.

and a 7 p.m. The 1:30 and 7 sessions are public meetings, and offer the opportunity for input by citizens of the county.

By a suggestion by Chairman Randy Morris, the board authorized and advertised an amended Public Decency Ordinance that will appear on a Voter Referendum on Nov. 3. This plan moots a lawsuit filed against the Supervisor of Elections by three adult establish-

ments (Circus-Circus, Rachel's and Club Juana).

The only differences between the original and new ordinance are in the titles and the effective date sections. The substantive provisions of the ordinance are the same. The electorate will have one ballot question to act upon, which would determine the fate of these provisions.

If the ordinance is adopted,

totally nude dancing would no longer be allowed in the county. How the existing legally-operating clubs react is not known. Seemingly, more lawsuits would follow.

The county's problems with two adult video stores is over non-compliance with several applicable design and site improvement requirements. The

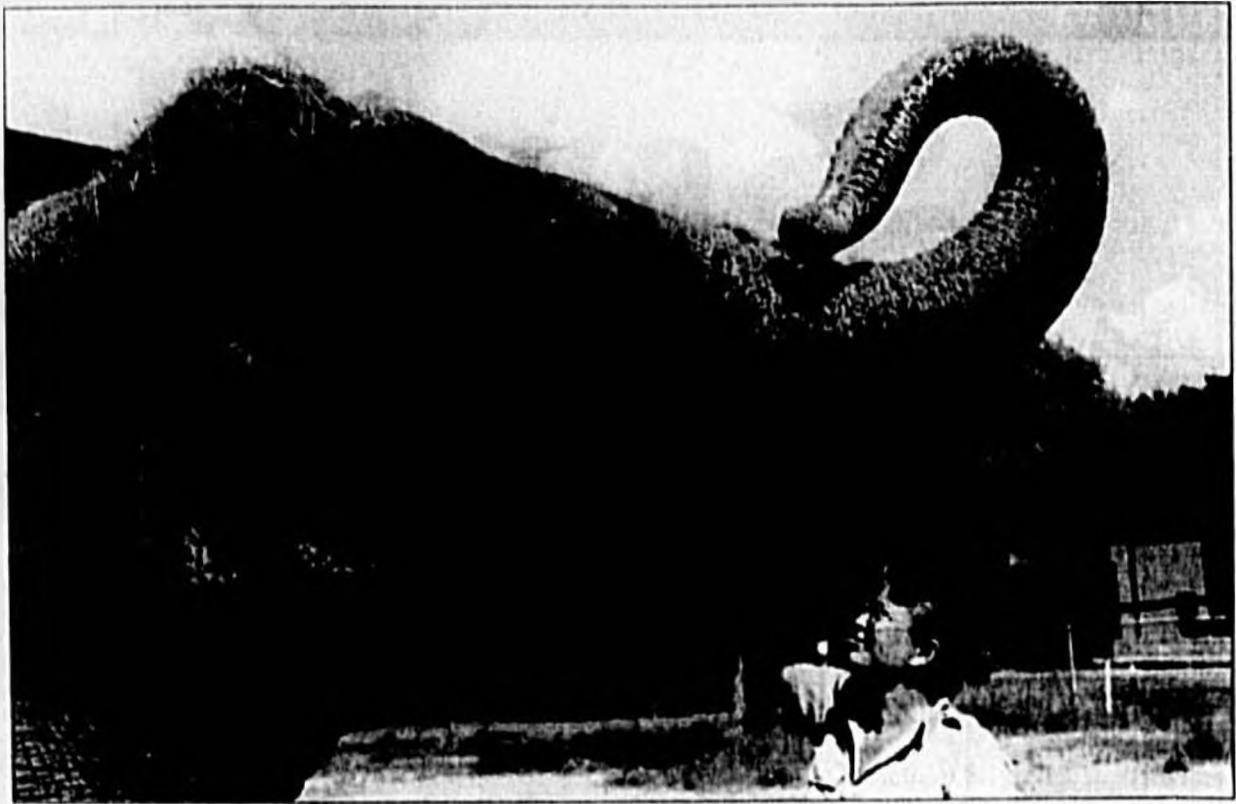
Both have good memories. Both are gray. Both enjoy fruits and vegetables.

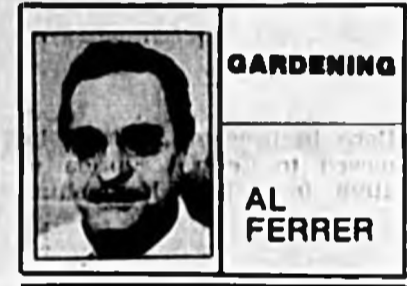

## Chinch bug is the foe of St. Augustine lawn

Southern chinch bug is one of the most important insect problems in St. Augustine grass in Florida. Other lawn grasses are not seriously affected by this insect. The bugs suck the plant juices from grass resulting in yellowing and death of the plants in the affected area. The injured areas can be seen as brownish patches in the lawn. The problem can be more serious during dry weather periods, or specific water stressed areas in your garden.

**The insect:** Chinch bugs belong to the group of insects which include the stink bugs, lace bugs, and leaf bugs. In summer, eggs hatch in 10 days and the young develop to adults in three weeks. When the nymphs are borne, they are about the size of a pinhead, red in color with a white band across the back, becoming darker as they mature. Adults are about 1/5-inch in length, black, and have white wings. Three to four generations per year occur in central Florida.

**Detection:** The chinch bugs can be detected by using a soap solution. Mix one fluid ounce of dishwashing liquid in two gallons of water and drench four square feet of this solution at the edges of the

affected area. If the chinch bugs are present, they will emerge to the grass surface in about two minutes. The same procedure can be used to detect lawn caterpillars and mole crickets. In heavy infestations, they can be seen crawling over the grass blades or the soil surface.

**Cultural practices:** Turf management practices can influence the resistance or susceptibility of St. Augustine grass to chinch bugs. Succulent growth resulting from frequent applications of water soluble inorganic nitrogen fertilizers increase the susceptibility to chinch bug damage. Slow release nitrogen fertilizers decrease the chinch bug damage. Proper irrigation is also very important to control this insect problem. Large populations of insects tend to develop during dry periods, increasing the damage. Proper mowing practices can make the grass more tolerant to chinch bugs. The grass should be mowed often enough so that no more than one third of the leaf blade is removed at each mowing. St. Augustine grass should be mowed to a height of 3-4 inches.

**Resistant varieties:** The cultivars Floratam and Floratam have good tolerance to chinch bug feeding. Most chinch bugs cannot complete their development when feeding on these varieties. The cultivar Floratam is only tolerant to low populations of the insect.

**Biological control:** The most important predator of chinch bugs is the black big-eyed bug. Another predator, an earwig, is also found frequently associated with chinch bug control. Many times these predators are not recognized and pesticides are usually applied when it is not needed.

**Chemical control:** Chinch bug populations of more than 20 insects per square foot, should be treated with an insecticide to reduce the populations to non-damaging levels. Diazinon, Dursban or Orthene are suggested for their control. When a spray is used, it is important to apply the insecticide in a large amount of water. The jar attachment to a garden hose is the suggested application device for homeowners. The recommended

equipment should use 15 to 20 gallons of water passing through the hose to empty the quart-sized jar. The procedure is as follows: Put the amount of insecticide in the jar as directed on the label for 1,000 square feet, and fill the rest of the way with water. Spray the contents over 1,000 square feet of lawn. Spray evenly with a back and forth motion until the treated area is completely covered. The treated grass should be irrigated lightly to flush the insecticide into the thatch layer where the chinch bugs are feeding. Chinch bugs develop resistance to insecticides if only one type of product is used continuously. If the recommended insecticides do not control the problem, use a synthetic pyrethrin such as Tempo. Granular formulations of the recommended insecticides can also be used. Granules should be applied with a drop-type spreader rather than the cyclone type for a better distribution of the granules.

that are threatening to fall in residential and public areas. His comments were greeted with grumbles and rolling eyes as several people got up to leave the chamber.

"I didn't come here to be insulted," said one woman. "Just wait until election day," said another.

Chairman Dallart passed the gavel to Vice Chairman Tom Hagoood and joined Ariale in an unfriendly motion to add the firefighters to the budget and remove the arborist.

"I don't believe it's in the city's best interest to approve this budget without approving

the additional three firefighters," he said. "I really think we need to re-evaluate this. By waiting another year (to hire an arborist) we are not putting the city at danger."

When the final vote was taken, Ariale and Dallart stood alone. The budget, without amendments, was approved 3-2. The city will hire a landscaping crew. No new firefighters will be added to staff this year.

Under the approved millage rate, the owner of a \$100,000 home with \$25,000 homestead exemption, will pay \$374.25 in taxes for city services this coming year.

Marie Sullivan, another resident, said she was grateful for the flyer because it let her know what was happening in the city.

Lee Kellerman told commissioners they were giving Smith mixed messages and should let him manage.

"Don't make this hysterical Longwood, please," Kellerman said. "We need stability to carry on programs."

Butch Bundy, a resident who is also considering running for city commission next year, said he will proceed with his plans to petition for a recall vote on Miles, Vacca and Sergeant. At least 10 percent of the city's registered voters is required for the petition. There are about 7,083 voters in Longwood.

"I am determined to do this," said Bundy, who has previously voiced his support of Smith.

After a motion to make Smith interim city administrator

failed, Vacca proposed offering the job to Manning, who served as police chief for the city for more than 20 years before he retired in 1997. Miles said he was told last Friday that Manning may be interested in serving the city again.

Lovestrand said he was seriously opposed to the proposal for both personal and professional reasons.

"Manning is very controversial," Lovestrand said. "He was acting city administrator before and the charter was violated. There were many mistakes made... I cannot think of a worse candidate."

In addition, Lovestrand said, Manning did not have the qualifications for the job because he did not have a college degree.

Miles said that requirement could be waived in lieu of related experience, which Manning had.

Miller said, though Manning is a good man and his friend,

he does not fit the qualifications for city administrator.

"I thought he was an excellent department head when he was here, but it is our duty to appoint a qualified city administrator," Miller said.

Miles said that should Manning accept the offer, the arrangement would be tempo-

rary, no more than 120 days, based on the city charter. The city will hire an independent company to search for a new administrator, he said.

Lovestrand, however, expressed reservations.

"Deals have been made," he said. "This will turn into a permanent arrangement."

board must consider appeals made by Bob's Video and Excitement Video both on U.S. Highway 17-92.

Each business was given time to comply to county requirements but failed to do so according to county officials. If compliance was attained, the two businesses would be grandfathered status, and the businesses would not be required to relocate to property assigned the M-2 zoning classification.

Among the complaints by the county is that parking lot areas were not sufficiently lighted, an adult entertainment business sign was not posted, there were neon signs in the windows, a rear lot was messy and that the site exceeded allowable signage.

The business owners argue that the design standards

mandated by the county are vague and contrary to the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution.

The Board also had a work session to review staff recommendations concerning the methods for dealing with non-conforming billboards. The companies that post billboards will have the choice of bringing their boards into compliance or to enter an agreement with the county to comply within three years.

The Holiday Avenue dilemma has been a major headache for staff and the board. It began with the great speed hump issue that has split those who live on the avenue. Most want the speed humps to stay. The sidewalk will keep the children off the street and out of harm's way. How many neighbors will help pay for the sidewalk is today's topic.

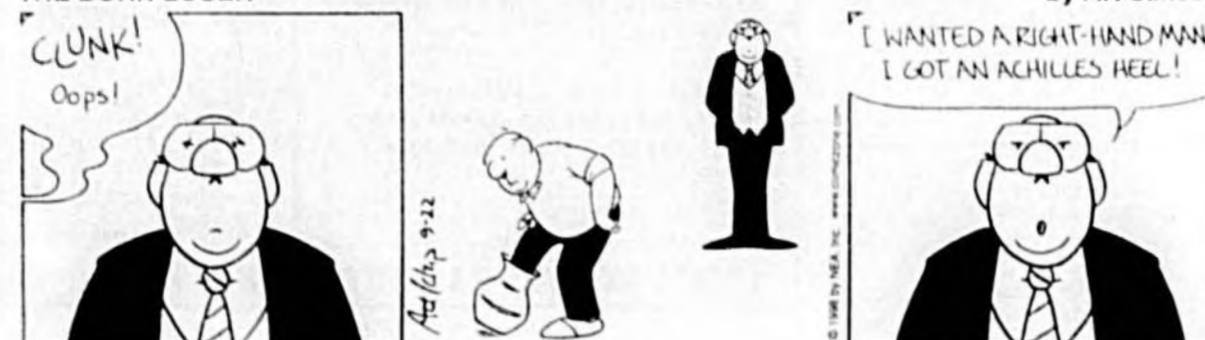

**Asthma root of persistent cough**

DEAR DR. GOTT: I've had a cough for 16 years. I don't smoke and have received both allergy shots and the reassurance that I have mild chronic bronchitis. I am presently on an asthma inhaler and allergy pills. Is there any new remedy for chronic bronchitis?

DEAR READER: Chronic bronchitis simply means that there is a long-standing infection in your bronchial tubes, the structures that supply air to your lungs. The treatment for this condition is twofold: avoidance of air pollution and antibiotic therapy.

I don't believe that chronic bronchitis is your primary problem, and neither does your doctor, who is treating you for asthma.

Bronchial asthma, sometimes known as hyperactive airway disease, is a common condition, caused by spasm of the muscles that line the bronchial passages. It is a frequent cause of chronic cough, wheezing and shortness of breath. The incidence of asthma is increasing, especially among inner-city children.

Fortunately, treatment (with various inhaled medications and prescription pills) is usually successful. If your family doctor has been unable to get your cough under control, you would be helped by seeing a pulmonary specialist, who can test you further (with lung function studies) and modify your medication. Sixteen years is too long an interval to put up with a cough that could be eliminated.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am a 64-year-old man with a problem with nighttime urination. I often have to relieve myself six or eight times a night. I have no other problems related to my urinary system and my doctor has pronounced me fit. Would I be helped by taking saw palmetto?

DEAR READER: Possibly. If your doctor agrees, I would encourage you to try this herbal remedy, which is available without a prescription. Several medical studies have shown that saw palmetto may relieve the symptoms of prostatic enlargement. Such symptoms include frequency, urgency and nighttime urination.

If the herb is ineffective, you should see a urologist for further testing and, perhaps, a prescription for medicine that is ordinarily more effective than saw palmetto. But, for now, see if the palmetto might solve your problem.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Because of severe arthritis, I was prescribed ibuprofen, which helped. However, it caused increased abdominal discomfort because of my reflux. Therefore, my doctor prescribed Cytotec. This

appears to be effective. Any problems?

DEAR READER: Not to my knowledge. Cytotec is a prescription medicine that contains a component to lessen stomach irritation. It seems to be an ideal solution for patients who require pain relief but cannot tolerate plain ibuprofen or other similar drugs.

**Keeping you in the dark**

If you must take an examination, practice on as many earlier tests as possible. You will become accustomed to the types of questions asked, which will make it easier to score well. Similarly, in a bridge column, if at the start the author gives you a big hint as to the right approach, it will be simpler to find the key play.

So, today, no hint (unless you read yesterday's column). How would you have bid the North-South hands? How would you play in five diamonds after West has led the heart king? The best contract is three no trump by South, which has 10 top tricks. Yet it is very difficult to reach that contract. Here, North's three-diamond re-

sponse is a limit raise showing some 10-12 points with at least four diamonds.

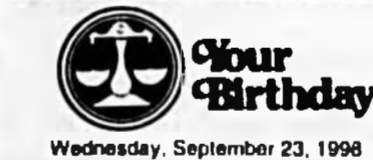
If East has the spade ace, there are no problems — you will lose one trick in each black suit. But if West has the spade ace, you will have to hope the clubs are splitting 3-3. Also, you must establish the 13th club without letting East win a trick, or else he will poke a spade through your king.

How can you establish the 13th club while guaranteeing that East never gets the lead? The secret is to duck the opening lead.

Win the second heart, discarding a club, draw trumps, cash the club ace, play a club to dummy's king, and ruff a club in hand. When they split 3-3, return to dummy with a trump and discard a spade on the last club. But if the clubs don't break, cross to dummy with a trump and lead a spade, hoping East has the ace.

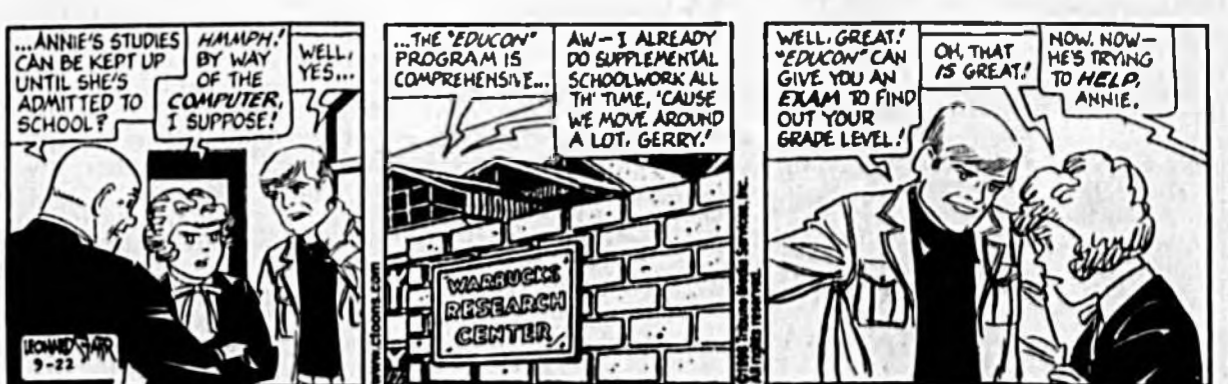

## UF's National Championship hopes are not dead just yet Gator faithful

Elisabeth Zacharias then singled to load the bases and Ruff closed out the game with a bases-clearing single.

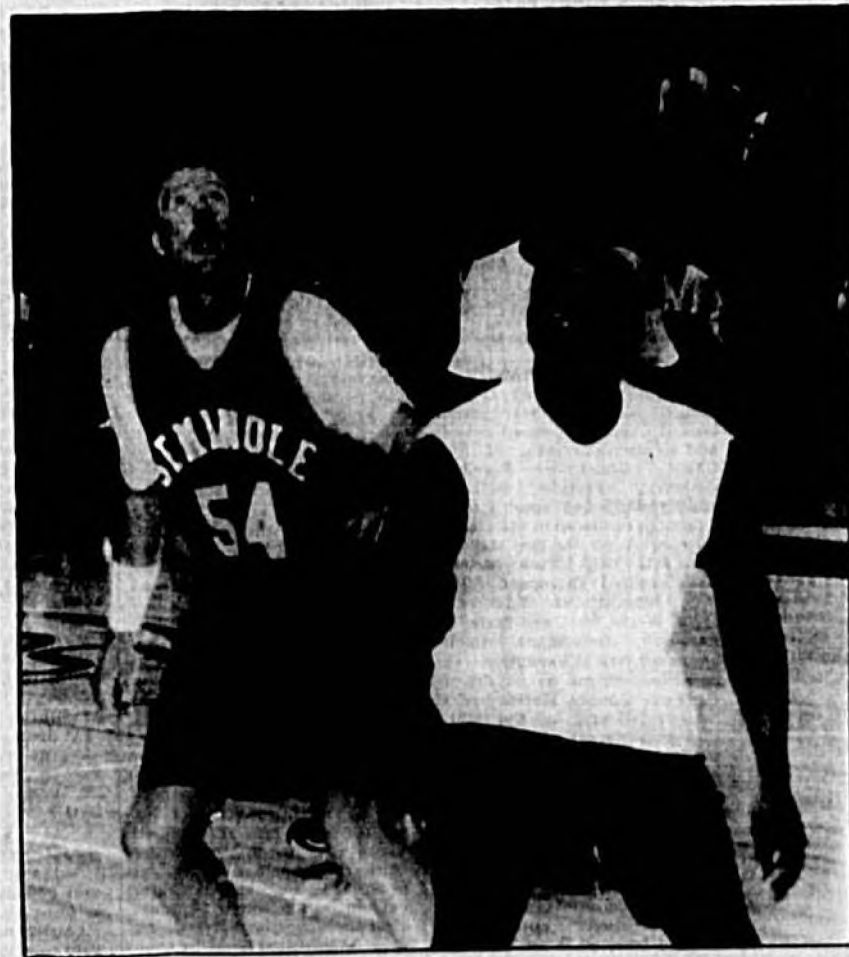
