Judge to be publicly reprimanded

SEMINOLE COUNTY - The Florida Judicial Qualifications Commission has recommended the State Supreme Court administer a public reprimand against 18th Judicial Circuit Court Judge Leonard V. Wood. Wood accepted sole responsibility in connection with charges against him and for unfortunate occurrences which transpired in the courtroom which led to the commission's decision.

In early June, the judge was informed that an inquiry had been conducted by an investigative panel and that at least five members, meeting in Or-



lando on March 27, had determined probable cause existed for formal proceedings to be conducted against him.

A total of five separate cases before the judge, dating as far back as June, 1994, were cited

as the basis for complaints. Most were connected to what the committee indicated were comments made by Wood during a trial, several of which were divorce proceedings. In one divorce case, he re-

portedly asked the husband, "Are you still a podiatrist? And, you can't afford an attorney? Hog wash!" He also is said to have remarked to the man, "You should put your wife on a pedestal for putting up with you."

In another divorce case, the committee's written opinion stated he had advised the parties "...that they should have a baby and remain married; and commented that (the wife) was a very attractive woman and volunteered that you would be glad to assist her in having a child were you not recently married. You made additional comments to the effect that women really don't know what they want."

The document submitted to the judge states, "You have fallen into a pattern or practice of making rude, intemperate, and inappropriate comments in open court relating to certain witnesses, counsel and types of litigants, and this conduct evidences an absence of judicial temperament and inappropriate bias or prejudice in matters pending before you."

In conclusion, the notice indicated the acts, if they occurred as alleged, "impair the confidence of the citizens of this state and the integrity of the judicial system, and in you as a judge, and constitute conduct unbecoming a member of the judiciary in violation of the

\$20 million lawsuit

Rabun says he was told to let Suber be; Van Der Weide has different view

SEMINOLE COUNTY - Ron Rabun, the former Seminole County manager, says in a recent deposition that he was pressured by Commissioner Dick Van Der Weide "not to take action" against Joyce Suber, the land acquisition coordinator who was fired for dishonesty, insubordination, misuse of county time and for accepting gifts and gratuities.

Rabun also said that Van Der Weide on two occasions had asked him why he had to "do anything at all," regarding Suber who is suing the county for sexual harassment and age discrimination.

Rabun's transcripts were the latest released in a messy suit that figures to get even messier before it reaches a courtroom in early 1999. As it builds, so does a federal investigation into the county's Public Works Division during the time Rabun was county manager. Both he and Suber were fired in late 1998.

In his deposition, Rabun said that Van Der Weide hounded him to let Suber be. "He asked why I was doing what I was and I told him it

Fraud alert

TALAHASSEE - Florida Agriculture and Consumer Services Commissioner Bob Crawford is warning consumers to beware of fraudulent charities as the state undergoes recovery from the wildfire disaster.

The Consumer Services division said it has received reports of people going door-to-door asking for contributions for equipment for firefighters and others requesting donations for fire victims via e-mail and the Internet. Crawford is concerned that fraudulent charities may emerge as the recovery continues.

Consumers are being asked to phone the department's hotline at 1-800-HELP-FIA to find out if a charity is registered, or to order a free copy of a "Gift Giver's Guide" which provides a breakdown of officially registered charities.

Don't be scammed into paying for job

You don't have to pay for information about job vacancies with the U.S. Government or U.S. Postal Service.

Scam artists are victimizing many Americans by selling information about federal job opportunities. These scam artists advertise in the classified sections of newspapers and offer-for a fee-to help job seekers find and apply for federal jobs. Some fraudulent companies even try to confuse consumers by using names like the "U.S. Agency for Career Advancement," or the "Postal Employment Service," which sound like federal agencies.

Scam artists may lie about the availability of federal job openings in your area. For example, the Postal Service has few vacancies for career positions. For many of the entry jobs you must take a written examination first, Test 470. Postal Service hiring takes place through 85 district offices at the local level. If a private party tells you that postal jobs are available, check with the Postal Service to determine if hiring is taking place and if the exam is required for eligibility. Because of the high volume of applicants taking the test, it is only offered every few years in any given district.

Information about U.S. government jobs is available free. Federal agencies and the U.S. Postal Service never charge application fees, or guarantee that an applicant will be hired. If positions require a competitive examination--and many do not--hiring agencies typically offer free sample questions to consumers who sign up for the exam.

It is deceptive for anyone to guarantee you a high score on Tests 460 and 470, the postal entrance exams for rural carrier associate, clerk, city carrier, mail handler, flat sorter machine operator, mail processor and markup clerk. These exams test your general aptitude, not your knowledge of facts. Attending workshops, studying exam techniques, and taking practice questions will not assure you of a top score

on any postal exam. Indeed, a top score does not guarantee that you will be hired. You must meet other requirements, including passing a background check and a drug test. Veterans receive hiring preferences.

Oviedo woman charged with attempted murder

OVIEDO — Oviedo police arrested a white female this past weekend, and charged her with the attempted murder of her live-in boyfriend. Cynthia Klauk, 42, of 941 Vicki Court in Oviedo, allegedly struck Thomas Small, 54, with the front of her black Mercury. Klauk was charged with attempted murder, aggravated battery, felony fleeing and eluding, aggravated assault on a law enforcement officer and resisting with violence. She was also served with several citations including wanton reckless driving, running stop signs, traffic lights, and leaving the scene of an accident with injuries. It is unclear what the motiva-

tion was behind Klauk's attack on Small. Report indicates that an officer was called to respond to a traffic accident. The officer found Small lying on the ground between two apartments. Three officers located Klauk's vehicle and gave pursuit. She appeared to be stopping, and when one officer exited his patrol vehicle, she accelerated in an attempt to strike the officer and hit his driver's side. The police finally cornered Klauk in a cul-de-sac where they arrested her. Small was taken to Orlando Regional Medical Center for possible back and leg injuries. Klauk was taken to Columbia Hospital for treatment of high blood pressure and other ailments.

Greene to present Lake Mary names for airport board

LAKE MARY — With many of the large aircraft flights presently required to approach the Orlando Sanford Airport over Lake Mary residential areas, the city is pressing to insure that it has the capability of putting its two cents in during meetings of the Sanford Airport Authority.

At tonight's city commission meeting, Commissioner Thom Greene has announced he plans to submit the names of three individuals who he believes are qualified to be considered by Sanford for board membership. The board presently has no representation from the Lake Mary/Heathrow communities.

Greene had previously convinced the city to pass a resolution regarding to request Sanford to consider including a Lake Mary resident on the board. It was approved during an April 2 meeting. Sanford's commission appoints members to the board which governs the operation of the airport with the exception of the Federal Aviation Administration which has authority over flight operations.

The three persons to be suggested by Greene include Richard Weir, Cecil Thompson and Brenda Williams. Weir is vice chairman of the noise abatement committee. Thompson is president of the Hills of Lake Mary Homeowners Association and Williams serves on the homeowners' committee in Carrington Park, Heathrow. She reportedly has

been asked by the Heathrow governing homeowners' association to represent them on airport issues.

There is to be a vacancy on the Airport Authority coming up on Sept. 30 of this year.

Greene said he intends to present the three names for consideration during tonight's city commission meeting, under the Reports from Commissioners' portion of the regular meeting agenda.

The City Commission meeting will begin at 7 p.m., at the Lake Mary City Hall, 100 N. Country Club Road.

Red Cross assesses wild fire damage

With the increasing rainfall in Central Florida, the wild fires which have plagued Volusia, Seminole and surrounding counties are considered gone. Federal and state officials are still investigating the amount of damage, crop and woodland losses, as well as determining residential and commercial destruction in physical numbers as well as the financial impact the fires have had.

According to the American Red Cross, 65 counties have been affected, 40 of which are set to receive federal assistance. The organization's Damage Assessment workers have studied all of these counties to determine future operations in similar situations.

The purpose of Red Cross assessment separate from other organizations is to determine the scope of Red Cross response. How much damage noted determines what kind of material assistance and how much human resource assistance is needed.

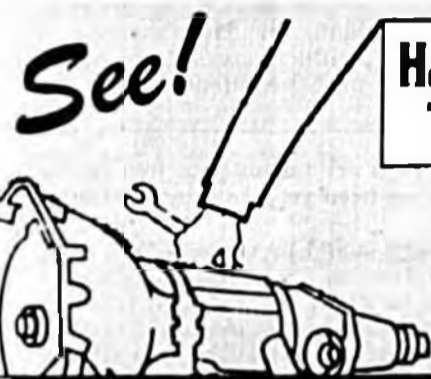
Stan Stamborath, Damage Assessment Officer said, "The potential for damage assessment crews to be trapped behind the advancing fire lines was a huge

concern. As the first were put out, damage assessment crews would move in. For those who think the fire is over, on July 8, lightning struck again igniting over 60 new fires."

Damage Assessment Coordinator Leo Batzer said, "We used street sheets which showed the addresses and locations of homes on each street. Street sheets are especially critical in incidents where homes are totally destroyed."

This damage assessment was said to be different than he had seen in the past. "It was quite eerie," he said. "Because of the mandatory evacuation and the fact that the roads were blocked, no one was there. No people... no children... no pets... just the smell of smoke. On any given street, we would see a home standing completely intact while the homes to either side of it were entirely destroyed. In many instances after a disaster, we see people cleaning up their yards, beginning the process of putting their lives back together. The fact that no one was there allowed us to be able to conduct the assessment fairly quickly."

was simple. That to me it was a no brainer, as it were. It was something that was - should not have been difficult to understand why matters like this had to be dealt with, and I really couldn't understand the- why he would take that position."

Rabun testified that it was Van Der Weide who eventually had him fired as county manager. "He said that in his opinion the Public Works issue had gotten so messy that somebody had to, basically, take the fall," Rabun said.

Van Der Weide said this week that Rabun's memory may have failed him in some of the testimony, especially the reasons why he had called for Rabun to resign or be fired by the commission. "I instructed Rabun to have a thorough independent audit of the entire Public Works department and he wouldn't do it," Van Der Weide said. "There were a number of reasons for his removal."

Suber made serious mistakes that led to her dismissal Van Der Weide said Tuesday. But there was more to what was going on than

what Suber may have done. "Why do you think the FBI is still investigating the thing?" Van Der Weide said.

Rabun said that he informed all the commissioners that he was having the matter investigated "so that we could get to the bottom of it one way or another. I said it was my duty and responsibility to try to find out and that I hoped that the allegations were not true. That we could get it behind us and everybody would - that nobody would be guilty of anything."

Asked how Van Der Weide responded, Rabun said that "he did not react with anger, and did not direct me not to do the investigation. He just continued in a quiet but clear way, to question why it was I was doing this and why I had to do this."

Rabun said that Van Der Weide told him if there was anything wrong from a legal standpoint, that law enforcement ought to deal with it. "We ought not do anything with it," he told me. "If there was something there, let law enforcement deal with it."

Rabun said that he told Van Der Weide there could be

law enforcement issues down the road. "I don't know, but we're first required, from an administrative standpoint, to exhaust those kinds of remedies, too, and to do our diligence there."

Two and a half weeks later (Oct. 22), Rabun had been fired. "I found myself forced out and terminated from employment," he said.

"And do you believe that this had some relation to your conversations with then Chairman Van Der Weide?" attorney Jeff Mandel asked at the deposition.

"I believe it did," Rabun said.

Rabun said in his deposition that he had not seen any of the county commissioners or employees sexually harassing Joyce Suber. "I never saw anyone hugging or kissing her. He said he also told her that when her job was on the line, he personally hoped all the (allegations) were wrong."

The county maintains they weren't, and Rabun so testified that there had been "gross abuse of (her) position."

Beloved artist, teacher dies at 78

Well-known local artist Joseph Mathieux died Tuesday leaving many grieving family and friends in the Geneva and Sanford areas. He was 78.

Mathieux and his wife, Elizabeth, were prominent supporters of the arts in Seminole County. "He was an excellent artist," recalls Ashby Jones, member of the administrative council of the Seminole Art Association. "We all looked up to him because of his knowledge."

According to Jones, Mathieux was the only remaining original member of the Sanford/Seminole Art Association. Mathieux helped to form the association in 1959 and had served for two terms as president. He was very active as an art competition judge, teacher and artist. Mathieux, with his distinctive bearded appearance, even sat as a model for watercolor classes.

Members of the association valued him for his constructive critiques of their work. Two years ago the association dedi-

cated their yearbook to Mathieux and Elizabeth in honor of their outstanding contributions. "Joe was highly regarded by the whole association," said Jones. "It is terrible to lose him."

Fellow artists described Mathieux as a soft spoken, gentle man who liked to work with youth. Mathieux taught art, history and arithmetic in Seminole County schools for 39 years. He continued to teach art to students, young and old.

Many of Mathieux's works of art had religious themes. Jones was particularly impressed with Mathieux's fine renditions of Christ in various walks of life. Mathieux's art work could often be seen on display locally. His work was most recently exhibited at the Bettye Smith Cultural Arts Center in Sanford in a show sponsored by the art association.

Born in Geneva, Mathieux lived there most of his life. His family was among the first settlers in the Geneva area. Mathieux was a member and past president of the Geneva

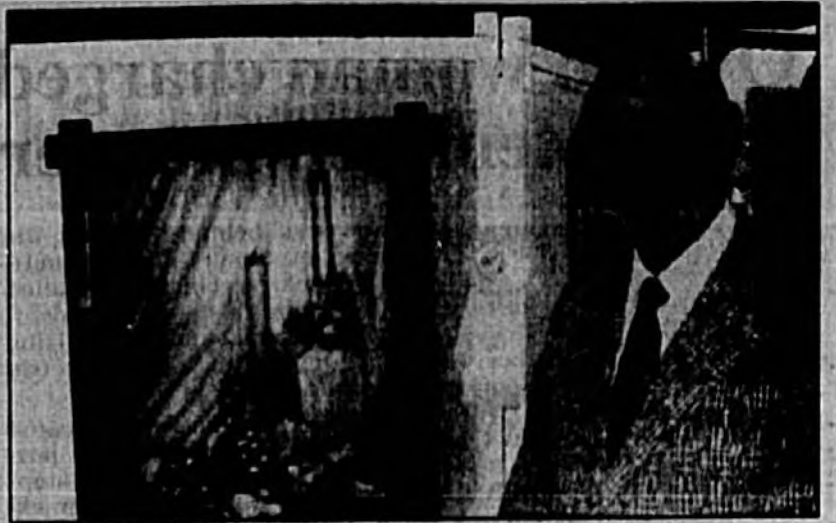
Historical Society, and along with other society members helped to set up the two-room Geneva Museum. Several pieces of Mathieux family memorabilia are on display at the museum including a chair fashioned from grape vines by Mathieux's grandfather.

"Joe was very interested in maintaining and preserving the history of Geneva," said Lorraine Whiting, member of the historical society. Whiting, whose grandfather along with Mathieux's had helped to settle Geneva, had known Mathieux all of his life and recalls that Mathieux worked diligently and helped in any way he could, with the local cemetery and

with the historical society. Mathieux was also a charter member of the Historical and Genealogical Society.

Mathieux was also very active in his church, First Baptist Church of Geneva where he served as a deacon, Sunday school teacher and lay pastor.

Mathieux and his wife had been married for 56 years. In addition to his wife, he is survived by their daughter Jeannene Jones of Altamonte Springs and their son, Lennard, a Chief Engineer for Mobile Oil Company and currently living in Thailand, his sister, Eva Markowicz of Geneva, four grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

cited canons of the Code of Judicial Conduct."

Judge Wood responded through his attorney within the required 30 day time period, admitting to all five charges which were placed against him.

He added that he "accepts sole responsibility for the unfortunate occurrences which transpired in the courtroom."

"Long-standing health problems and necessary use of prescribed medication have contributed to this problem," he said. "Because of my circumstances, I have voluntarily initiated and am presently participating in an extensive therapeutic program with Dr. Deborah Day, designed to assist me in anger management and coping with my stress. Likewise, I am now being much more conscious of my underlying health needs and being more responsive to physician guidance and advice."

Judge Wood said he will remain under Dr. Day's care and treatment until she has determined, in her professional judgment, that such care and treatment are no longer necessary.

The Judicial Qualifications Commission accepted Judge Wood's response, and informed him this Wednesday that a formal hearing before the commission would not be required and it will recommend to the Supreme Court of Florida, "that it administer a public reprimand."

"This behavior constitutes conduct unbecoming a member of the judiciary," Committee Chairman, Judge Gilbert Goshorn responded. He also pointed out that more severe

discipline is not warranted in view of Wood's response and acknowledgment of the impropriety, as well as a course of medical treatment and anger management control being undertaken.

"The investigative panel accordingly concludes that the interest of justice and the public welfare are adequately served by the administration of a public reprimand as recommended," Goshorn concluded.

- Ads that refer to toll-free phone number. Often, in these cases, an operator encourages you to buy a "valuable" booklet containing job listings, practice test questions, and tips for entrance exams.
- Toll-free numbers that direct you to other pay-per-call numbers for more information. Under federal law, any solicitations for pay-per-call numbers must contain full disclosures about cost. Also, the solicitation must make clear if there is an affiliation with the federal government. You must have a chance to hang up before you incur any charges.

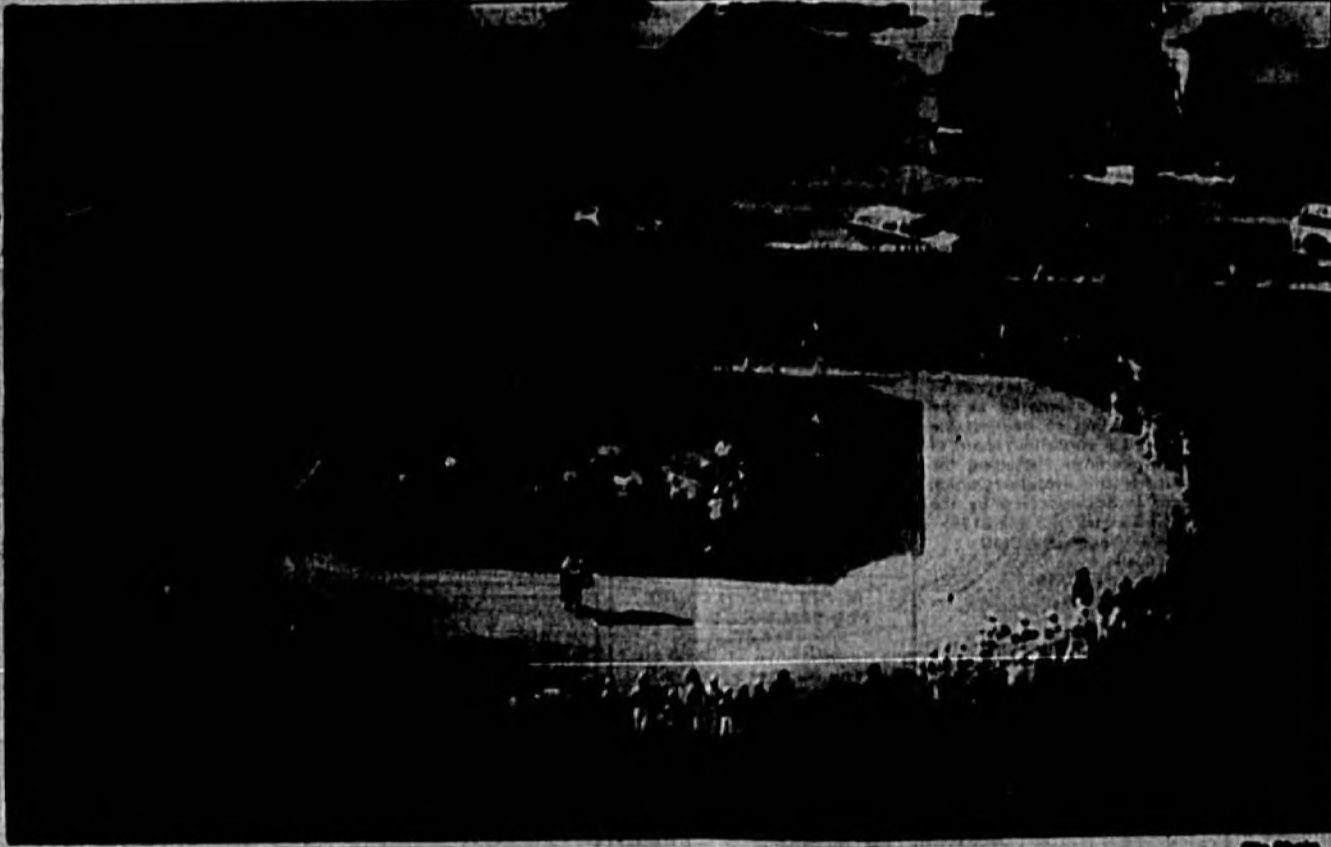
