# NRA RULINGS TAKENFROM SMALL TOWNS

First Major ChangeIn Program Is Made; Details Of Retail Code Are Released

WASHINGTON, Oct. 24.-(A.P.) -Uncer the pressure of adverse farm sentiment, NRA yesterday pulled out of the country's villages and small towns, and announced a protective chain of local trifrom hiking prices too high.

This first major change in the industrial recovery program, was taken under an executive order by President Robsevelt, forecast by a single sentence in his Sunday night address to the nation.

An exception under the order was that chain stores, wherever located, will remain under code regulation. Also small factories, those daing interstate cusiness and these employing more than five people attil have NRA watching over them even in the otherwise exempt towns of 2500 or less.

The order's lasuance coincided with promulgation of the retail trade code which emerged with a Loh Fails To Secure price control provision stripped of the 10 percent markup fought by farmer and consumer representa-tives alike, but so phrase las to give the merchant substantially the same protection against destructive price cutting by compe-






